PERMANENT UNIVERSITY FUND - LAND MATTERS .--

GRAZING LEASE NO. 901 (RENEWAL OF 773) TO BLAKE BONHAM ON PORTION OF 50-LEAGUE TRACT - LAMAR COUNTY, TEXAS.--Mr. Blake Bonham of Summer, Texas, holds a grazing lease for 5 years expiring December 31, 1963, on five of the remaining six tracts of Fifty-League Grant land in Lamar County. The lease covers 433.6 acres, and rental has been \$225.00 annually. Mr. Bonham now proposes a 5-year renewal of this lease at annual rental of \$0.75 per acre (\$325.20 annually).

It is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize this new lease for 5-years beginning January 1, 1964, with the Chairman to sign the lease upon approval as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

TRUST AND SPECIAL FUNDS - REAL ESTATE MATTERS .--

HOGG FOUNDATION: W. C. HOGG MEMORIAL FUND - PROPOSED OIL AND GAS LEASE TO SOUTHLAND LEASEHOLD, INC., OLD HUMBLE FIELD (SCRANTON HANSZEN FEE LAND #19) HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS.—The proposed lease from Mrs. Alice N. Hanszen et al, as lessors, to Southland Leasehold, Inc., as lessee, covers the undivided interest in certain lots comprising 8.6 acres out of the W. H. Bailey Subdivision in the James Strange Survey, Harris County. The University's interest is 108/1728ths.

A lease to this same company for a primary term of 90 days was approved by the Board at its meeting of April 5, 1963, but that lease has terminated and the new one is being requested and is being executed by the other lessor parties. The new lease provides for a well to be drilled on the land to a depth of 1,200 feet unless salt is encountered at a lesser depth or unless the well is completed for oil and gas in paying quantities at a lesser depth within 90 days after the date of the latest certificate of acknowledgment by a lessor party. The royalty would be 1/6 on oil and gas produced, including casinghead and all other gas. No bonus consideration is to be paid.

It is recommended that the University join in the proposed lease and that the Chairman be authorized to execute the instrument upon approval as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

HOGG FOUNDATION: W. C. HOGG MEMORIAL FUND - PROPOSED MINERAL LEASES TO JOHN A. HILL, WHARTON COUNTY.--The proposed leases from Mrs. Alice N. Hanszen, Miss Ima Hogg, Mrs. Margaret Wells Hogg and the Board of Regents of The University of Texas to Mr. John A. Hill cover 55 acres for one lease and 210.57 acres for the other in the Boling Field, Wharton County. No bonus consideration is to be paid and royalty would be 1/6 on oil and gas produced. The primary term of the lease will be 90 days from October 19, 1963. The University's interest is 1/16th from the Will C. Hogg Estate and remainder interest in 3/64ths from the Thos. E. Hogg Estate. The members of the Hogg family are executing the leases. This acreage has been leased a number of times over the past years. A number of wells have been drilled and some of them have produced oil in past years.

It is recommended that the proposed lease be approved and that the Chairman be authorized to execute the instrument upon approval as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

TEXAS WESTERN COLLEGE - RENEWAL OF FARMING LEASE TO JOHN T. BEAN ON COTTON ESTATE ACREAGE, EL PASO, TEXAS. -- This lease covers a tract of 112.635 acres in the Cotton Addition of El Paso and has been leased to Mr. Bean on a year to year basis. As rental the University receives 1/3 of the gross proceeds of all crops and pays the cost of electricity for pumping water for irrigation as well as 1/3 of the cost of fertilizer. Rental has averaged \$8,000 to \$9,000 annually.

