Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health and Ima Hogg Foundation to the following institutions and agencies:

1. Alpine Women's Center, Inc.

Outreach Program for Women's Center - \$12,600

The Ima Hogg Foundation Executive Comittee is recommending for approval a third and final grant for the period September 1, 1986 through August 31, 1987. The Center will continued to provide intervention and individual and group counseling services for families experiencing sexual abuse, rape, neglect and violence in domestic situations. Residential services are provided on a 24-hour basis for those families who must be removed from the home environment for their own safety. The Center will continue to seek resources to expand its outreach services to those women and children who experience physical and psychological trauma and who are in need of assistance in the most sparsely populated rural areas of West Texas. Ms. Janice Harvey, Director, is responsible for the administration of the program.

2. Capital Area Mental Health Center

Reorganization of Capital Area Mental Health Center - \$9,735

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a one-time-only grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. These funds will be used to provide emergency support for the operation of the clinic. Since its Hogg Foundation-supported beginning in 1981, this low-cost mental health clinic has provided an urgently needed component in the provision of mental health services in the Austin community. Its extremely low fee schedule has provided hundreds of persons access to services which they otherwise might not have received. The low fees, however, have not come close to meeting the cost of running the clinic. Therefore, the Hogg Foundation is recommending the approval of a twelve-month emergency grant during which the clinic director and board are going to review and reorganize their entire program, including fund-raising efforts. Dr. Connie Deutsch, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

3. Communities in Schools El Paso, Inc.

Communities in Schools Project - \$24,150

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period August 1, 1986 through July 31, 1987. This grant is for continued support of a new program in El Paso designed to coordinate social services for students and their families and to initiate a youth employment program. The grant will combine with support from public and private agencies and has as its major goal the reduction of school dropouts. Mr. Robert Shaw, Director, will be responsible for the administration of the program.

4. Communities in Schools Houston, Inc.

Trilevel Children's Services Program - \$22,813

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a fourth and final grant for the period August 1, 1986 to July 31, 1987. Communities in Schools Houston, Inc. has submitted a satisfactory progress report covering the third year of a project providing mental health services in the school setting. The Ima Hogg funds will be used primarily for support of key program staff. Ms. Audean Allman, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

5. Deaf Council of Greater Houston, Inc.

Houston Deaf Access and Outreach Project - \$20,000

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a second-year grant for the period August 1, 1986 to July 31, 1987. The Deaf Council of Greater Houston, Inc. has submitted a satisfactory progress report on the first year's activities. This funding will be used to provide much-needed mental health services to deaf youngsters in the Houston area. Mrs. Lucy Rodriguez-Chimelak, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

6. Easter Seal Rehabiliation Center

Psychiatric Neurobehavioral & Educational Progam for Developmentally Disabled Children & Adolescents - \$25,460

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second and final year grant for the period September 1, 1986 through August 31, 1987. This program is designed to evaluate and treat developmentally disabled children and adolescents in the Bexar County area with psychiatric diagnoses. The children will be enrolled in intensive, individualized behavioral therapy programs designed to reduce maladaptive behaviors. Mr. Randel W. Aaron, Executive Director, will be responsible for administration of the project.

7. El Paso Community Foundation

American College Testing Intervention Project for Hispanic High School Students - \$19,985

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a grant for the period July 1, 1986 through June 30, 1987. These funds will be used to support the pilot phase of an intervention project for Hispanic high school students. The proposed project is a joint endeavor among the educational institutions in El Paso, to be funded jointly by the Hogg Foundation, the Brown Foundation, and American College Testing (ACT). The first phase of the project is to develop a thorough plan for carrying out Project ACCION and to complete all the project's major developmental and planning tasks prior to implementation. Ms. Janice Windle will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

8. El Paso Council on Aging

Project Elders: Leadership Development in a Border Region - \$23,289

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a second and final grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. Seventy-six elders were identified from the four quadrants in the city and trained as volunteer leaders. Once trained, these volunteer leaders served as group leaders for other recruits and comprise the nucleus for the development of a mentors program as each new cluster of volunteers is integrated into a more visible community volunteer corps. These leaders were trained in a variety of areas, such as listening and counseling techniques, communication skills, human development processes, socialization skills, resource development, and self-help approaches. Mrs. Amelia Castillo, Executive Director, is responsible for the administration of the program.

