RECOMMENDATION FOR RATIFICATION OF NEW CONTRACT WITH BLUE CROSS/BLUE SHIELD


It is recommended that The University of Texas System approve a new Blue Cross/Blue Shield contract which provides a comprehensive health care plan effective September 1, 1976. The new comprehensive health care plan will provide improved benefits, claims processing, and faster payment of claims for active and retired employees.

In order to protect the financial soundness of the group and provide adequate insurance protection for employees, it is recommended that this new contract and a slight rate increase, which has been carefully worked out with Blue Cross/Blue Shield, be approved.

A plan has been developed to charge all budgetary units and projects on an equitable basis for funding lump sum vacation and sick leave costs. A rate of 1.2% of all eligible salaries and wages has been computed to fund the costs. (Eligible salaries and wages are those paid to employees entitled to payment for vacation and sick leave upon termination of employment.) Monthly charges of 1.2% will be accumulated in a pool (reserve fund) and all lump sum payments of accrued vacation and sick leave will be paid from the pool.



Electric Power Research Institute, Contract EPRI Project RP849-3, whereby the Energy Systems Research Center, The University of Texas at Arlington, is awarded funding not to exceed \$200,311 in support of project "Dynamic Characteristics of Power System Loads." This project is under the direction of Dr. Mo-Shing Chen, Director, Energy Systems Research Center, and the period of the award is September 1, 1976 through June 1, 1978.

Chairman Thompson advised that the North Texas State game on September 18, 1976, had been very profitable financially, with an attendance of 60,000. Seventy-five hundred tickets were sold by North Texas State. He reminded the Council that this team had replaced North Carolina State, which only last Spring Found itself with two games on the same date--East Carolina State and The University of Texas. Two other games are scheduled with North Carolina State--one in Raleigh on October 14, 1978, and the other in Austin on September 19, 1981.

(Major: (1) Linguistics 320K, 320L, 344K, 372K, and 372L (Linguistics 320K and 320L may be taken by linguistics majors on a Pass-Fail basis); (2) Linguistics 360K (or English 360K); (3) Six-hours-of-upper-division-linguistics;-or-three hours-of-upper-division-linguistics-and-English-364;-(4)-two semesters-of-second-year-courses-in-a-non-Western-language other-than-the-language-used-to-absolve-the-College-foreign language-requirement; (5) students should consult the departmental undergraduate adviser for information concerning the counting of other courses toward the major requirement.)

GENERAL INFORMATION

SAN ANTONIO

San Antonio is the tenth largest city in the United States with a population of 786,000 and is one of the nation's most interesting and colorful cities. Its twin cultural heritage - Spanish and American - is reflected from the early missions and the historic Alamo to modern sky-scrapers.

Located in South Central Texas in a subtropical climate, it enjoys normal mean temperature ranges from 52 degrees in January to 84 degrees in July. As a center of higher education, four universities and three colleges are located in San Antonio as well as The University of Texas Health Science Center.

SOUTH TEXAS MEDICAL CENTER

The South Texas Medical Center is an area of some 680 acres in North-west San Antonio established by the San Antonio Medical Foundation for the development of institutions and facilities which would offer the highest standards of achievement for health, education, research, patient care and health care services.

In 1961, The Foundation donated 100 acres to The University of Texas System, the present location of The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. In addition to these two institutions, the South Texas Medical Center includes - Bexar County Hospital, Bexar County Unit of the American Cancer Society, Texas Cradle Society, San Antonio Community Hospital, Cancer Therapy and Research Center, Ecumenical Center for Religion and Health, Villa Rosa Psychiatry and Rehabilitation Center, Lutheran General Hospital, The Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults of Bexar County and Southwest Methodist Hospital. The South Texas Medical Center has grown to include 22 institutions with over 7,500 employees and a combined annual budget of approximately \$132,000,000.

THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS HEALTH SCIENCE CENTER AT SAN ANTONIO

History

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio originated as a Medical School which was authorized by the 56th Texas Legislature in 1959. Its construction was started in 1966, and completed in July 1968.

