RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

- Basic Agreement F44621-68-A-0057, dated October 24, 1967, between the Department of the Air Force and The University of Texas at Austin, supersedes and replaces without retroactive effect the current Air Force Agreement F44621-67-A-0057.
- 2. Modification No. AFOSR 67-1234A to Grant AF-AFOSR-1234-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides an additional \$38,227 to the grant funds and extends the period of the grant through November 30, 1968. The research entitled "Vibration Characteristics of Cylindrical Shell Structures with Cyclic Stiffening," continues under the direction of Dr. Ronald O. Stearman, Associate Professor of Aerospace Engineering.
- 3. Modification No. P003 to Contract F33657-67-C-0370, by which the Department of the Air Force, Hq. ASD(ASWKS), Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, revises the Security Requirements Check List. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 4. Modification No. 9, Supplemental Agreement to Contract No. DA 18064-AMC-118(A), by which the Department of the Army, Fort Detrick, Frederick, Maryland, establishes a final fixed overhead rate of 40.5% of salary and wages for the period September 1, 1964, through October 31, 1965. The study of the requirements for the production of interferons from a genetic point of view was conducted under the direction of Dr. Royce Z. Lockart, Jr., Associate Professor of Microbiology.
- 5. The theoretical studies of the meteorological sensors, and analysis and interpretation of rocket data was conducted in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of K. H. Jehn, Associate Professor of Meteorology.

Modification No. 6 to Contract DA 28-043 AMC-00316(E), by which the Department of the Army, Army Electronics Command, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, corrects an inconsistency in the numbering sequence. Modification No. 4, dated October 31, 1966, is redesignated Modification No. 5. The investigation and application of solion transducers was conducted in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 7. Amendment No. 6, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA 29-040-AMC-1010(E), by which the Department of the Army, Purchasing and Contracting Directorate, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, establishes a fixed overhead rate of 17.0% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1964. through August 31, 1965, and a provisional overhead rate of 17.0% subsequent to September 1, 1965. The investigation of the sources of errors in an experimental model of an interferometer was conducted in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 3. Modification No. 3, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA-29-040-AMC-1259(E), by which the Department of the Army, Purchasing and Contracting Division, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, establishes a fixed overhead rate of 40.5% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1964, through August 31, 1965, and a provisional overhead rate of 40.5% of salaries and wages for the period beginning September 1, 1965. The optical jamming system study was conducted in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. H. LaGrone, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 9. Modification No. A003, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA 29-040-AMC-1802(E), by which the Department of the Army, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, establishes a provisional overhead rate of 40.5% of salaries and wages for the period commencing September 1, 1965, and continuing until final overhead rates are negotiated. The research on stratospheric and mesospheric analysis continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of K. H. Jehn, Associate Professor of Meteorology.
- 10. Modification No. 5, to Contract DA-44-177-AMC-200(T), by which the Department of the Army, Headquarters, U.S. Army Aviation Materiel Laboratories, Fort Eustis, Virginia, establishes a final overhead rate of 40.5% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1964, through August 31, 1965. The research on the analysis, design and fabrication, and testing of a modern airfoil section utilizing jet edges of the airfoil was directed by Dr. S. W. Yuan, Professor of Aerospace Engineering.
- 11. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA-49-092-ARO-87, by which the Department of the Army, Office of the Chief of Research and Development, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract through December 31, 1967. The research continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. H. LaGrone, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 12. Amendment No. AA to Contract N00014-67-A-0126-0004, by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D.C., reduces the estimated cost of the project by \$10,000 to a new total of \$10,000. The "Study of Subsurface Resistivity Determination of the Texas Gulf Coastal Region by Magnetotellurics," continues under the direction of Dr. Harold W. Smith, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 13. Contract N00024-68-C-1082, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$75,000 for support of research on sonar systems. The contract is effective for the period November 13, 1967, through February 28, 1969, and the research will be conducted in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 14. Contract N00025-67-C-0026, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval...... Facilities Engineering Command, Washington, D. C., provides the sum of \$10,000 for support of research entitled "Research on the AMMI Pontoon." The contract is effective for the period May 4, 1967, through November 3, 1967, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. A. A. Toprac, Professor of Civil Engineering.