9. The Mental Health Association of Houston and Harris County, Inc.

Comprehensive Mental Health Plan for Persons in Crisis - \$19,622

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a second and final grant for the period July 1, 1986 to June 30, 1987. These funds will enable the Mental Health Association to implement a comprehensive mental health plan for

persons in crisis in the Houston area. The plan was developed during the first year of the project. The plan has already been put to use in several instances. One of this program's major benefits is the spirit of cooperation among Houston agencies and institutions, which has been engendered by the planning process. Ms. Betsy Schwartz, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

10. Mental Health Association in Texas

Research on Community-Based Support Services to Families - \$18,980

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a one-time grant for the period August 1, 1986 to January 31, 1987. These funds will be used to conduct a study of community-based support services for families of the mentally ill. The investigation will identify and carefully study model programs in other cities, and survey family members in Texas to find out what their needs and priorities are in support services. It is hoped that the findings of this research project will enable policy makers and program managers to allocate resources for support services into the most beneficial types of endeavors. Mrs. Stella Mullins, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

11. PACT, Inc. (Parents and Children Together)

SKIP (Support for Kids of Incarcerated Parents) - \$14,000

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a second-year grant for the period October 1, 1986 to September 30, 1987. These funds will be used to continue the program at the Federal Correctional Institution in Ft. Worth. During its first year of existence, the program provided support services for almost 300 children of incarcarated parents. In addition to providing support groups and quality time for children while they are at the prison with their parents, the program has, on occasion, also provided transportation and housing to enable some of the children to make the visit. Ms. Debra Roberson, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

12. Santa Rosa Medical Center (Project Any Baby Can), San Antonio, Texas

Foster Grandparent/Respite Care Program - \$29,476

The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second and final grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. The program provides support for families with developmentally disabled or chronically ill children. A foster grandparent is assigned to families with psychosocial problems and limited resources. The grandparent focuses on providing in-home personalized care and individualized attention needed by the client, or special child. Dr. Marian Sokol, Director, will be responsible for the administration of the project.

13. Texas Migrant Council, Laredo, Texas

Education of Head Start Children, Parents and Teachers to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse and Abduction - \$31,964

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. The purpose of this program is to prepare children to recognize victimizing circumstances and to develop anti-victimization skills in areas of sexual abuse and abduction. Direct educational services have been offered to children, parents and teachers of the Texas Migrant Council's Head Start programs. The second-year evaluation component will entail modifying and improving the evaluation research methods, enlarging the control group, and

creating master lists from school records in all sites. This project will generate the only data base of its kind in the nation. Ms. Mary Guevara, Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

14. Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation

Long-Range Plan for Mental Health Services - \$29,575

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second phase grant for the period August 1, 1986 to January 31, 1987. This grant will be used to continue to develop and implement a long-range plan for mental health services in the state. The grant will enable TDMHMR to retain the services of a senior level planner and to utilize the expertise of several nationally known consultants in the development of a series of six-year plans for mental health services. Dr. Gary E. Miller, Commissioner, will be the administrator of this project.

15. Travis County Council for the Deaf

Mental Health Implications of Adult-Onset Hearing Loss - \$18,805

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a one-year grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. This grant will be used to conduct a study on the mental health implications of adult-onset hearing loss, an area which has received very little attention in research to date. The research will be conducted by mail questionnaires distributed through service providers across the state. Dr. Dorie Giles Williams will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

16. Urban Affairs Corporation

Fifth Ward Enrichment Program - \$133,740

The Ima Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a third-year grant for the period June 1, 1986 to May 31, 1987. This grant will be used to continue the program that is an effort to help high-risk Black adolescent males in Houston's improverished Fifth Ward. Mrs. Donna Bryant, Executive Director, will be responsible for the administration of the program.

17. Texas A&M University, Department of Educational Psychology

"Project OASIS" - Project Training and Consultation - \$27,468

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second and final grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. These funds will support a program for statewide dissemination and technology transfer of Project OASIS, a demonstration project designed to address the increasing mental health needs of nuring home residents through the services of a select group of trained retired senior volunteers. Dr. Michael Duffy is responsible for the administration of the project.

18. Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center (for the Texas Office of Rural Health at the Regional Academic Health Center at the Permian Basin)

Rural Environment and Its Stressors - Phase II - \$26,030

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second and final grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. The purpose of the program is to minimize maladaptive reactions by rural Texans to stress-producing factors in their environment. This year will be devoted to stabilizing the financial base of the project and forming new liaisons that will enrich the services offered through the Texas Office of Rural Health. This investigation of the outcome of long-term senescent forgetfulness is a project which has also received approval from the American Federation for Aging Research (AFAR), Inc. The Hogg Foundation is recommending that we join AFAR in supporting this project. Specifically, we are suggesting that we provide half the total cost of one-year research project. Dr. Harvey S. Levin, Professor, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

Austin. Mrs. Eunice Garcia, Specialist in the School of Social Work, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

Learning Abilities Center Interdisciplinary Child/Family Clinic - \$31,052

The Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a second-year grant for the period September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. This interdisciplinary advanced practicum training program has offered a unique educational experience for graduate students at the University and provided an important linkage between U.T. Austin and the Austin community. Dr. William Harmer, Director, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.