Faculty recruitment for the Medical School began in 1965. Enrollment began in 1966, but students attended classes at The University of Texas Medical Schools in Dallas and Galveston until the San Antonio facility could be completed. In 1969 the first full class of 104 students matriculated in the new facility, and the first graduating class of 33 students received Doctor of Medicine degrees in 1970.

The initial Medical School building contained 432,816 square feet on four levels and included classrooms, multidisciplinary teaching laboratories, a 634-seat auditorium, a library, faculty offices and research laboratories, and administrative offices as well as areas necessary to service the building.

In 1969 the 61st Texas Legislature authorized the beginning of The University of Texas Dental School at San Antonio. By using temporary facilities in the Medical School, the Dental School opened in September of 1970 with 16 first-year dental students, and graduated its first class in June of 1974.

Construction of a separate building for the Dental School on the same 100 acres was begun early in 1973 and was completed in 1975. This building is also a four-level structure of 453,769 square feet and is compatible in architecture with buildings of the Medical School. The two schools are connected at each level to permit maximum sharing of teaching and research facilities. The completed dental facility provides accommodations to admit 152 dental students each year into the four-year Doctor of Dental Surgery program, 48 dental hygiene students to enter the two-year dental hygiene program, 48 dental assistant students to enter the me-year dental assistant program, and 24 dental laboratory technicians to enter the two-year dental laboratory technician program. It is planned that raduate programs in most dental specialties will be offered. Emphasis will lso be placed on research in appropriate training areas as well as in rograms of continuing dental education.

During the early years of the Medical School, the basic science faculty lso initiated the development of graduate programs leading to the Master f Arts and the Doctor of Philosophy degrees. In 1970, graduate programs or these degrees were approved by the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, for anatomy, biochemistry, biophysics, microbiology and pharmacology. Enrollment began that year with 15 student. In 1972, he University of Texas Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at an Antonio was established and assumed responsibility for the administration f these programs. In October, 1974, the Master of Arts and Doctor f Philosophy degrees in physiology were approved for implementation y the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System. In June 1976, he graduate program in biophysics was redesignated as the graduate program a bioengineering. The total number of graduate students in the above programs acreased to 92 in the fall of 1976.

A combined program can be individually arranged with the Medical and ental Schools which may allow a medical or dental student to obtain an .A. or a Ph.D. degree in addition to an M.D. or a D.D.S. degree concurrently.

The University of Texas Board of Regents in 1972 recognized the potential for conjoint development of these health professions in this geographical setting, and to better coordinate those biomedical units for efficiency and effectiveness in academic programs, as well as management and fiscal operation, authorized the establishment of The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, to be composed of the Dental School, the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences, the Medical School, and a School of Allied Health Sciences.

In April, 1975, the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, approved three programs in the School of Allied Health Sciences — Dental Hygiene, Dental Assisting, and Dental Laboratory Technology. Formal admission to the Dental Assisting Program occurred in May, 1976; formal admission to the Dental Hygiene and Dental Laboratory Technology Programs occurred in August, 1976.

In October of 1973, the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, approved a program for a Doctor of Pharmacy Program (Pharm.D.) to be administered jointly by The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio and the College of Pharmacy at The University of Texas at Austin. The Health Science Center also serves as a clinical resource for several of the students in the baccalaureate program of the College of Pharmacy in Austin.

In 1969, the Texas Legislature authorized the implementation of The University of Texas System School of Nursing at San Antonio. It began offering a Baccalaureate degree in Nursing in 1970 and a Masters degree in Nursing was begun in 1972. On March 26, 1976, the Board of Regents reorganized the System School of Nursing. The San Antonio School of Nursing was placed administratively within the Health Science Center, effective September 1, 1976.

Construction of a separate building for the School of Nursing was begun near the new Dental School early in 1973. It was completed and occupied in 1974. The building consists of 78,756 square feet on two levels and will accommodate 400 undergraduate and 75 graduate nursing students.