- 15. Modification No. 8, Supplemental Agreement to Contract Nonr-3579(00), by which the Department of the Navy, Office of Naval Research, Washington, D. C., revises the cost principles article of the contract. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 16. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract NOw 65-0256-d, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Air Systems Command, Washington, D. C. revises the "Allowable Cost and Payment" clause, the "Negotiated Overhead Rates" clause, the "Termination for the Convenience of the Government" clause of the contract and provides for the new overhead rate of 17% for the period 1 September 1964 through 31 August 1965. The research was conducted in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 17. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N123-(62738)55231A(X), by which the Department of the Navy, Navy Purchasing Office, Los Angeles, California, adds \$50,000 to the contract, increasing the total estimated cost to \$405,536.00, and extends the period of the contract through April 30, 1968. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory, under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 18. Modification No. 27, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N60921-7002, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, establishes final overhead rates for the period September 1, 1964, through August 31, 1965. The research was conducted in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 19. Modification No. 13, to Contract N60921-7233, by which the Department of the Navy, U.S. Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, increases and funds Task II by an additional \$180,000. The estimated cost of Task III has been reduced by \$10,000; however, an additional funding of \$15,000 has been provided. This action increases the estimated cost and funding of the contract to a new total of \$1,245,900. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 20. Change "D" to Contract NBy-53143, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Washington, D. C., amends the scope of the work of the contract, adds the sum of \$12,000 to the contract funds, and extends the period of the contract through June 30, 1968. The investigation of welded tubular connections continues under the direction of Dr. A. A. Toprac, Professor of Civil Engineering.
- 21. Modification No. 12, to Contract NObsr-93126, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$25,000.00 to the contract funds, increasing the funding under the contract to \$683,000. The variable depth sonar systems studies continue in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 22. Modification No. 3, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-3326, by which the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee extends the period of the contract through January 31, 1969. The study of initiation of bubbles in supersaturated solutions by ionizing radiation continues under the direction of Dr. David M. Himmelblau, Professor of Chemical Engineering.
- 23. Modification No. 3, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-3458, by which the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge Operations, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, adds the sum of \$66,631.00 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through September 30, 1968. The research entitled "Anomalous Diffusion and Thermalization of Turbulent Plasmas," continues in the Center for Plasma Physics and Thermonuclear Research, under the direction of Dr. William E. Drummond, Professor of Physics.

- 24. Revision No. 1 to Grant No. OEG-0-8-000001-0195, by which the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, changes the period of the Grant to September 15, 1967, through May 31, 1969. The research on "Simulated Classroom Situations: The Development and Evaluation of Role Playing in the Education of Prospective Secondary School Science Teachers," continues under the direction of Dr. Addison Lee, Professor of Science Education and Biology.
- 25. Grant No. AI-07184-03, by which the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, provides the sum of \$26,201 for support of research entitled. Immunochemical Properties of a New Serum Factor. The grant is effective for the period January 1, 1968 through December 31, 1968, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. William J. Mandy, Assistant Professor of Microbiology.
- 26. Grant GM 09654-07, by which the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, provides \$26,385 for support of research entitled, "Studies on Histone Metabolism." The grant is effective for the period October 1, 1967, through September 30, 1970. The \$26,385 now appropriated is for the period October 1, 1967 through September 30, 1968. The research will be performed under the direction of Dr. David P. Bloch, Professor of Botony.
- 27. Grant GM-12279-04, by which the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, provides the sum of \$23,869 for support of research entitled, Microbial D(-) &-Hydroxybutyric Dehydrogenase. The grant is effective for the period September 1, 1967, through August 31, 1968, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. Peter Jurtshuk, Jr., Assistant Professor of Microbiology.
- 28. Contract PH-43-68-97, by which the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, provides the sum of \$33,430.00 for support of research entitled, "Effects of Storing Blood in Plastic Containers." The contract is effective October 23, 1967, through October 22, 1968, and the research will be performed under the direction of Wallace L. Guess, Associate Professor of Pharmacy.

The Agreement is effective for the period January 1, 1968, through December 31, 1969, and the research will be conducted by Dr. E. Gus Fruh, Assistant Professor of Civil Engineering.

The Agreement is effective for the period July 1, 1967, through June 30, 1969, and the research will be conducted by Dr. Frank D. Masch, Associate Professor of Civil Engineering.

