The following docket for The University of Texas at Austin is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Houston on January 31 - February 1, 1969.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

CONTRACT and GRANTS (Federal):

1. Grant AFOSR-69-1682, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides the sum of \$29,800 for support of research entitled "Vibrational Relaxation in the Photochemical Primary Process." The grant is effective for the period January 1, 1969 through December 31, 1970, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. W. Albert Noyes, Jr., Ashbel Smith Professor of Chemistry.
2. Assignment of Patent Rights, by which the University transfers to the Department of the Air Force all right, title and interest in and to an invention entitled "Laser System for Generating Coherent Light" (Case No. S/N 450,573). The invention resulted from research under USAF Contract AF 33(616)-7916 directed by Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director, Applied Research Laboratories.
3. Modification P003, Change Order to Contract F 33615-68-C-1619, by which the Department of the Air Force, U.S. Air Force Systems Command, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, adds the sum of \$30,000 to the contract funds, making a new total of \$333,313. The research on weapon delivery analysis continues at the Applied Research Laboratories under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
4. Modification P003 to Contract DAAB 07-68-C 0319, by which the Department of the Army, Headquarters, U.S. Army Electronics Command, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, provides for the Government's furnishing certain property requested of them by the contractor. The research continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Alfred H. LaGrone, Professor of Electrical Engineering.

5. Modification No. 7 to Contract DA-22-079-eng-393, by which the Department of the Army, U.S. Army Engineer Waterways Experiment Station, Corps of Engineers, Vicksburg, Mississippi, establishes final overhead rates of 40.5% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1964, through August 31, 1965, and 32.3% of salaries and wages for the period September 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966. The study of materials and systems for isolation of underground structures subjected to dynamic loads was conducted under the direction of Professor J. Neils Thompson, Professor of Civil Engineering.
6. Modification A 015 to Contract DA23-072-ORD-1564, by which the Department of the Army, White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico, provides for certain equipment accountable under the contract to be transferred to Contract DA29-040-AMC-1802(E). The theoretical studies of meteorological sensors, and analysis and interpretation of rocket data were conducted under the direction of Kenneth H. Jehn, Associate Professor of Meteorology.
7. Assignment of Patent Rights, by which the University transfers to the Department of the Navy, all right, title and interest in and to an invention entitled "Active Sonar System" (Navy Case No. 44, 010). The invention resulted from research under Department of the Navy Contract N60921-7002 (7) under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director, Applied Research Laboratories.
8. Modification No. 3 to Contract DA-49-193-MD-2942, by which the Department of the Army, Headquarters U.S. Army Medical Research and Development Command, Office of the Surgeon General, Washington, D. C., sets the fixed overhead rate of 32.3% of salaries and wages for the period May 1, 1966 through August 31, 1966. The research entitled "Novel 4 - Quinolinemethanol Antimalarials" continues under the direction of Dr. Royston Roberts, Professor of Chemistry.
9. Assignment of Patent Rights, by which the University transfers to the Department of the Navy, all right, title and interest in and to an invention entitled "A Method and Apparatus for Underwater Acoustic Detection and Location of an Object" (Navy Case No. 45,153). The invention resulted from research under Department of the Navy Contract N60921-7002 (8) under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director, Applied Research Laboratories.
10.  - A. On December 12, 1968, the proposed change to eliminate on page 31 of the 1968-70 Catalogue the entire page dealing with "Area Requirements" (D&P 4329). The following reason was given for this legislation:

The first twenty-eight semester hours in the School of Law are still prescribed for graduation as well as additional courses in the second and third year. After the first year of law school, the faculty feels that the student, except for a few required courses, should be able to choose the courses that will be of greatest legal interest to himself. With two years remaining in law school, it will be virtually impossible for him to be graduated without taking courses in the different areas, as now defined. In the past, some senior students who were hired in their last year were denied the opportunity of taking courses needed for their newly acquired jobs because courses had to be taken to fill area requirements.
 - B. On December 16, 1968, the following proposals: (1) Change the catalogue so that "Legal Accounting" is not a required course. It continues to be limited for credit to students who have not had six hours of accounting (D&P 4330). At the present time, Texas is one of seven law schools in the Association of American Law Schools that requires Legal Accounting for graduation. Seventy-two schools offer it as an elective. There is no doubt that Legal Accounting is an important course that a law student would be well advised to take. But the same can be said of all other second- and third-year law courses that are not required. The Faculty feels that Legal Accounting should no longer be singled out from other important second- and third-year courses by requiring the student to take it.

Faculty Legislation (continued)

(2) Change the number of hours required for a degree from eighty-eight to eighty-four (D&P 4330). This change is intended to allow the law student to complete all work for his law degree in three scholastic years without taking a maximum course load each semester. The normal course load in the School of law is fourteen semester hours. The first-year law student is required to take fourteen hours each semester during his first scholastic year. Under the present requirement of eighty-eight semester hours for graduation, he would have to take fifteen semester hours of courses each of his remaining four semesters in the School of Law. If the total number of hours required for graduation is reduced to eighty-four, the degree may be received by taking the full normal load of fourteen semester hours each of the remaining semesters.

C. On December 21, 1968, approved the proposal to reword the paragraph on page 27 in regard to courses offered by other schools or colleges (D&P 4354). This will increase from three to six the number of semester hours that a law student may take for credit in graduate level courses. The administrators of the Criminal Justice program feel that courses in Psychology, Sociology, and Social Studies would be most beneficial for their students. The Law School faculty feels that such interdisciplinary studies should be encouraged.

3. The Faculty Council at its meeting of December 16, 1968, approved changes in the General Information Bulletin in regard to adding and dropping courses (D&P 4332). This would permit an instructor to recommend that an undergraduate student be allowed to drop a course with a grade of Q even though his work is not at C level or above. The present rule requires that an F be given in such cases, and no discretionary power is provided. Different mechanisms have been employed to circumvent the regulation, and the proposed legislation, providing that such recommendations on the part of instructors be reviewed by the dean, would provide a fair and proper mechanism.

COLLEGE WORK-STUDY PROGRAM: The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare has authorized \$78,591 for this purpose for the period January 1 - June 30, 1969, this amount being 94.96% of the state percentage.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Section 13, Part One of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

1. Mr. Robert F. Peck, Professor of Educational Psychology, to serve occasionally as consultant to business organizations on appraisal and development of executives.
2. Mr. W. W. Gibson, Associate Professor of Law, to represent Texas Automobile and Truck Wreckers Association on plea of privilege.
3. Mr. Ernest E. Smith, Professor of Law, to study for the Texas Land Title Association and Texas Underwriters of Texas, Inc., a proposed bill to substitute microfilming for recordation of public records in bound volumes and to revise the present system of recording public documents.
4. Mr. M. K. Woodward, Professor of Law, to prepare an amicus curiae brief.
