The grant is effective for the period August 28, 1974 through January 1, 1975, and the investigations will be under the direction of David S. Dibble, Acting Director, Texas Archeological Survey.

4. Grant Letter (dated 26 August 1974) by which Duke University, Durham, North Carolina, provides \$7,000 for support of the Texas Junior Science and Humanities Symposium to be held February 12-14, 1975. Funds were made available under Grant DAHCO 4-74-Gl90 to Duke University by the U.S. Army Research Office-Durham. The award is effective for the period August 26, 1974 through June 30, 1975, and the symposium will be under the direction of Dr. Dale G. Bettis, Assistant Professor of Aerospace Engineering and Engineering Mechanics.

5. Amendment No. 1 (dated 15 May 1974) to Agreement between The Institute of International Education, New York, New York, and The University of Texas at Austin, by which the Institute provides an amount not to exceed \$2,225 for 15 additional students to attend a special weekend workshop to be held during the 41-day Orientation Program for incoming foreign students. The survey on pharmacy prescription costs continues under the direction of Dr. Stanley Arbingast, Director, Bureau of Business Research.

8. Grant Letter (dated 5 July 1974) by which William Underwood Company, Watertown, Massachusetts, provides \$10,000 for support of research entitled, "Study of Possible Relationships Between Deficiencies of Vitamin B₆ and Monosodium Glutamate and the Chinese Restaurant Syndrome." The grant is effective for the period August 1, 1974 through December 31, 1974, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. Karl Folkers, Director, Institute for Biomedical Research.

This amendment became effective August 16, 1974 and will terminate December 20, 1974. All other terms and conditions not hereby amended are to remain in full force and effect.

10. Amendment to Contract dated March 31, 1960, between The University of Texas at Austin (Ex-Students' Association) and Pepsi Cola Bottling Company of Austin (Previously called Sandahl Beverages), signed by Vice President James H. Colvin.

Items 1 and 2 of the schedule of commissions as it appears in Article 4 of the above mentioned contract is hereby changed to read:

- 1. Bottler will operate machines which will dispense Beverages in twelve (12) ounce cans, at such locations as may be designated by the Ex-Students' Association and Bottler. The vending price will be \$.20 per can.
- 2. Bottler agrees to pay the Association 10.0% of gross sales. Bottler will pay State and City sales taxes in the amount of 5% of gross sales. This agreement is based upon the prevailing wholesale price of \$4.00 per case as provided for in the memorandum agreement of March 4th for \$.20 vending. In the event that ingredient costs require further price adjustments, this agreement may be renegotiated by mutual consent.

This contract contemplates that the Ex-Students' Association will contract with the Bottler to furnish and service vending machines on the campus, and any such agreements shall be approved by The University of Texas at Austin prior to execution. This amendment became effective August 16, 1974 and will terminate December 20, 1974. All other terms and conditions not hereby amended are to remain in full force and effect.



HISTORY

The health branches of the University include the System School of Nursing (with campus units in Austin, El Paso, Fort Worth, Galveston, Houston, and San Antonio), the System Cancer Center (which includes M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute), the Medical Branch at Galveston, and Health Science Center at Dallas, San Antonio, and Houston. The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston includes a Medical School, a Dental Branch, a School of Public Health, a School of Allied Health Sciences, a Speech and Hearing Institute, and a Division of Continuing Education, as well as the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences.

It became a unit of the Health Science Center in Houston in 1972. A Center for Medical Genetics was created in 1971, a Center for Demographic and Population Genetics in 1972, and a Sensory Sciences Center in 1973. The School is responsible for graduate programs leading to the Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees in biomedical sciences.

2nd paragraph, 5th sentence, p. 16: However; the faculty as a whole has recognized the existence of special excellence in breadth and depth in certain research areas by encouraging the formation of studies groups. However, the faculty as a whole has recognized the existence of special excellence in breadth and depth in certain research areas by encouraging the formation of programs in biomathematics, biophysics, biochemistry, cell and molecular biology, human genetics, physiology, reproductive biology, pathology, and pharmacology.

Delete last paragraph on page 16 and first two paragraphs on page 17 and substitute the following:

Approximately one-half of the Graduate Faculty was, and still is, located at the cancer research facility, The University of Texas System Cancer Center, whose principal element is the M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute. M. D. Anderson is a 300 bed hospital (currently expanding to 600) and a research institute with over 100 full-time clinical faculty members and over 80 full-time basic science faculty members. Students in the Graduate School have worked in its laboratories in biomathematics, biophysics, biochemistry, cell and molecular biology, human genetics, pathology, and pharmacology.

Within the Health Science Center a group of more than 20 faculty members from the Dental Branch, which includes the Dental School and the Dental Sciences Institute, hold joint appointments in the Graduate School and have supervised thesis research in biochemistry, cell and molecular biology, physiology, pathology, and pharmacology. Graduate students may also register for courses offered by the Dental School. Several students in the Graduate School have previously been awarded the D.D.S. degree.

The Graduate School has benefited too from the arrival at the new (1969) University of Texas Medical School at Houston of faculty members who are jointly appointed to the Graduate School. Faculty participation is particularly important for the Graduate School's programs in biochemistry, cell and molecular biology, human genetics, physiology and reproductive biology, pharmacology, and neurosciences. The two schools cooperate to offer a combined M.D./Ph.D. program, utilizing the experience gained by the Graduate School in awarding Ph.D. degrees to students who had previously earned the M.D. degree. Students in each school may register for courses in the other.

3rd paragraph, 1st sentence, p. 17: The-School-of-Public-Health, established-in-1967,-awards-Ph.B.-and-B.B.H.-degrees-in-public-health. The School of Public Health, established in 1967, awards advanced degrees in public health.

4th paragraph, 3rd sentence, p. 17: Its-staff-of-more-than-70-professionals currently-includes-more-than-ten-individuals-who-may-supervise-thesis research-on-the-basis-of-their-joint-appointments-in-the-Graduate-School of-Biomedical-Sciences- Its staff of more than 70 professionals currently includes some eight individuals who participate as faculty members in the Graduate School's programs in biochemistry, pharmacology, and neurosciences.

lst paragraph, lst sentence, p. 18: Two such areas have been identified to date: medical human genetics and neural sciences. The-talents-already available-in-these-areas-in-the-other-institutions-are-being-supplemented by-key-faculty-appointees-to-the-Graduate-School, who-will-work-closely with-colleagues-in-the-other-institutions.--The-new-Genter-for-Medical Genetics-is-already-benefitting-from-the-cooperation-of-other-institutions-in-The-Texas-Medical-Genter, notably-M.-D.-Anderson-and-the-new Medical-School.--The-new-Genter-for-Demographic-and-Population-Genetics will-operate-in-close-conjunction-with-the-School-of-Publie-Health. The Medical Genetics Center benefits from the cooperation of other institutions in The Texas Medical Center, notably M. D. Anderson and the new Medical School. The Center for Demographic and Population Genetics operates in close conjunction with the School of Public Health. Members of the Sensory Sciences Center collaborate particularly with faculty members from the Medical School and Baylor College of Medicine.

Revision of Offices, Classrooms and Laboratories

2nd sentence, p. 18: As suggested above, the research laboratories available to students in The Texas Medical Center for the conduct of teaching and major investigative activities are among the richest educational resources for graduate training in the United States.