<u>ACADEMIC AND BUSINESS CONTRACTS</u>: The following academic and business contracts have been executed at U.T. Austin by the official indicated. I recommend approval and ratification of signatures:

- 1. Deed of Gift from Collins Radio Company, signed by President Norman Hackerman, transferring to The University of Texas at Austin a twenty-eight foot parabaloid antenna system located in Richardson, Texas, to be used in the graduate research program in electrical engineering.
- 2. Interagency Contract IAC (68-69)-161, with Austin State Hospital of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University will conduct a supervisory training unit in Vocational Nurses Training through its Industrial Education Department of the Division of Extension for personnel of the hospital. The contract is in force from November 6 to November 10, 1967, and the total amount is not to exceed \$40.00.
- 3. Interagency Contract IAC (68-69)-165 with Texas Education Agency, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its College of Education will conduct the visitation phase of the state procedure for approval of teacher education and provide professional services through membership on the evaluation team used in the procedure to approve teacher education programs offered at the University. The contract is in force February 20-22, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$900.00 representing actual travel and per diem costs.
- 4. Interagency Contract IAC (68-69)-167 with the Texas Water Development Board, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Center for Research in Water Resources will assist in a two year study to determine whether the physical exchange of waters between the bays along the Texas Coast and the Gulf of Mexico can be increased by either dredging new passes or by enlarging existing passes through the barrier islands. The contract is in effect January 1 August 31,1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$2,254.00.
- 5. Interagency Contract IAC (68-69)-175, with the Texas Water Development Board, signed by Vice-President J. H. Colvin, whereby the Texas Water Development Board will assist research in cloud climatology by a grant to the University for the support of one graduate research assistant, along with funds for necessary travel, materials, and services, the research to be under the direction of Professor K. H. Jehn. The contract is in force from November 1, 1967 through August 31, 1968, and the total amount is not to exceed \$6,600.00.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the Faculty Council and/or General Faculty. I recommend approval.

1. The Faculty Council at its meeting on November 20, 1967, approved the report and recommendations of the Calendar Committee (D&P 4028-30). This report provided for the 1969-70 Long Session Calendar with the opening of the Long Session on September 14, Sunday. September 15 and 16 are given to orientation and registration is September 15-19, with classes beginning Monday, September 22. The Thanksgiving holidays are November 27-29, 1969, and the Christmas vacation December 22 - Jaunary 3, with classes resuming on Monday, January 5, 1970. No class days are January 12-14, examinations January 15-24, with January 24, Saturday, graduation day but with no public exercises. Registration for the spring semester is January 26-30, with classes beginning Monday, February 2, 1970. Spring vacation is March 23-28, and Honors Day, for which classes will be dismissed, will be in April, the exact date to be determined later. May 15-16 are no class days except in School of Law, examinations being scheduled in that School May 15-27. Final examinations for other colleges are May 18-27, with commencement May 30, Saturday.

The Summer Session 1969 calendar lists registration on June 3-4, with classes beginning Thursday, June 5. A holiday is scheduled for Friday, July 4, with final examinations for first-term courses July 12-15, during which time there will be no classes for the twelve week classes. July 16 is registration for second term students with classes beginning July 17, Thursday. Examinations for twelve-week and second six-week courses will be given August 23-26, with August 26, Tuesday, as graduation day but with no public exercises.

This report also recommended that all references to a 9 week summer term be deleted from the Calendar for the 1968 Summer Session. (Action reversed at December 18 meeting.)

2. The Faculty Council on November 30, 1967, approved by the circularization procedure the proposed changes in the College of Fine Arts (D&P 4031-32) in regard to Plan IIIA and Plan IIIB, for students majoring in Music Education, four-year curriculum. These changes eliminate the two-hour percussion course from the programs and change two of the two-hour courses to three-hour credit courses, thus keeping the same total semester hours required for the degree. The two hour courses changed are: Choral Arranging for Secondary School Ensembles (227 to 327), and General Music in the Junior-High School (272N to 372N).

TRAVEL FOR FACULTY AND STAFF: The following trips are reported in accordance with Section 12 of the Budget Rules and Procedures for 1967-68 when expenses are paid from funds not specifically designated for travel, and in accordance with Section 13.23 of Chapter III of Part II of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of the University of Texas when the absence is for a longer period than twenty-nine days:

- l. Mr. J. H. Colvin, Vice-President for Business Affairs, November 6, to Welder Wildlife Foundation Headquarters, near Sinton, Texas, to attend a meeting of institutions and organizations engaged in Marine Science and ocean-related studies and activities in the Coastal Bend Area, and to confer with County Judge of Nueces County regarding land acquisition for the Institute of Marine Science; and November 12-14, 1967, to Columbus, Ohio, to attend the meeting of the National Association of State Universities and Land-grant Colleges, expenses for both trips, the first in an approximate amount of \$35.00 and the second in an approximate amount of \$218, to be paid from Miscellaneous Administrative Expenses, Office of the President.
- 2. Mr. Tom J. Mabry, Associate Professor of Botany, December 29, 1967 January 6, 1968, to Kingston, Jamaica, W.I., via Baton Rouge, Louisiana, to meet and confer with a colleague at LSU regarding a paper which they will co-author, and on to the meeting of the Second Natural Products Symposium in the West Indies, expenses for transportation only in an approximate amount of \$200 to be paid from University Research Institute Funds.