The land covered by this lease is in the Chamizal zone which is pending final settlement. However, it is felt that settlement will probably not be completed for some time and therefore President Ray has recommended that the lease to Mr. Bean on this acreage be renewed for the 1964 calendar year under the terms outlined above. The recommendation is concurred in by the Central Administration staff with the Chairman authorized to execute the lease after approval as to form by the University Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

ARCHER M. HUNTINGTON MUSEUM FUND - EXTENSION OF GRAZING BEASE ON HUNTINGTON LANDS, GALVESTON COUNTY, TO JOE M. ROBINSON. -- The Huntington Lands in Galveston County, except that on Wilson Point which is inaccessible for grazing use, have been under grazing lease to Mr. Robinson since 1949, the last lease being for a three-year period, May 15, 1960, through May 14, 1963, with prior right to negotiate for another lease at the end of the term. Current rental is \$1.20 per acre on 3,350 acres. With the sale of a portion of the tract to Union Carbide Corporation in 1962, some 235.29 acres were released from Mr. Robinson's lease and the annual rental reduced from \$4,020 to \$3,720. Leases for some time have been negotiated through the real estate firm of Kellner, Avers & Schmitt of Texas City and Galveston, and inadvertently the rental for the current year was forwarded to the University and accepted before the negotiation for a new lease.

It appears that the current rental rate is still in line, and Mr. Robinson has been a very satisfactory tenant. A proposal for a new lease will be worked out with Mr. Robinson, or with someone else, prior to May, 1964, and submitted to the Board of Regents. Meanwhile, it is recommended that the Board of Regents authorize the extension of the 1960 lease to expire on May 14, 1964, to be evidenced by a letter agreement signed by the Endowment Officer on behalf of the University and by Mr. Robinson.

HOGG FOUNDATION: WILL C. HCGG MEMORIAL FUND - LEASE FOR ADDITIONAL TERM TO SIMPSON DINING CAR, INC., ON PROPERTY AT MAIN AND BELL (WHITE PROPERTY IN HOUSTON) .-- Simpson Dining Car has operated on the Hogg Foundation's property at Main and Bell in Houston for about 27 years, the last lease being for 2 years expiring December 31, 1963, at base rental of \$1,000 per month plus 6% of gross sales above \$200,000 annually. The lease is subject to cancellation on 6 months' notice in the event of sale or long-term lease. The improvements are owned by the lessee with right of removal upon termination of the lease. The lessee now proposes a new lease for 2 years beginning January 1, 1964, under the same terms as the current lease. Their annual business is running around \$180,000 to \$190,000, and no percentage rental has been due. Though this property should be worth in excess of \$600,000 and the rental provides only about 2% return on value, no improvement in income appears possible until a sale or long-term lease is made. It is recommended that the lessee's proposal for a new lease be accepted, except that notice of cancellation in the event of sale or long-term lease will be reduced to 3 months from the present 6 months. It is further recommended that the Chairman be authorized to execute the new lease when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer .


ARCHER M. HUNTINGTON MUSEUM FUND - PROPOSAL FROM WM. W. SHERRILL, TRUSTEE, FOR PURCHASE OF WILSON POINT AREA OF HUNTINGTON LANDS, S. C. BUNDICK LEAGUE, GALVESTON COUNTY.--Part of the Huntington Lands in Galveston County comprise the west end of Wilson Point in Galveston Bay just west of the Galveston Causeway. A channel dug several years ago separates the Point from the mainland, and the only land access to the University's west end of the Point would have to be by bridge across the channel and by road across property owned by others. Our acreage on the Point, though no survey on the ground is available, has been carried on the University's records and on County records at approximately 312 acres. Maximum elevation is around 2 feet above sea level, and it appears that most of it is under water at normal high tide.

Wm. W. Sherrill, Trustce, of Houston proposes to buy the University's Wilson Point acreage for \$210,000, with the understanding that he will obtain merchantable title to a minimum of 300 acres, or in the alternative if so desired by the Board of Regents to pay \$600 per acre for all on which merchantable title can be given. He proposes to pay 30% down with the balance in 10 annual installments with interest at 7% per annum with full on-or-before privileges and provision for release of the lien by 10-acre tracts upon payment of 1-1/2 times

the average acre price. Individual endorsements on the note will be provided to the extent necessary to satisfy the University. All minerals would be retained by the University with reasonable drilling sites to be agreed on by the parties and so reserved in the deed. It appears quite definite that Mr. Sherrill and his associates would develop this tract for residential resort purposes which will involve considerable expense for access, filling, utilities, and boat channels.

Though another independent appraisal has been requested, appraisals in the past have given a value of not more than \$100 per acre on this land. Mr. Sherrill has furnished an independent appraisal showing \$550 per acre. Mr. Joseph Tamburine of Texas City who owns about 90 acres adjoining the University's acreage on the east has offered to pay the Board of Regents \$1,000 a year for an option to extend a maximum of 3 years to buy its Wilson Point acreage at \$125 per acre.

Subject to the independent appraisal to be received later and other information to be obtained for consideration by the Board of Regents, the staff recommends that Mr. Sherrill's proposal be accepted except that, subject to his acceptance by November 22, 1963, the sale be at \$700 per acre on the area to which merchantable title can be given, based on a survey on the ground at the expense of the seller. Payment terms would be as proposed and set out above. It is further recommended that, if the change is accepted by Mr. Sherrill within the time allowed, the Chairman be authorized to execute a contract of sale and in due course the deed when approved as to form by the Land and Trust Attorney and as to content by the Endowment Officer.

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on November 8 and 9, 1963:

RESEARCH CONTRACTS: The following contracts and amendments have been negotiated by the Office of Government Sponsored Research and have been signed by the Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs upon the recommendation of the appropriate Technical Director, the Director of the Office of Government Sponsored Research, and the Business Manager. I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

- FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the Faculty Council and/or the General faculty. I recommend approval:
- 1. The Faculty Council at its meeting of September 16, 1963, approved the delegation of authority to approve the 1963-64 degree candidates to the respective deans. (D&F 3230)
- 2. The Faculty Council at the September 16, 1963, meeting approved the deletion of the second paragraph in the eligibility for official nonathletic activities provision, General Information Catalogue, Part V, p. 120, which provides that graduate students may be permitted to participate in official extracurricular activities if they have passed a minimum of nine semester hours of regular University work with a B average in the last semester or summer session of residence in the University. This regulation was adopted in 1947 because certain graduate students attending the University under the G.I. Bill were evading the spirit of University regulations and the purposes of the G.I. Bill by enrolling for courses with no intention of attending classes or making an effort to pass the courses. (D&F 3231)

NEPOTISM: The following requests for appointment involving nepotism were submitted and processed prior to the adoption of the new rule at the September 1963 meeting:

Gatlin, whose husband is Professor of Mechanical Engineering, be appointed to a research position in the Genetics Foundation under the direction of Dr. Wilson Stone, Professor of Zoology. Mrs. Gatlin now has a fellowship of approximately \$500 per month, but Dr. Stone expects to appoint her later this year as an employee at a rate of approximately \$800 per month, and wishes to clear the nepotism question now. Mrs. Gatlin has a Ph.D. in Chemistry from the University of Texas.
- 2. Under Sec. 5.34 it is requested that Mrs. Mary Dewar, whose husband is Welch Professor of Chemistry, be appointed as a Research Associate in the Department of History on a half time basis at a full-time rate of \$10,000 for nine months. Mrs. Dewar has a Ph.D. from the University of London, Queen Mary's College.

SALE OF UNIVERSITY PROPERTY: The University of Texas owns approximately 841 grams of gold and approximately 4,000 grams of platinum, both in the form of small bowls which were used in former years by our Chemistry Department for certain kinds of experiments. The University has owned this material for some 45 or 50 years according to our best estimate, but with the development of new materials, bowls made from these metals are no longer necessary and the Department of Chemistry would like to dispose of them. A letter has been written to the Treasury Department in Washington asking whether there are any governmental regulations concerning the sale of these metals, but at this writing no reply has been received.

Should there be no governmental restrictions or prohibitions on the sale of such property, in accordance with Chapter VII, Sec. 10.5, Part Two of the Regents Rules and Regulations (which provides that sales of materials in amount of \$1,000 or more must have advance approval of the Board of Regents) permission is requested to sell this material by inviting bids, the bids to be reviewed and sale to be approved by a committee composed of Vice-Chancellor Hackerman, Business Manager Colvin, and Purchasing Agent Doss, and to use the proceeds in an approximate amount of \$10,000 to set up a service department and revolving fund account for handling of chemicals to be purchased by the Department of Chemistry and sold to University departments by interdepartmental transfer voucher.