2nd sentence, p. 19: There are more than $\frac{125,000}{120,000}$ books and bound journals, as well as $\frac{2500}{3200}$ current scientific journals periodicals and other serials on file in the Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center Library and in the institutional collections within the Center. GRADUATE PROGRAMS AND DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

(M.S.)-Ph.D. Program

Delete 22-25 and the first half of page 26. Substitute the following:

Students aspiring to the Ph.D. degree are enrolled in the (M.S.)-Ph.D. program. In general such students will write a master's thesis and receive the M.S. degree in the course of their progress toward the Ph.D. degree. It is hoped that all students in this program will continue to the Ph.D. degree. Taking the M.S. degree permits the student to gain valuable experience in scientific writing and to assess the suitability of the problem area for a doctoral dissertation. Students, particularly those admitted with a post-baccalaureate degree, may petition to by-pass the master's degree. The overall purpose of the (M.S.)-Ph.D. program is to prepare students for research and teaching careers in biomedical sciences. In fact, a majority of those who have completed their Ph.D. degrees in the School, and who are not currently in postdoctoral training, are members of medical or dental faculties.

The objectives of the Ph.D. program are twofold: (1) broad awareness of the content and problems of the biomedical sciences, and (2) ability to produce new knowledge in a particular area of these sciences. The formal steps which acknowledge the accomplishment of these goals are (1) a written candidacy examination covering breadth of knowledge, (2) an oral candidacy examination on the Ph.D. dissertation proposal and knowledge related to it, (3) approval of a completed Ph.D. dissertation, and (4) presentation of a public seminar covering the dissertation research.

The program for the entering student consists of course work and of research laboratory experience in the form of tutorial laboratories. Course work is entirely elective but will in general be selected for preparation for the two candidacy examinations. Courses in such areas as biochemistry, biophysics, biomathematics, molecular biology, cell biology, and physiology are intended to provide the broad background desired of the School's students and tested for by the written candidacy examination. In addition, the student is urged to take courses designed to prepare him for advanced work in a particular field. These fields include the following: biochemistry, biomathematics, biophysics, cell biology, genetics, molecular biology, neurosciences, pathology, pharmacology, and physiology.

Tutorial laboratory experience is required of all students. For each of three quarters, the first year student works in a different faculty laboratory on a half-time basis. This assignment provides the student with experience on a research problem, as well as helping in the definition of an area of interest for dissertation research. In the process, a variety of techniques can be learned.

School-wide seminars intended to provide a broad perspective for the student are provided on a regular basis and are attended by students in all years. A majority of these is presented by visiting lecturers from throughout the nation.

In subsequent years, the student's program includes elective courses and thesis or dissertation research. No candidacy examinations are required for the M.S. degree, although a final oral examination conducted by the student's advisory committee on the thesis research is required. The written Ph.D. candidacy examination may be taken during any year. The oral Ph.D. candidacy examination is given only if the student has passed the written Ph.D. candidacy examination and has completed the M.S. degree program, unless that degree is not required of a student. The Ph.D. oral cnadidacy examination is administered by a committee suggested by the student and his advisory committee and is approved by the Academic Standards Committee.

During the first year, the student has a faculty advisor and an advisor from the Office of the Dean, and before the end of the first year, he has an advisory committee. The advisors and the composition of the advisory committee may change from time to time. The advisors and the committee will aid the student in selection of courses and tutorial laboratories, in preparation for candidacy examinations and in supervision of research. The student and his/her committee are expected to meet at least quarterly. Course requirements are determined by the individual student's committee, with approval of the Academic Standards Committee. Following the oral candidacy examination, the student's supervising committee is selected and approved. The supervising committee then ascertains the need for further course work and approves the dissertation research. Once this formal program of work is formally approved the student is admitted to candidacy for the Ph.D. degree. The Ph.D. program is completed when the supervisory committee approves the dissertation and the student presents a public seminar on the dissertation research.

Special-Master-of-Science-Degree-Programs Master of Science Degree Programs Revision of:

The Graduate Faculty has designed Master of Science programs in the areas of medical physics and nuclear medicine. The Graduate Faculty has designed three-Master of Science programs in the areas of biological ultrastructure, medical physics, and nuclear medicine. Each program is administered by a standing committee which is responsible for admissions, funding, teaching, and finally advising the Dean when a student has satisfied all requirements for the degree. Each program is administered by a standing committee of the Faculty.

The-M.S.-program-of-work-will-consist-of-the-usual-45-quarter hours-of-pertinent-work-of-which-no-more-than-nine-quarter-hours-may be-counted-as-"thesis"--The-list-of-courses-and-description-of-the proposed-thesis-research, -when-approved-by-the-advisory-committee, -is submitted-as-a-formal-petition-to-candidacy-for-the-masteris-degree program.--When-signed-by-the-Dean,-the-advisory-committee-automatically becomes-the-offical-supervising-committee.--The-request-form-for-the final-oral-examination-should-be-submitted-to-the-Office-of-the-Dean along-with-the-correct-title-and-brief-resume-of-the-thesis-no-later than-two-weeks-prior-to-the-date-of-the-scheduled-final-oral-examination. The-date-of-the-final-oral-examination-should-be-scheduled-at-least three-weeks-before-the-elose-of-the-Spring-Quarter. The M.S. program of work will consist of a minimum of 45 quarter hours of pertinent work of which no more than nine quarter hours may be counted as "thesis." Credit hours registered as research may not be counted in the program, nor may credit be given for courses which the student has passed by examination. When approved by the Chairman of the Standing Committee for the special master's program, the advisory committee automatically becomes the official Supervising Committee. The request for the final oral examination should be submitted to the Office of the Dean along with the correct title and a brief resume of the thesis no later than two weeks prior to the date of the scheduled final oral examination. The date of the final oral examination should be scheduled at least three weeks before the close of the Spring Quarter.

Elective Courses

Practical Experience: In addition to taking course work, the student will participate as a fellow or research assistant at The University of Texas <u>System Cancer Center</u> M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute at Houston in some capacity suitable to his background and interests.

Delete last paragraph on page 30. No substitutions. 1st paragraph, 1st sentence, p. 31:

Physicians and basic scientists will serve as fellows or research assistants in the Departments of Medicine or Physics, where they will participate in the research and development of the physical and chemical aspects of radionuclide studies in patients.

All trainees will spend time in the Radiopharmaceutical Laboratory at The University of Texas System Cancer Center M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute at Houston learning procedures for the development and preparation of radiopharmaceuticals for use in animals and humans.

Numerous fellowships are available to those who qualify for admission.

Individual Master of Science Degree Programs

Delete the section in present catalogue and substitute the following:

General admission may be granted an applicant so that he/she may take graduate courses for credit. The application should consist of a transcript of previous college work, a letter from the applicant stating his/her reasons for desiring admission, and a letter of reference (from the supervisor if the applicant is an employee of The University of Texas System). Upon admission a member of the faculty may help the student develop an individual M.S. degree program and to select two other faculty members to serve as an advisory committee. When formalized as a list of pertinent graduate courses amounting to a minimum of 36 quarter hours of credit and as a description of the proposed thesis research, the committee may petition the Dean for admission into candidacy for the M.S. degree program. Upon the advice of the Admissions Committee and the Academic Standards Committee, the Dean may approve the proposal whereupon the student's advisory committee will become the official supervisory committee.

Vocational Rehabilitation

Admission Procedures

Delete section in present catalogue and substitute the following:

The chairmen of the standing committees for the special master's degree programs will admit students into their respective programs upon the advice of the Admissions Committee. The Associate Dean will admit all students into the (M.S.)-Ph.D. program or into individual master's programs upon the advice of the Admissions Committee. The Associate Dean may grant general admission (non-degree status) to an applicant.