Sjoberg, Assistant Professor of Linguistics, December 22, 1967 January 15, 1968, to Madras, India, to present papers at two conferences on Dravidian linguistics, expenses up to an amount of \$800 to be paid from University Research Institute Funds. December 22 January 4 is Christmas vacation for the faculty.
- 4. Mr. Robert Audi and Mr. Philip Grandjean Hugly, both Assistant Professors of Philosophy, November 24-27, 1967, to Chapel Hill, North Carolina, to attend the Colloquium in Philosophy and at the request of the chairman of the Department of Philosophy, to interview certain prospective candidates for positions at the University, transportation expenses only in an approximate amount of \$178 each to be paid from the Excellence allotment for Special Graduate Program Development.

- 5. Mr. Ignazio A. Angelelli and Mr. Philip Grandjean Hugly, both Assistant Professors of Philosophy, November 9-12, 1967, to London, Ontario, Canada, to attend a symposium of Philosophical Logic and to interview candidates for positions in the Department of Philosophy at the University; expenses for transportation in an approximate amount of \$201 will be paid from Special Graduate Program Development from the Excellence Fund.
- 6. Mr. Robert G. Cushing, Assistant Professor of Sociology, November 3-5, 1967, to Tulsa, Oklahoma to participate in an organizational meeting for a study of rural poverty to be sponsored by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, expenses in an approximate amount of \$115 to be paid from University Research Institute funds.
- 7. Mr. Richard H. Richardson, Assistant Professor of Zoology, December 24, 1967 January 3, 1968, to Washington, D.C., and New York City, to present a symposium paper and attend meetings of Biometric Society and AAAS, expenses in an approximate amount of \$425 to be paid from University Research Institute funds.
- 8. Mr. Richard L. Beard, Assistant Professor of General Business, November 10, 1967, to Uvalde, Camp Wood, and Junction, Texas, for research work on the history of the Texas cedarchopper, expenses for transportation in an approximate amount of \$50.00 to be paid from University Research Institute Funds.
- 9. Mr. Wayne N. Thompson, Professor of Speech, October 26-28, 1967, to Houston, Texas, to accompany the University debate team, expenses in an approximate amount of \$50.00 to be paid from funds of the Oratorical Association.

- 3. Mr. Pierre R. Loiseaux, Professor of Law, to act as consultant to Texas Attorney General on pending litigation regarding the validity of the Texas Regulatory Loan Act of 1963.
- 4. Mr. George Schatzki, Associate Professor of Law, to act as consultant to the Attorney General of Texas on pending litigation regarding the validity of the Texas Regulatory Loan Act of 1963.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE WAYNE FRANKLIN BOWMAN, JR., SCHOLARSHIP: Mr. Wayne Franklin Bowman of Houston, Texas, has sent a check in the amount of \$1,000 to establish a scholarship in memory of his son, Wayne Franklin Bowman, Jr., to be used to benefit an entering freshman who otherwise would be unable to go to college. Mr. Bowman intends to add to the principal amount from time to time and only the income will be used for the scholarship. The account and scholarship will be administered by the Dean of the College of Engineering through the Engineering Foundation.

<u>USE OF TEXTBOOKS WRITTEN BY THE FACULTY</u>: In accordance with Chapter III, Section 24 of Part I of the Regents' Rules and Regulations for the Government of The University of Texas, I recommend approval of the use of the following faculty-authored book as a textbook for the 1967-68 Long Session;

l. <u>Distillation</u>, by Mathew Van Winkle, Professor of Chemical Engineering, published by McGraw-Hill Book Company in December 1967, which sells for \$16.50 with royalty of 10% to author.

ESTABLISHMENT OF H. J. LEON SCHOLARSHIP IN CLASSICS: Dr. H. J. Leon, Professor of Classics, died December 4, 1967. He came to the University in 1923 as Instructor and served the University continuously until his death, attaining the rank of Professor in 1942. He served as Chairman of the department for a number of years. Mrs. Leon, in accordance with the wishes of Dr. Leon, desires to establish a scholarship for graduate students in the Department of Classics, and she is giving \$10,000 for this purpose. Other contributions have been received from former students and friends of Dr. Leon, and all such funds are to be invested through the University's Investment Office, and the interest used for the scholarship. The scholarship fund will be administered by a committee of awards, consisting of the chairman and the graduate studies committee of the Department of Classics.

The following docket is submitted for your approval and presentation to the Board of Regents at the meeting in San Antonio, Texas, on January 26-27, 1968:

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT
