

The Faculty Council on September 14, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposed change in the catalogue of the School of Communication (D&P 3776) in regard to the requirement for a minor in the degree of Bachelor of Science in Radio-Television-Film. This change adds art, music, and sociology to the list of subjects which may be offered as a minor, the reason being given that sociology is especially valuable as a minor for students of Radio-Television-Film and that art and music will likewise provide background for cultural interpretation.
2. The Faculty Council at its meeting on September 19, 1966, delegated to the respective deans the authority of the faculty to approve degree candidates for the year September 1, 1966 to August 31, 1967 (D&P 3774).
3. The Faculty Council at its meeting on September 19, 1966, acting on the recommendation of a special committee appointed to study and report on use of instructional television, voted to create a new standing committee of the General Faculty to insure faculty involvement in matters relating to the production and use of television teaching materials and for purposes of future planning of matters relating to television at the University, to be known as the Committee on Instructional Television. 