Deletion of Admission on a Non-Degree (General Admission) Basis. There are no substitutions.

Classification of a Non-Resident

Delete section in present catalogue and substitute the following:

A non-resident student is a student who has not resided in the State of Texas for one year or more before becoming a full-time or degree student. A student who is employed half-time or more at the time of registration, whose work is related to his/her graduate program, may pay tuition at resident rates. A student also qualifies for resident tuition rates when his/her spouse is employed by a State institution of higher learning or when he/she marries a legal resident of the State.

Each student follows the procedures described under his degree program. Each student completes degree requirements in accordance with the catalogue in effect at the time he/she is admitted to a degree program in the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, or, should he/she choose, the catalogue of any subsequent year in which he/she is in residence.

Revision of Residence

Delete first paragraph on page 40 and substitute the following:

In absentia registration is an arrangement made by the candidate's advisory committee for him/her to complete any portion of his/her degree program off campus. When a student is not enrolled on the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences campus, but taking a course for credit at another institution, he/she will be charged a nominal In absentia fee.

New last paragraph: The student's advisory committee, subject to the approval of the Academic Standards Committee, may include in the Program of Work all courses taken at an appropriately accredited college or university which in their opinion are of graduate level and directly related to the research program of the student.

Minimum and Maximum Course Load

Delete section in present catalogue and substitute the following:

The normal maximum course load for a graduate student is fifteen quarter hours; registration for more than fifteen quarter hours must have the special consent of the Associate Dean and will be permitted only under exceptional circumstances. A minimum course load for a student to be classified as a full-time student is twelve quarter hours. In the terminal portion of the degree program, the student will be considered a full-time student if he/she is registered for the master's thesis research (0.91.3) or Ph.D. dissertation (0.92.3) and the Perspectives Seminars in Biomedical Sciences (0.71.0).

Revision of Grades and Grade Point Averages

Delete 2nd sentence, p.40: In-some-courses,-e.g.-most-seminars,-the standard-grading-system-is-not-practicable,-and-in-these-eredit-is designated-as-pass-(P)-or-fail-(F). Substitute: The standard grading system will be employed on all courses in which credit will be included in a degree program, with the exception of seminars which will receive a pass or fail grade.

Revise 3rd sentence, p.41: Under unusual circumstances the student may apply, through his instructor, for one quarter extension of the X period, which can be granted by the Graduate-Administrator Associate Dean.

Continuation in the Graduate School

Delete section in present catalogue and substitute the following:

Students should not expect to be permitted to remain in a degree program if either low course grades or poor research effort continues for two successive quarters. Upon completion of the M.S. portion of their program, students who fail to receive an endorsement for their continuation in the Ph.D. program from their supervising committees will be subject for readmission into the Ph.D. program in competition with current applicants. Students who are not readmitted may continue on a non-degree basis.

Thesis and Dissertation

Delete section in present catalogue and substitute the following:

Once eligible, the student should register for thesis (0.91.3) or dissertation (0.92.3) for three quarters. Credit hours are given only after completion of the final quarter of both thesis and dissertation.

Time Limits

Delete section in present catalogue and substitute the following:

The M.S. degree program is usually completed by full-time students within two calendar years. A student should complete all requirements for the Ph.D. degree within two calendar years after admission to candidacy. All time computations are based on four quarters per calendar year.

In actual practice, the first year student is usually hired as a research technician on a half-time basis during his/her tutorial laboratory experiences and receives in the vicinity of \$330 per month, which (after taxes) makes his income comparable to that of a scholarship or fellowship fund. Only degree program students are eligible to receive scholarship or fellowship funds.

Employees of The University of Texas System are encouraged to take graduate courses pertinent to their work. They must have the approval of their supervisors and apply to the Dean for general admission. They may enroll for three quarter hours of course work and still be paid for a full 40-hour week. If registered for four or more hours of course work, the sum of the number of course hours plus the hours paid for per week cannot exceed 40. Students will participate in research laboratories in the medical center for an equivalent of five afternoons per week throughout the year. The student, in consul-

per week throughout the year. The student, in consultation with his faculty sponsoring committee, will select the research areas which best support his educational program. Students spend one quarter in each of three laboratories and at least one of the sessions should be in laboratories outside the major areas of specialization.

- 0.91.3 Thesis for Master of Science. Graduate Faculty. 3 qtr. hrs. each quarter. All quarters annually. Enrollment for three quarters required for M.S. degree. Nine quarter hours credit given at end of terminal quarter.
- 0.92.3 Dissertation for Doctor of Philosophy. Graduate Faculty. 3 qtr. hrs. each quarter. All quarters annually. Enrollment for three quarters required for Ph.D. degree. Nine quarter hours credit given at end of terminal quarter.
- 1. COURSE OFFERINGS IN BIOMATHEMATICS
 - 1.01.4 Biomedical Statistics I. Johnston. 4 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. Prerequisite: Calculus.

This course provides an introduction to the construction and use of statistical models and statistical methods in biology. Heavy emphasis is placed on computation using the digital computer through the use of general interactive programming packages. Emphasis is also placed on fundamental statistical inference as applied to problems in the life sciences.

1.02.3 Biomedical Statistics II. Johnston. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: 1.01.4 or equivalent. A second course in statistical methods. Problems of a practical nature are to be performed principally using a digital computer with existing statistical programs, subroutines, and packages. Topics discussed include: oneway, two-way, and multi-way designs, multiple comparison tests, nested designs, analysis of covariance, multiple regression, polynomial regression, step-wise regression, analysis of counting data, and analysis of survival data. Elementary Mathematical Methods for the Bioscientist. Thames. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite:

Calculus.

A course designed to introduce the student to applied methods (non-statistical) that will be beneficial in his research. Brief review of some useful topics from differential and integral calculus; emphasis placed on gaining practical knowledge of linear algebra and differential equations. Applications to include modeling of hormonal naturation data, etc.

1.11.3 Introduction to Mathematical Biology. Zimmerman. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisites: Advances calculus, two years college physics, general biology, and consent of instructor.

Diffusion permeability, active transport, and membrane theory with biological applications, cell growth and multiplication. Mathematics of the circulatory system, Windkessel and pulse-pressure models.

Mathematical Statistics. George. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. Prerequisite: Calculus, 1.01.4 or equivalent. An introduction to the mathematical background underlying commonly used statistical methods. Topics discussed include: Functions of random variables and their probability distributions, introductory theory of point and interval estimation, experimental design, non-parametric methods of inference and multivariate analysis.

Statistical Methods for Survival Time Studies. Gehan. 4 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: 1.01.4 or consent of instructor.

Characterizing survival time distribution: The probability density function, hazard function, survivorship function. Non-parametric methods of estimating survival function: life table and product-limit methods of Kaplan and Meier. Parametric forms of survival time distribution and associated methods of estimation: exponential, Weibull, gamma, log-normal. Comparing survival time distributions by Wilcoxon, chi-square and other types of tests. Clinical trials for comparing survival time distributions: Bayesian and non-Bayesian methods.

Mathematical Models in Cell Kinetics. Brown. 3 qtr. hrs. 1.14.3 Fall annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

An introduction to mathematical models useful in describing the kinetic activity of cell populations. Both deterministic and stochastic models are considered.

