Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health and Ima Hogg Foundation to the following institutions and agencies:

 Alpine Women's Center, Inc. Alpine, Texas

Outreach Program For Women's Center - \$26,880

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a grant for the period September 1, 1984 through August 31, 1985. The Alpine Women's Center is a nonprofit organization which provides shelter via a "safe" environment and counseling for women and children who are victims of domestic violence. Over the past two years, the Alpine Women's Center has enjoyed considerable success in developing activities to strengthen families experiencing discord, abuse and neglect. In addition, the center focuses on individual and group counseling and collaborates with an extensive network of community agencies in the region to provide follow-up services. The Center will seek to develop outreach services to those women and children who are victims of domestic violence and in need of assistance in Brewster, Jeff Davis, Pecos, Terrell, and Presidio counties. Intervention, residential, and counseling services will be provided to families experiencing psychological trauma as a result of sexual abuse, rape, neglect and violence in domestic situations. In addition, the Center offers sessions in parent-effectiveness training, self-reliance, money management and budgeting, family planning, career and educational options, building self-esteem, legal aid, and the like.

Ms. Janice Harvey, the director of the Alpine Women's Center, is responsible for the administration of the program.

 Baylor College of Medicine, Meyer Center for Developmental Disabilities - Houston, Texas

Prevention of School Failure in Prematurely Born Children - \$35,603

The Executive Committee of the Ima Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period October 1, 1984 to September 30, 1985. The program will involve the enrollment, over a one-year period, of three-year old children who have escaped major handicap. They will be evaluated comprehensively by an interdisciplinary team at 3 years, $4\frac{1}{2}$ -5 years, and $6-6\frac{1}{2}$ years. At each age, parents will be educated concerning any weaknesses or deficiencies and specific community-based remediation will be The proposed demonstration project has two purposes: recommended. first, 65 children will be assessed in the areas of fine motor development, speech/language development, and psychologic functioning before entering formal school. An instrument battery designed to detect the precursors of the actual learning disability/ attentional disorder at the earliest possible age will be used. The second purpose of the project is to determine for each age group the most cost and time effective methods for detecting such deficiencies in the future.

Dr. Murdina Desmond, M.D., of Baylor College of Medicine will be responsible for administration of the project.

 Cities in Schools, Houston, Inc. Houston, Texas

Trilevel Children's Services Program - \$29,473

The Ima Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period of August 1, 1984 to July 31, 1985. This grant is for the continuation of more intensive therapeutic interventions with students in the Cities in Schools targeted schools and further staff and parent training.

Ms. Jill Shaw, President of Cities in Schools, Houston, Inc., is responsible for the administration of the program.

City of Austin Police Department

Survey of the Austin Transient Population - \$19,714

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period July 1, 1984 through December 31, 1984. These funds will be used for a study of Austin's transient population.

The objectives of the proposed survey of 800 transients are to provide a description of homeless people in Austin, including their background and demographic characteristics, mental health status, physical health status, physical health status, legal status and work problems and orientations. The results will be distributed to a wide array of local, state, and possibly national agencies. The survey will be undertaken by Dr. Donald Baumann of U.T. Austin Department of Psychology and several associates.

Police Chief Frank Dyson will be responsible for administering the project.

5. The Dallas Home for the Jewish Aged Dallas, Texas

Conference on Alzheimer's Disease - \$1,000

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant for the period August, 1984 through November, 1984. These funds will be used to bring to Dallas a person well-known in the field of Alzheimer's Disease to consult with staff and other professionals and to speak at a conference on the subject.

Dr. Herbert Shore will be responsible for administration of the project.

6. El Paso Council on Aging, Inc. El Paso, Texas

Weekend Outreach and Crisis Service for Elderly/Project Elders - \$21,534

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a grant for the third and final year to cover the period September 1, 1984, through August 31, 1985. The Council will provide weekend outreach services to the frail elderly and crisis counseling during incidences of psychological trauma or distress. A cadre of senior citizens has received specialized training in crisis management, intervention approaches and counseling techniques. In this final year of support, the Council will seek to provide outreach services to elders in Canutillo, Clint, and Fabens. Appropriate screening and referrals will be made to health and mental health centers for those needing specialized care.

Mrs. Amelia Castillo, Executive Director of the El Paso Council on Aging, Inc., is responsible for the administration and supervision of the project.

7. Houston Independent School District Houston, Texas

Staff Training in Teaching of Higher Order Thinking Skills and Learning to Learn - \$14,921

The Executive Committee of the Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a one-time grant for the period July 1 to August 31, 1984. This grant will support developmental activities associated with the introduction of the principles of Learning About Learning into the the Houston schools. The Learning About Learning Educational Foundation is an innovative organization which, with over 25 years of experience, has developed a comprehensive program for the systematic development of thinking and learning skills in students. The Houston Independent School District, which serves 10 per cent of all Texas school children, has offered to serve as a laboratory in which the teaching of higher order thinking and learning skills is tested on a major scale.

Ms. Patricia Shell is responsible for the program.

8. The Institute for the Humanities at Salado Salado, Texas

"Texas Myths: The Personal and Collective" Symposium - \$1,000

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant for the period October 26-28, 1984. These funds will be used to pay the travel and honorarium for Dr. Donald Sandner, a Jungian psychoanalyst and authority on the nature of mythology and its healing powers.

Dr. Harry Wilmer is responsible for administration of the project.

9. Long Chapel Christian Methodist Episcopal Church Lufkin, Texas

Teenage/Unwed Pregnancies Project - \$992

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period July 1, 1984 to July 31, 1984. Dr. Marion Howard, Ph.D., of Emory/Grady Teen Services Program in Atlanta, Georgia, will consult with the Titus Institute and related organizations in the Lufkin area to further clarify issues related to development of services for teen parents and pregnant teens. The purpose of the consultation is to provide the Board of Directors of Titus Institute with technical assistance from a nationally recognized expert in the area of service delivery to teenage parents.

Dr. Lacey Chimney, Chair of Stewards of Long Chapel Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, will be responsible for administration of the project.

10. Marlin-Falls County Committee for Health and Community Development (Continued)

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a third-year grant for the period August 1, 1984 to July 31, 1985. The program is designed to expose preteens and teens in Falls County to career options and to involve them in personal development activities in an effort to improve their sense of self-esteem and to prevent delinquent behavior. Bilingual, simple information outlining developmental milestones for children ages 0-6 years has been developed for parents of such children. Over 80 agencies and organizations have signed statements of collaboration and cooperation with Project ABC for follow along medical and psychological consultations. This project, which works closely with city-sponsored health and mental health services in identifying and referring high-risk children with physical and mental developmental problems, has been cited as a "showcase" project in the nation.

Dr. Marian Sokol, Director of Project ABC, is responsible for the administration and supervision of the project.

 Southwest Texas State University - Department of Psychology San Marcos, Texas

Study of Self-Disclosure and Marital Satisfaction - \$4,058

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a one-time grant for the period September 1, 1984 through August 31, 1985. These funds will be used to support research on the relationship between self disclosure and marital satisfaction. Although previous research findings demonstrate a positive relationship between disclosure and marital satisfaction, such research has relied almost exclusively on the role of the sender of such information, rather than the receiver. This study of 150 couples reflecting the ethnic and socioeconomic diversity of central Texas will focus on receiver characteristics, including spouses' skills at eliciting disclosures and tendencies to respond empathically.

Professor Richard L. Archer will serve as the project administrator.

Comprehensive Primary Prevention Program for Delinquent Behavior - \$33,367

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending a secondyear grant for the period of September 1, 1984 through August 31, 1985. This project will aid in supporting the implementation and evaluation of a foster group home, emergency shelter, and counseling services to youth between the ages of 12 and 17 in Comal County. This live presentation to an audience comprised of prosecutors, judges, law enforcement personnel, and service delivery personnel in the area of child abuse is designed to arouse additional interest in the area of child abuse and to stimulate positive responses to this problem. Individuals attending the conference and others will have the opportunity to make the presentation available in their own communities either via videotape or by using the script for additional live presentations. Moreover, the play will become a part of Child and Family Service's Plays for Living program and, through that organization, will reach other audiences.

Mr. Lou McCreary, Chief of the State and County Affairs Division of the Attorney General's Office, will serve as project administrator.

21. Texas Coalition for Juvenile Justice Austin, Texas

Community Education Series on Children in Adult Jails - \$15,000

The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a one-year grant for the period September 1, 1984 through August 31, 1985. This grant is for partial support of an educational series on children in adult jails and will combine with funds from the Texas Department of Human Resources and other private sector grants. The purpose of this series of workshops in various Texas cities is to make communities aware of the absence of access to separate juvenile detention facilities in their areas and to act as a catalyst for local groups to develop their own programs suited to their local situations.

These funds will be used to design, implement and test a pilot program of Volunteer Client Companion Services to provide adjunctive support for case managers and their clients at six community MHMR centers. The intended program is an innovative and potentially cost-effective means to enhance the continuity of client care in the context of more clients being involved at the local MHMR center level. It also represents a sound manner to identify and involve untapped volunteer resources as sources of support for developing the Department's new statewide case management system.

Mental Health Volunteers in Long-Term Nursing Home Care of the Elderly - \$17,210

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period August 1, 1984 through July 31, 1985. These funds will aid in supporting a demonstration project designed to address the special mental health needs of nursing home residents through the services of a cadre of volunteers trained as paraprofessionals. Dr. Michael Duffy is working closely with the Family Life Program of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and the Retired Senior Volunteer Program. The Hogg Foundation grant will be matched by the Astin Charitable Trust of Bryan, Texas, and other resources from the Retired Senior Volunteer Program.

Dr. Michael Duffy is responsible for the administration and supervision of the project.

24. Texas Tech University - Department of Psychology Lubbock, Texas

Longitudinal Study of Relationship Development and Change - \$6,340

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period of August 1, 1984 through August 31, 1985. This grant is for continued support of a five-year longitudinal study of relationship development and changes among engaged, married and divorced couples. First year progress on this study of how couples maintain long-term bonds, the factors contributing to the maintenance or to the dissolution of the relationship and on why unhappy marriages continue has been satisfactory. The finding should be of value to marriage and family counselors in Texas and elsewhere.

Dr. John H. Harvey, Chairman of the Department of Psychology at Texas Tech University, will continue as project director.

Educating for Mental Health Services - \$900

The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a supplementary grant for the period September 1, 1984 through May 30, 1985. The demand for the videotaped client preparation for psychotherapy designed to reduce drop-out rates among Mexican American outpatient clients has been greater than was originally anticipated. This supplementary grant will enable the principal investigator to acquaint an additional number of community MHMR centers with the videotape as well as to produce extra copies of it.

The investigation will focus on the differences in the role of non-custodial parents, comparing those living near their child with those living far away. Her finding should have important implications for possible interventions with divorced families.

Collaboration between these individuals in undertaking field studies within San Antonio and Monterrey is particularly significant in view of the cross-cultural studies both have completed independently. The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a fifth and final grant for the period September 1, 1984 to August 31, 1985. This grant will be used to support a classroom teacher who will deliver direct educational services to autistic children from the Houston area. Avondale House has been Houston's leader in helping autistic children and their families and is especially innovative in their provision of respite services. The agency has recently expanded to two residential homes and a school, enabling them to triple the number of children they serve.

35. Houston Child Guidance Center Houston, Texas

Family Crisis Intervention Program - \$150,000

Many of these youngsters would have been institutionalized had the service not been available.

Visitor's Fee

A visitor's fee of [68] $\frac{525}{25}$ a course is required of persons not registered for credit and the visitor must pay the laboratory fee the same as for credit. If the visitor desires to use the library, a non-student library deposit of \$25 is required.

CHANGE 2

Student Services Fee

Grades