Seminar in Biomathematics. Biomathematics Faculty and Guest Lecturers. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Spring annually. 1.71.1

2. COURSE OFFERINGS IN BIOPHYSICS, MEDICAL PHYSICS, AND NUCLEAR MEDICINE

- 2.01.3 Physical Methods in Biology I. Corry. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall Annually. Prerequisite: Entrance requirements. Radioactivity and Tracer Techniques, Spectroscopy, and Microscopy.
- 2.02.3 Physical Methods in Biology II. Ansevin. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: Entrance requirements. 2.01.3 suggested but not required. Principles and pplications of: Chromatography; electrophoresis; centrifugation, diffusion, viscosity;

cell and particle separations; electrochemistry of pH and ion activity measurements.

2.03.3 Basic Electronics and Instrumentation I. Zermeno. 3 qtr. hrs. (2 lec., 1 lab per wk) Fall annually. Taken as a series beginning with I.

> This quarter consists of a complete review of DC and AC circuits making use of passive elements. An introduction to the semi-conductive theory of Diode action is presented along with their use in power supply design.

Basic Electronics and Instrumentation II. Zermeno. 3 qtr. hrs. (2 lec., 1 lab per wk) Winter annually. Taken as a series beginning with I. An introduction to vacuum tubes and transistor action is

presented in this quarter. The basic circuit configurations of these active elements are arranged by means of equivalent circuits. Amplifier stages are then combined to form complete systems with examples of their application in medical instrumentation.

Physics of Radionuclides and Muclear Medicine I. Jahns. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

A study of the basic nature of radioactivity, radiation process, and the interaction of radiation with matter. The dosimetry of unsealed radioactivity in the human is introduced. Laboratory experiments covering the measurement of radioactivity as used in nuclear medicine studies is included. *Physics of Radionuclides and Nuclear Medicine II*. Jahns. 2 atr brs. Winter annually Prerequisite: Differential

2 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: Differential and integral calculus or consent of instructor.

A study of the theory and practice of the measurement of radioactivity in humans, including the problems related to collimation, detection of radiation, and image formation. *Radiation Biology*, Mayn, Humphrey, 2 atr. brs. Winter

Radiation Biology. Meyn, Humphrey. 2 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. Fundamentals of radiation biology for students of medical physics and residents in radiology and radiotherapy.

2.11.3 Radiation Detection Instrumentation and Data Analysis. Smith. 3 qtr. hrs. (2 lec., 1 lab per wk) Spring annually.

Characteristics and applications of charged particle, photon, and neutron detectors and associated analysis equipment.

2.12.2

Medical Radiation Protection. van Roosenbeek. 2 qtr. hrs. (1 lec., 1 lab per wk) Winter annually. Lectures and discussions of radiation protection of hospital personnel and patients, and means of reducing the exposure. Discussion of Federal and State Regulations pertaining to x-ray machines, therapy equipment and the use of sealed and unsealed sources. Laboratory work in the design of x-ray rooms, handling and storage facilities for sealed sources and cobalt therapy rooms. Discussion and laboratory work in the protection survey of x-ray, and therapy machines and rooms. Calibration of survey equipment, record keeping, wipe tests, leak tests, disposal and decontamination are discussed and demonstrated.

2.13.2

Physics of Diagnostic Radiology. Zermeno. 2 qtr. hrs. (1 lec., 1 lab per wk) Winter annually.

Production and characteristics of diagnostic x-ray beams, factors affecting production of radiographic images, survey or specialized techniques used in Diagnostic Radiology, Dosimetry.

2.14.9

External Beam, Interstitial, and Intracavitary Dosimetry; Principles and Applications. Shalek, Sampiere, and Stovall. 9 qtr. hrs. Summer annually.

Lectures and practical tutorial concerning the calculation, by hand and by computer, of the radiation distribution obtained with fixed-open beams, wedged fields, large irregularly shaped fields, rotational therapy and interstitial and intracavitary applications. The course will also contain labs on the instrumentation and measuring techniques applied to the accurate determination of the physical parameters which determine therapeutic radiation dose.

2.15.2 Introduction to Nuclear Medicine. Haynie. 2 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. Underlying principles of nuclear medicine are covered with emphasis on anatomical and physiological basis for the clinical applications of radiopharmaceuticals. This course covers both diagnostic (physiological function testing and radionuclide imaging) and therapeutic uses. It is designed for physicians and basic scientists interested in obtaining a broad overview of this medical specialty.

- 2.16.3 Principles of Radiopharmaceuticals I. Glenn. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. A course combining the principles of radiation and pharmacy in radiopharmaceuticals for nuclear medicine. Selected topics of radiation physics and tracer concepts. Methods of production of radionuclides and the manufacture, formulation, quality control, and survey of radiopharmaceuticals in use.
- 2.17.3 Principles of Radiopharmaceuticals II. Glenn. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: 2.16.3 or consent of instructor.

A course combining the principles of radiation and pharmacy in radiopharmaceuticals for nuclear medicine. Chemistry, purification, stability and pharmacodynamics of radiopharmaceuticals. <u>In-vitro</u> testing and investigative new drug procedures.

2.21.2 Atomic and Solid State Physics. Smith. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall annually.

A study of atomic, molecular, and solid state physics using the concepts of quantum theory. This course provides an understanding of systems that will interact with radiation fields as studied in Advanced Radiation Physics.

2.22.2 *Muclear Physics*. Grant. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. A study of nuclear structure, radioactive decay

mechanisms, particle accelerators, nuclear reactions and nuclear spectroscopy.

2.23.2 Theory of Imaging. Hevezi. 2 qtr. hrs. Spring 1974-1975 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

Application of Fourier optics to imaging methods in Radiology including discussion of image forming devices such as film, TV systems, and new storage media. Ultrasonic and thermographic imaging techniques are presented. Laboratory demonstrations illustrating principles. Physics of Radiotherapy. Shalek. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall

2.24.2

annually. A survey of dosimetry protocols and a study of new or advanced dosimetry techniques.

- 2.25.2 Advanced Radiation Physics I. Almond. 2 qtr. hrs. (1 lec., 1 lab per wk) Winter 1975-1976 and alternate years.
- 2.26.2 Advanced Radiation Physics II. Almond. 2 qtr. hrs. (1 lec., 1 lab per wk) Spring 1975-1976 and alternate years.

A study of the properties and measurement of electromagnetic and particulate radiation. A special lab will be held.

- Special Topics in Biophysics. Cole. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall 2.63.3 1976 annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. Concepts and methods utilized in biophysics which are of interest to the biomedical scientist will be discussed.
- 2.64.2 Special Topics in Radiation Biology. Hewitt, Humphrey, Meyn. 2 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: Familiarity with biophysics.
- Special Topics in Medicine for Physicist. Zermeno and 2.65.1
- Staff. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Winter, Spring annually. Seminor in Biophysics. Meyn. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Winter 2.71.1 annually.
- 2.72.1 Seminar in Medical Physics. Almond. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Winter, Spring annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

Lectures by staff, students and visiting personnel on subjects of current interest in medical physics.

2.73.1 Seminar in Isotopes and Nuclear Medicine. Haynie. 1 qtr. hr. All quarters annually.

Discussion of literature regarding fundamentals and applications of radionuclides in medicine.

3. COURSE OFFERINGS IN BIOCHEMISTRY

> Human Intermedidary Metabolism. DeMoss and Staff. 4 qtr. 3.01.4 hrs. Fall annually.

> > A course including lectures, small group conferences and clinical correlation conferences which covers the pathways of energy generation, energy storage and interconversion, and turnover of important biomolecules in the human body. This course represents one half of the Biochemistry-Molecular Biology course offered to first year medical students.

3.02.2 Enzymology I. Orengo, Dowhan, Burleigh, Furlong, Lazzari. 2 qtr. hrs. Winter annually.

This course provides a basic introduction to the principles and practice of enzyme purification and assay. Emphasis is on the practical aspects, but whenever the occasion arises, theory will be properly treated. The course is divided into the following sections: Enzyme assay, purification, kinetics, cofactors and structure. The student will be provided with a booklet of graphs, tables, and references.

Quantitative Biochemistry. Furlong. 2 qtr. hrs. Spring 3.04.2 annually. Prerequisite: Physical Chemistry and/or consent of instructor.

Problems and subjects will be selected, in part, by the class, from among the following areas: equilibrium, stiochiometry (buffers, pH, redox reactions, Emf., Binding constants, etc.), kinetics (activation energy, enzymes, inhibitors, diffusion, etc.), information theory applied to nucleic acids and proteins, electronic structure of biochemicals, instrumental analysis (column chromatography, gradient centrifugation, spectrophotometry, tracer analysis, etc.) equilibrium and steady state applications of energy functions, use of computer capabilities in data analysis, and reduction. Other similar areas of general interest could also be considered and an opportunity can be provided for individual projects and reports on special topics.

3.05.3 Amino Acids, Peptides and Proteins. Lazzari. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter 1974-1975 and alternate years.

> The historical development, intermediary metabolism, physiological importance, purification and chemical analysis of this group of compounds.

3.06.3 *Nucleotides and Nucleic Acids*. Hurlbert. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter 1974-1975 and alternate years, Prerequisite: Biochemistry.

The chemistry, enzymology and biosynthesis of nucleotides and polynucleotides.

3.07.3 Carbohydrate Chemistry. Walborg. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall annually.

Chemistry and biochemistry of mono- and oligosaccharides. Chemistry and biochemistry of polysaccharides. Chemistry and biochemistry of peptidoglycans, glycoproteins and glycolipids.

3.08.4 Introduction to Steroid Biochemistry, Tcholakian, 4 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

A general course introducing the students to steroid structure and nomenclature, steroid biosynthesis and metabolism with special emphasis on androgen, estrogen and corticoid metabolism.

3.11.2

Chromatography. McGregor. 2 qtr. hrs. (1 lec., 1 lab per wk). Winter 1975-1976 and alternate years. The history, classification and theory of ion-

exchange, paper, column, thin-layer and gas chromatography. Discussion of molecular sieve filtration, ion exclusion, ligand exchange, electrochromatography and partition chromatography.

3.12.2 Membrane Biochemistry. DeMoss, Dowhan, Strobel. 2 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: Elementary biochemistry or its equivalent.

A course covering topics on the structure, function, biogenesis, and metabolism of cellular membranes and their components. Topics will vary each year with students expected to read, discuss and critically evaluate assigned papers from the original literature.

3.14.3

Biochemistry of Cancer. Griffin. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter 1974-1975 and alternate years.

Recent advances in experimental carcinogenesis, including chemical changes in tissues or organs during cancer induction, and metabolism of malignant tissues, tumor-host relations, and cancer chemotherapy.

3.15.2

Action of Antimetabolites. Moore. 2 qtr. hrs. Winter 1975-1976 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

The role and biochemical basis of antimetabolite action in chemotherapy, with particular emphasis on cancer

chemotherapy and on inhibition of enzymes.

3.16.3 *Clinical Chemistry*. Broughton. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall Annually. Prerequisite: One general graduate course in Biochemistry.

> Instruction in basic clinical instrumentation including spectrophotometry, automation, blood gas analysis, immunochemistry, enzymology, and toxicology. Correlation of results with clinical diagnosis and management of patients. Basic quality control systems and clinical laboratory management will be included.

- 3.71.1 Seminar in Biochemistry. Hurlbert. 1 qtr. hr. Winter, Spring annually.
- 3.72.1 Seminar in Intermediary Metabolism. Johnson. 1 qtr. hr. Fall annually.
- 4. COURSE OFFERINGS IN CELLULAR, MOLECULAR, AND DEVELOPMENTAL BIOLOGY
 - 4.01.3 Cell Biology. Rao. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisites: Biochemistry, genetics, or consent of instructor,

A study of the structure, function and reproduction of cells and cell organelles.

4.02.3 *Molecular Biology*. Blatti and Staff. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: A course in biochemistry or equivalent.

This course is to serve as an initial advanced course in molecular biology. Topics such as polynucleotide structure, chromatin structure, DNA replication, control of transcription and translation, molecular virology, viral carcinogenesis, etc. will be presented and discussed.

4.03.2 Microbial Biochemistry and Physiology. Goldschmidt. 2 qtr. hrs. Winter annually.

Relationship between structure and function in various microbial systems.

4.04.3 *Microbial Genetics*. Matney. 3 qtr. hrs. (2 lec., l lab per wk). Summer annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

A study of the molecular basis of heredity and the processes involved in expression of genetic material and requisite control mechanisms.

4.05.3 Developmental Biology. D. Wright. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually.

Early embryonic development will be discussed including gametogenesis, fertilization, cleavage, and morphogenetic movements. The interactions of nucleus and cytoplasm, cells and tissues in the processes of cellular differentiation and morphogenesis will be discussed in terms of experimental evidence.

4.06.3 *Virology I.* Dmochowski and Bowen. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually.

Virology with emphasis on the nature of viruses and on virus-host cell interaction, biochemistry of virus replication.

4.07.3 Virology II. Dmochowski and Bowen. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: 4.06.3

Continuation of Virology I with emphasis on viral oncology, molecular and immunological aspects of virus host relationship.

4.08.3 Immunology I. Richie and Staff. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall annually.

This lecture and seminar series presents basic concepts in humoral and cellular immunology. The topics to be covered will include: development and dichotomy of the immune system, immunoglobulin structure, antigenicity, antigen-antihody reactions, complement, primary and secondary immune responses, memory, cells involved in the immune response, theories of antibody formation. Selected topics will include laboratory demonstrations and discussion periods involving student participation.

4.09.3

Immunology II. Richie and Staff. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: 4.08.3 or consent of instructor. This lecture and seminar series will be an extension of Immunology I. The topics to be stressed will include: cellular cooperation in the immune response, cell surface antigen receptors, immunogenetics, transplantation immunity, graft-versus-host reactions, tumor immunity, immunological tolerance and enhancement, immuno-suppression, autoimmunity, immune complex disease, allergy, im~ mune deficiency diseases, and immunity to bacterial, viral and fungal infections. Student participation in disucssion periods will be emphasized.

4.11.2

Tissue and Cell Culture I. Arrighi. 2 qtr. hrs. (1 lec., 1 lab per wk). Winter annually. Class limited to maximum of 4 students. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. This course covers the principles and practices of

tissue and cell culture, photomicrography, cinematography, autoradiography and related technique. Tissue and Cell Culture II. Arrighi. 2 qtr. hrs. (1 lec.,

- 4.12.2 1 lab per wk). Spring annually. Class limited to maximum of 4 students. Prerequisite: 4.11.2.
- Continuation of 4.11.2 (must be taken in series). Cellular Ultrastructure. Miller. 3 qtr. hrs. (2 lec., 4.13.3 1 lab per wk). Fall annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

Electron microscopy of normal, malignant, and virus infected tissues with emphasis on thin sectioning techniques, emphasizing methodology and interpretation. Course consists of lectures plus special demonstration and laboratory tutorials.

4.14.3 The Reproductive Cycle of Cells. Stubblefield. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring 1975 and alternate years.

An advanced study of the cell cycle with emphasis on cultured mammalian cells. Students will learn how to use CELLSIM in the analysis of cell cycle problems.

The Organization of Eukaryotic Chromosomes. Stubblefield. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring 1976 and alternate years. Prerequisite:

4.01.3 or equivalent.

An advanced study on the molecular arrangement of the mammalian genome with a review of current theories and experimental data.

Current Research in Molecular Genetics. Matney and Staff. 4.17.3 3 qtr. hrs. Prerequisite: Biochemistry and consent of instructor.

Prokaryotes: mutations and their consequences, regulation, suppression, genetic manipulation, speciation and isozymes; Eukaryotes: suppression, use of isozymes (mutagenesis, somatic cell genetics, genetic distance between forms, markers for cancer studies), experimental manipulation of vertebrate genomes in vivo, nuclear-cytoplasmic interactions, regulatory genes affecting morphogenesis and macromolecular synthesis, expression of enzyme phenotypes in hybrid embryos.

4.18.2 Recent Advances in Cancer Virology. Priori. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall, Winter annually.

Lectures and discussions of recent advances in cancer virology, including current virological, biochemical and immunological studies, particularly emphasizing human

tumors. This course provides the student with an introduction to the current trends in oncogenic virus research. Selected Topics in Molecular Biology. Saunders and Pfaffen-

- 4.63.3 Selected Topics in Molecular Biology. Saunders and Pfaffenberger. 3 qtr. hrs. Fail Annually. Gene structure and function, recent advances in genetic transcription and translation.
- 4.64.3 Selected Topics in Molecular Virology. Arlinghaus. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: Molecular Biology. Virology.

This course will be at the level of advanced molecular virology. It will include RNA and DNA viruses both tumor and non-tumor types. The structure and replication of these viruses will be discussed.

4.65.2 Selected Topics in Cell Biology. Hsu and Staff. 2 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: 4.01.3 or equivalent.

Two or three currently active areas in cell biology will be chosen each quarter for presentation and discussion by a single lecturer in a three to five week period. May be taken repeatedly.

- 4.71.1 Seminar in Cell Biology. Hsu. 1 qtr. hrs. Fall, Winter Spring annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.
- 4.72.1 Seminar in Molecular Biology. Mandel. 1 qtr. hr. Fall annually. Prerequisite: General Bacteriology or Microbiology.

The diversity of microbes, their natures, special attributes and relations.

- 4.74.1 Seminar in Microbial Physiology. Goldschmidt. 1 qtr. hr. Winter annually.
- 4.75.1 Seminar in Microbial Genetics. Matney. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Winter, Spring annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. (Interinstitutional Seminar in Molecular Biology.

A seminar given on Wednesday evenings at 7:30. Faculty and students from Rice, Baylor and the University of Houston participate. One speaker each evening gives open ended informal seminar on his research interest.

4.76.1 Seminar in Virology. Dmochowski. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Winter, Spring annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

Participation in Virology Department seminar program involving a 50 minute plus discussion of assigned lectures with instructor.

- 4.77.1 Seminar in Immunology and Immunochemistry. Schlamowitz. 1 qtr. hr. Fall 1974-1975 and alternate years. Prerequisite: immunology, biochemistry.
- 4.78.1 Seminar in Basic Immuno-Physiology of Allergic Disease. McGovern. 1 qtr. hr. Fall 1974-1975 and alternate years. The seminars first will review some of the basic concepts of immunology and then in more specific detail and in depth the immunology of hypersensitivity phenomena. Initially, this would include a basic understanding of antigens and antibodies in general and then in more specific detail the nature and action of reagenic or socalled sensitizing antibodies mediating the allergic diathesis. Along with the study of the immunological phenomena involved in the hypersensitivity reaction, will be discussed certain aspects of the physiologic mechanisms governing the allergic response.
- 4.79.2 Seminar in Developmental Biology. D. Wright. 2 qtr. hrs. Winter, Summer annually. Prerequisite: One course in embryology or 4.01.3

Recent research papers in developmental biology will be critically reviewed and discussed in terms of methods and relevance to major problems.

4.80.1 Seminar in Growth Kinetics of Normal and Malignant Cells. Drewinko. 1 qtr. hr. Spring annually. The student presentations will cover the cell cycle kinetics of normal and malignant tissues, biochemical events of the cell cycle, radiation and drug effects, mathematic modeling and current therapy trends relative to kinetics. Some of the topics will be presented by staff of M. D. Anderson Hospital who are experts in solid tumors and leukemia.

- 11. COURSE OFFERINGS IN HUMAN GENETICS.
 - 11.01.3 Human Genetics I. Schull. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. Study of heredity and variation through the description and counting of individuals. Course will stress enumeration of results obtained from various matings and the deductions to be drawn from such an enumeration rather than the study of the biochemical and morphogenetic processes controlled by genes. The aim is to describe and develop the processes whereby genes are located on chromosomes.
 - 11.02.3 *Human Genetics II.* Knudson. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: None, although elementary genetics knowledge assumed.

The human phenotype in health and disease as a function of genotype; Medelian disorders of man, particularly metabolic disease; interaction of heredity and environment; pharmacogenetics; infectious disease susceptibility; common diseases; somatic mutation, cancer, aging, and immunogenetics.

11.03.3

Human Genetics III. M. Shaw. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually.
 Prerequisite: One course in basic genetics.
 This course covers the human cytogenetics and somatic cell genetics. Topics include mitosis and meiosis, nomenclature,

sex determination, the Lyon hypothesis, numerical and structural abnormalities of the sex chromosomes and autosomes, mosaicism, heterochromatin, models of chromosome structure, chromosome breakage, somatic cell hybridization, cytogenetic methods of linkage studies, newborn and abortion surveys.

11.11.3 Population Genetics. Nei. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. Prerequisite: Some background in probability and statistics, and consent of instructor.

Human populations contain a large amount of genetic variability in both qualitative and quantitative characters. It is known that the amount of hidden deleterious genes and chromosomal variations is substantial. In the present course the basic principles of population genetics and their applications to human populations will be discussed. The topics to be covered are random mating population, inbreeding, genetics of quantitative characters, deterministic and stochastic changes of gene frequencies, mechanisms of maintenance of polymorphis and deleterious genes, genetic structure of populations, eugenics, etc.

11.12.3 Mathematical Models in Demographic and Population Genetics. Staff, Demographic and Population Genetics. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. May be repeated for credit.

The theory of demographic and population genetics requires a high level of mathematical knowledge. In this course advanced probability theories and statistical methods used in population genetics are presented. Mathematical theories of special topics such as inbreeding, densityand age-structure-dependent population genetic models, and segregation analysis will also be covered. In different years different topics may be discussed. Human Evolution. Weiss. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually.

11.13.3

The evidence for human evolution will be presented in the context of an integrated population biologic theory. First, long-term evolution will be considered by presenting the human fossil record in terms of what is known about primates, about primitive human societies, and from the archaeological record. Cultural and demographic evolution will be presented as integral parts of human evolutionary history. Second, micro-evolution of human populations will be considered by presenting the results of various studies among a variety of human populations. Topics will include migration, inbreeding, natural selection, and demographic aspects and these will be related to social structure as well as to "natural" factors. Relevant models from demography, population genetics, and population ecology will be presented and their link to actual data discussed. The strength of our knowledge of human evolution will be examined.

Seminar in Genetics and Population Biology. Nei. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Winter, Spring annually. Prerequisite: Second 11.71.1 year graduate standing or higher.

Presentation and analysis of individual topics of research.

Seminar in Human Cytological and Molecular Genetics. 11.72.1 Altenburg. 1 qtr. hr. Spring annually.

12. COURSE OFFERINGS IN PHYSIOLOGY, REPRODUCTIVE BIOLOGY, AND PATHOLOGY

12.01.4

Humoral Regulation of Organ Function. Preslock and Staff. 4 qtr. hrs. Fall annually.

The course will introduce students to the general subject of endocrine regulation of selected organ systems, such as the reproductive system and the gastrointestinal system. The emphasis will be upon the role played by hormones and tissue substances in the function of organs, such as the testes, the thyroid and the stomach; upon hormone interactions, such as releasing factors and negative feedback phenomena; and upon tissue substances important in transmitting humoral messages, such as cyclic AMP and mechanisms of organ function which are responsive to drugs and hormones will be considered.

Gastrointestinal Physiology I. Jacobson and Staff. 2 qtr. 12.02.2 hrs. Fall annually.

Gastrointestinal hormones; gastric secretion; pancreatic and biliary secretion; regulation of secretion; salivary secretion; gastroinestinal circulation; mucosal metabolism.

- Jacobson and Staff 12.03.2 Gastrointestinal Physiology II. 2 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Prostaglandins; membrane transport; lower esophageal
 - sphincter; gastric motility.
- Gastrointestinal Physiology III. Jacobson and Staff. 12.04.2

2 qtr. hrs. Spring annually.

Small intestinal motility; intestinal absorption of sodium; intestinal absorption of lipid; intestinal absorption of carbohydrates; intestinal absorption of amino acids; intestinal parasitology; gastrointestinal mucosal ultrastructure.

12.05.6

The Reproductive System. E. Steinberger. 6 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. (Month of November and the 1st week of December). A total of 100 contract hours will be scheduled at the rate of 4 hours daily (8-12am) for a period of 5 weeks. The student will be presented with didactic material and clinical demonstration. Prerequisite: 12.01.4 or equivalent.

This is a required course for sophomore medical students which is heavily oriented toward human reproductive biology. This is an interdisciplinary effort in the sense that morphologic, physiologic, biochemical and behavioral aspects are presented in an integrated manner. Preslock. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter

annually. A course in endocrinology in which the first and second quarter will be a basic, fundamental approach to endocrinology. Guest lecturers, who are experts in their respective areas, will be invited to participate.

12.07.3 Endocrinology II. Preslock. 3 atr. hrs. Spring annually.

Continuation of 12.06.3

Endocrinology I.

Human Histology. Mackay. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall or 12.08.2 Winter annually.

A systematic survey of the structure of the cells, tissues, and organs of the human body as revealed by light and electron microscopy, with emphasis on functional and pathological correlations.

Principles of Pathology. Levy. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall or Winter annually. Prerequisite: physiology, histology. The course is designed to present pathology as a dynamic continuity of biological function in health and disease. Presentation of details will be limited so as not to obscure the orientation towards basic principles.

- 12.11.x Advanced Mammalian Physiology. Hutchins and Staff. 1 qtr. hr. each partion. All quarters annually. Bone,Growth & Development - Summer annually. Ranly Cardiopulmonary System - Fall annually. McMahon & Pate Digestive System - Winter annually. Smith Renal, Electrolyte, and Fluid Balance - Winter annually. Hutchins
- Endocrinology Spring annually. Hutchins Advanced Reproductive Biology I. E. Steinberger. 5 qtr. 12.12.5 hrs. Fall annually. Prerequisite: steroid chemistry, endocrinology.

In depth study of the structure and function of the gonads. Current research directions. Didactic and laboratory experience.

Advanced Reproductive Biology II. E. Steinberger. 3 qtr. 12.13.3 hrs. Winter annually. Prerequisite: advanced reproductive biology I. In depth study of the reproductive system and its

control mechanisms. Molecular, cellular organismic and societal aspects of the control will be emphasized. Comparative Behavior of Vertebrates. Lloyd. 3 qtr. hrs. 12.14.3 Winter annually.

An examination of comparative behavior throughout the vertebrates, including man. Various aspects that would be dealth with would include instinct, learning, dominance formation and the development of animal societies, hormones and behavior, sexual behavior, aggression, and aspects of human behavior related to man and his physical and social environment. An ethological, sociological approach.

Experimental Pathology. Levy. Credit to be arranged. All quarters annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor. (Class limited)

The student will select a problem in experimental pathology. Seminars and reading assignments will be designed to assist the student in carrying out the laboratory and technical procedures necessary to explore the problem. A paper suitable for publication will complete the course.

- 12.71.1 Seminar in Physiology. Hutchins. 1 qtr. hr. Fall, Spring annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.
- 13. COURSE OFFERINGS IN PHARMACOLOGY
 - 13.01.3 General Pharmacology I. Robison and Staff. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter 1976 annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

An introduction to the basic principles which determine how chemical substances interact with biological systems, with emphasis on drug actions in man. Topics include factors which govern drug disposition, mechanisms of drug action, how drugs affect peripheral neuro-effector processes and how drugs alter function of the cardiovascular system.

13.02.3 General Pharmacology II. Robison and Staff. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring 1976 annually. Prerequisite: 13.01.3 or consent of instructor.

> Principles of pharmacology are applied to an examination of drug effects on the kidney, the gut, the uterus and the central nervous system. The toxicological aspects of chemicals are considered also. The neuropharmacology portion of this course corresponds to neuropharmacology portion of Neuroscience III.

13.03.3 General Pharmacology III. Robison and Staff. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall 1976 annually. Prerequisite: 13.02.3 or consent of instructor.

> Application of principles of pharmacology in an examination of the actions of natural and synthetic hormones, hormone antagonists, antimicrobial agents, antineoplastic agents, drugs which affect the components of blood and agents employed in vitamin therapy. Several legal and practical aspects of drug therapy are also discussed. Advanced Neurochemistry and Neuropharmacology. Ho. 2 qtr.

hrs. Spring 1975-1976 and alternate years. Prerequisite: organic chemistry and biochemistry.

Neurobiological Aspects of Biological Amines: Localization, function, biosynthesis and metabolism, uptake and release, regulatory mechanism. Neurochemical Agents affection Function of Nervous System: Inhibitor of enzyme systems, releasing, uptake blocking and receptor blocking agents. Central Biogenic Amine Pathways. Biochemical Basis of Psychopathological States: Schizophrenia, affective disorders and Parkinson's Disease. Mechanism of Action of Psychotherapeutic Agents.

13.12.2 Principles of Neuroeffector Drug Actions. Birks. 2 qtr. hrs. Spring 1974-1975 and alternate years. Discussion of the basic mechanism by which drugs alter functions of the body with emphasis on drugs which affect the central and peripheral nervous system. The dynamic interactions between drugs and receptors, graded responses to drugs, factors which influence access of drugs to their sites of action, effects of the body on drugs, drug toxicity, tolerance, and dependence will be examined.

13.13.3 Advanced Pharmacology I. Kroeger. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall annually.

Pharmacology of the integrative systems, nerve, muscle and endocrine.

13.14.3 Advanced Pharmacology II. Kroeger. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter annually.

Pharmacology of the supportive and defense systems, cardiovascular, respiratory, renal and inflammatory.

- 13.15.3 Advanced Pharmacology III. Kroeger. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually.
- General pharmacological mechanism of action. 13.16.3 Advanced Biochemical Endocrinology. Sanborn, Robison and Stancel. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Prerequisite: 12.06.3 or consent of instructor. A detailed exploration of the biochemical basis of

hormone action with emphasis on recent research concerning cyclic nucleotides and steroid hormones. *Methods in Pharmacology*. Robison and Staff. 2 qtr. hrs.

(llec., 1 lab per wk). Fall 1976 annually. Prerequisite: 13.13.3

Exposure to the techniques and instrumentation employed in various pharmacology laboratories in the Texas Medical Center. Students will be introduced to methods used in the study of drug disposition, drugreceptor interaction, biochemical pharmacology, molecular pharmacology, bioassay and chemical assay of drugs, physiological pharmacology and neuropharmacology. Seminar in Pharmacology. Montgomery. 1 qtr. hr. Fall

- 14.01.4 Neuroscience I. Molecular Biology of the Nervous System. Mathews and Staff. 4 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. Overview of neuroscience. Evolution of the nerve cell, its structure and metabolism. Biochemistry and biophysics of the function of the axon and of the synapse; chemistry of neurotransmitters. The special topics of memory and behavior at the molecular level of understanding.
- 14.02.4 Neuroscience II. Sensory and Behavioral Systems. Sperling and Staff. 4 qtr. hrs. Winter annually. Covers sensory transduction, electrophysiology, anatomy, and chemistry of information processing in vision, audition, vestibular and skin senses, learning and operant conditioning.
- 14.03.4 *Neuroscience III.* Neural Control System. Wood and Staff. 4 qtr. hrs. Spring annually. Anatomy and physiology of the neural control of the

internal environment. Secretory behavior, reflex action, and motor control. Organization of voluntary and autonomic reflexes will be treated in terms of heirarchial levels of control from spinal segmental to suprasegmental to brain stem, midbrain and finally cortical levels of organization.

Neuroscience I, II and III are intended as a one year comprehensive introduction to the field for those concentrating in other areas as well as those oriented towards serious study of the nervous system. They are intended to prepare the student for the parts of the written Ph.D. examination covering the areas of neural ultrastructure, neuroanatomy, neural biochemistry, neuroendocrinology, neuropharmacology, sensory information processing, motor control systems, brain function, memory and behavior. Although intended as a three quarter (fall, winter, spring) sequence, students upon special appeal to the instructor may be permitted, upon showing equivalent preparation to enter the later courses without having passed the previous ones or to take the courses out of sequence. The first part of Neurosciences I will be devoted to the plan of the three courses, an overview of the field and a description of research being conducted locally in the different areas of neuroscience to aid the student in planning tutorial research laboratories.

14.11.3 Neural Systems and Behavior. Crawford. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring 1974-1975 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

A critical review of the literature correlating experimental alteration of neural systems and the subsequent effects upon behavior. Selected central nervous system structures and systems will be reviewed and related to specific behavior changes, e.g.: perceptual processes, ingestive preocesses, memory and motivation.

14.12.3 Cellular Communication Systems. Benolken. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter 1975-1976 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

> A discussion of how sensory cells encode biological information. The emphasis will be on transducing and encoding properties of single cells from visual, mechano, and chemo sensory systems. Physiological data will be considered within the general conceptual framework of communication theory.

14.13.3 Color and Brightness Vision: An Interdisciplinary Approach. Sperling. 3 qtr. hrs. Winter 1974-1975 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor, Reading and discussion of recent advances in understanding the visual system. Will consider the ap-

roaches taken in sensory, electrophysiological, microanatomical and chemical studies.

14.14.2 Binocular Vision. Crawford and Gunter von Noorden. 2 qtr. hrs. Fall annually. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

Two eyes, one world; an exploration of the anatomical, physiological, psychophysical and perceptual aspects of binocular vision.

14.15.3

Sensory Neurophysiology. Boudreau, Tsuchitani. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring 1974-1975 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

In depth study of the structure and function of mammalian sensory systems. Emphasis will be on quantitative neuroanatomical studies of structure and single unit pulse studies of function. Peripheral sensory

systems of the auditory, skin, muscle and chemical senses will be emphasized. Problems of quantitative functional analysis and neural coding will be treated. *Issues in Behavioral Control.* A. A. Wright. 3 qtr. hrs. Fall 1975 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

An advanced seminar intended for those familiar with the principles of learning and conditioning. Discussions will center around major issues in the disciplines of aversive control, stimulus control, animal psychophysics, reinforcement schedules, reinforcement and drive.

14.17.3 Principles of Learning and Conditioning. A. A. Wright.
3 qtr. hrs. Fall 1974 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

Reading and lecture course open to all students. The course will provide a theoretical and applied foundation for behavioral control: assessment of infrahuman sensory capacities, behavior modification, basic research in instrumental and operant conditioning.

Signal Detection Theory and Psychophysics. A. A. Wright. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring 1976 and alternate years. Prerequisite: Consent of instructor.

Reading and dicussion course on psychophysical methods with an emphasis on an evaluation of signal detection theory and its analysis of discrimination performance into indices of response bias and detectability.

14.19.3 Introduction to Human Behavior. Houston. 3 qtr. hrs. Spring annually.

An introduction to major areas of inquiry about human behavior. Central questions about man will be discussed from the standpoint of various disciplines in the sociobehavioral sciences, with the chief emphasis on psychology, sociology and anthropology. Other relevant disciplines, such as history, political science, linquistics etc. will be brought in as needed.

An inquiry into the nature of reality with the attending risk of improving the mind through an investigation of the relationship between the science and philosophy. Problems of knowledge, logic, complexities of being, and ethics are among the subjects considered. Students are required to review and to discuss pertinent scientific and philosophic literature from Aristotle to Cioran.

Survey Course in Medical Ethics. Vaux. 3 qtr hrs. Fall annually. This course will study the sources of medical ethics in the Hippocratic, Nurenberg and religous traditions; survey the range of problems developmentally from genetic manipulation and abortion, through transplantation and brain control to the issues of euthanasia and death control. The critical tasks of establishing the sanctity of human life and the values of health professional ethics will be undertaken.

STUDENT HEALTH SERVICE PROGRAM

A. Fees

1. Student Service Fee

Seven dollars per student per quarter or \$21 per academic year (three quarters) or \$28 per calendar year. Required of all students. For parttime students this fee will be prorated.

2. Health Insurance Premium

All students are required to carry health insurance, either that offered through the Student Health Program or its equivalent. The annual premium for the Health Science Center sponsored policy is \$70 per calendar year, payable either in full on registration or quarterly.

B. Student Health Service

Among the objectives of the Health Science Center is to lead each student to realize his or her responsibility for maintenance of optimum physical and emotional health; to inculcate each student with proper attitudes about his or her health; and to instill in each student good habits of personal and community health. The Health Science Center makes available an integrated program of preventive and health maintenance services, care for episodic illnesses on an ambulatory basis, emergency services and hospitalization when necessary. This program is required of all registered students. On an optional basis the same program is available to the dependent spouses and children of registered students. These activities are supported by the required student fees and through a group hospital and surgical policy for hospitalization, emergency room care and special outpatient services, made available through the Health Science Center. An insurance policy offering coverage equivalent of that offered by the Center will be acceptable. The Health Service office is in the Hermann Professional Building. Through its personnel, the skills of Health Science Center faculty can be made available to students. Emergency services are provided by the Hermann Emergency Center, and in the event hospitalization is necessary, the Hermann Hospital is also available, but the student may elect to go to other hospitals. Additional major medical coverage is included in the basic policy offered by the Center. Maternity benefits are optionally available.

Students and covered dependents are eligible for unlimited visits to the Health Service offices during normal working hours without additional charge. Hours for the Health Service are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday. Night and weekend coverage will be through the Hermann Emergency Center. A detailed description of the plan and those benefits made available through the insurance policy will be made available at the time of registration or is available upon inquiry.