One of the purposes for the reorganization of the institution as a Health Science Center was to provide an educational environment in which students of the various health professions could pursue their formal course work in close professional association. As future Physicians, Dentists, Nurses, Pharmacists, Research Scientists, and various Allied Health Personnel pursue their studies in this setting, it is expected that they will develop from the beginning a mutual respect for the functional relationship of each other in their common objective—health maintenance.

<u>Accreditation</u>

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio has been awarded full regional accreditation through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

The dental education program has received full accreditation by the Council on Dental Education of the American Dental Association and the Commission on Accreditation of Dental and Dental Auxiliary Education Programs.

The medical education program has received full accreditation by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education of the Association of American Medical Colleges and the American Medical Association.

In December 1975, the Dental Assisting and Dental Laboratory Technology Training Programs were approved for preliminary provisional accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation of the American Dental Association; the Dental Hygiene Education Program was granted accreditation eligible status. Students enrolling in and completing these programs will be considered graduates of accredited programs.

The nursing education program has received full accreditation by the National League for Nursing and the State Board of Nurse Examiners.

Policy

No person shall, on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion or sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under, any program or activity sponsored or conducted by The University of Texas System or any of its component institutions.

Release of Transcripts and Academic Records

Transcripts and other information from a student's academic records will be released by the Registrar only upon written request from the student, or other person authorized by law, and when payment of the appropriate fee is made. An exception may be made in response to a subpoena or a court order.

Transportation

Students must provide their own transportation to the various agencies for clinical experience. A small fee is charged for parking in Health Science Center lots. Other parking fees associated with clinical practice are the responsibility of the student.

Graduation Under Particular Catalogue

Students may obtain a degree from the School of Nursing according to the requirements in the catalogue under which they enter the School, or the catalogue governing any subsequent year in which they are registered in the school, provided that they complete the work for the degree within six years of the date of the catalogue they have chosen. In the case of courses which are to longer offered, the faculty will prescribe substitutions.

STUDENT AND FACULTY SUPPORT ACTIVITIES

The Office of Student Services

The Director of Student Services is generally charged with representing students' needs and providing support service for student development. This office encompasses the Registrar and Admissions, Coordinator of Curriculum and Academic Programs, Student Financial Aid, the Student Health Center, and Counseling Services. Students are encouraged to seek assistance from the Director and his staff in matters dealing with curricular and extracurricular concern.

The Registrar, in addition to being custodian of all student academic records and responsible for the registration and enrollment of students in the various academic courses, is also the administrator for all student admissions, withdrawals and graduation. Actions of the various admissions committees as well as those of the student promotions committees are implemented through this office in consonance with policies and directives of The University of Texas System and those of the Health Science Center and its Schools.

The Coordinator of Curriculum and Academic Programs integrates the academic courses of the Health Science Center Schools to insure availability of faculty, time sequencing, classroom and laboratory facilities. Coordination is effected between the various curriculum committees and individual school administrators in accordance with their approved policies. School catalogues, school calendars and academic schedules are prepared and published by this office as well as the scheduled use of all classrooms.

Financial assistance is offered to qualified students through scholarships and loans available for the individual schools. These are supervised by the Scholarship and Loan Committee and provided through the Financial Aid Administrator. Assistance is made only on the basis of demonstrated need. While financial help cannot be guaranteed, every effort will be made to provide the maximum assistance possible to meet demonstrated financial requirements. At the time accepted students indicate they will matriculate, they may request an application for financial aid. All applications should be sent to the Office of Financial Aid. Scholarships, loans and other types of available financial assistance are listed in the financial information section.

Student Health Services are available at the Student Health Center located in the Bexar County Hospital, and are provided by faculty members of the Department of Family Practice. These services are supported by the Student Services Fee.

All students are to have a complete physical examination and laboratory tests by a personal physician prior to entry. Students may use the Health Center for acute illnesses or injuries as well as periodic examinations, family planing information and supplies, problem counseling, follow-up advice on chronic diseases, and the usual care offered in the offices of family physicians. All necessary laboratory, X-ray and similar tests are provided without charge for students. The student activity fee does not cover health services for student dependents.

The Counseling Service offers individual and group psychological counseling regarding problems of academics, career choice, and personal adjustment. The Service is staffed by a psychologist with psychiatric consultation available as required.

The Office of Educational Resources

The Director of Educational Resources coordinates and implements the various services which support the educational functions of the Health Science Center and extends these services to include the support of research activities, administrative requirements and public information.

The Library serves not only as the primary resource and repository of information for the learning, research and health care functions of the Center, but also as a laboratory where students acquire skills of information processing. An active orientation program is an important function of the library staff. The Library collection covers the broad range of all health related aciences — dentistry, medicine, nursing, basic sciences, environmental health, behavioral sciences, and veterinary sciences in over 81,000 volumes as well as subscriptions to over 2,000 periodicals. It serves as one of the eleven resource libraries in the five states of the South Central Regional Medical Library, and has access through a teletypewriter and computer terminals to data bases and literature resources nation wide, including direct access to the National Library of Medicine.

The Library's Learning Resources Center provides individual and small group study carrels for non-book media and study facilities for student use. Some of these are equipped with television monitors and programs are available from the Health Science Center Demand Access Television System.

The Division of Educational Communications provides production support services, including Art, Photography, Printing, Television and Film for the instructional research, and public relations programs of the Health Science Center. This includes the design and production of teaching materials, preparation of materials for publication, and documentation of research results or clinical methods.

Technical services provide more than 90 hours per week of demand-access programs requested by students or faculty members and are available in any of nearly 600 individual stations. The video library contains over 500 separate instructional programs on video tapes.

Audiovisual equipment and technical assistance are provided by Classroom Services.

The Division of Instructional Development (ID) provides assistance to individual faculty and to departments in designing, developing, implementing and evaluating instructional programs. The ID staff consults with faculty in identifying instructional needs and problems, and aids in the specification of goals and objectives. The ID staff also provides support resources in developing pilot instructional programs and materials, developing instructional programs and materials; developing instructional procedures, evaluation mechanisms, and instruction materials.

Facilities and services for all types of laboratory instruction required by various disciplines of the health sciences are provided by the Medical and Dental Multidiscipline Laboratories and The Nursing Simulated Learning Laboratory. The Multidiscipline Laboratories vary in size and provide space for 16 to 32 students and are designed and equipped to provide office and work space for students, for stimulating independent investigation, for promoting correlation between disciplines, for promoting closer interaction between faculty and students, and for saving space and equipment through more efficient use. The Nursing Simulated Learning Laboratory contains twenty-five carrels with individual television monitors and direct videotape access. This laboratory provides an excellent area for the demonstration and practice of nursing skills.

The Office of Continuing Education Services

The learning process of a professional cannot end with the attainment of a professional degree, but must be extended continuously to keep abreast of new developments in special areas of interest. Such learning is difficult for the unassisted individual because of the enormous body of scientific information. It is the function of the Director of Continuing Education Services to coordinate and support programs designed by the faculty of the Health Science Center to further and facilitate post-graduate professional learning.

- 1. The program of Continuing Medical Education includes a biweekly series of Therapeutic Seminars presented at the Health Science Center for physicians in the locality and are set up as teleconferences to allow direct participation over a five-state area. Nursing teleconferences will begin in 1977 utilizing this same network.
 - a. Approximately 35 post-graduate courses are offered for physicians, psychologists and others each year. These vary in length from one weekend to afternoon classes extending as long as 10 weeks so that the professional has opportunity for formal training commensurate with individual time available, interests and requirements.
 - b. Preceptorships are also provided. These programs permit a physician or psychologist to participate in the development and evaluation of an educational experience designed for an individual.
- 2. An extensive program in Continuing Dental Education has been established whereby dentists and auxiliaries may obtain knowledge relevant to their professions.
 - a. Dental courses are scheduled on the basis of maximum interest and priority, and most will be open to all auxiliaries. In addition, special courses for dental assistants, hygienists and laboratory technicians will be offered.
 - b. Other educational activities include preceptorships, study clubs, participation studies for the doctor/patient or doctor/assistant, closed-circuit television courses, laboratory courses, and seminars.
- 3. Nursing continuing education programs are offered to nurses in a wide geographical area. Approximately ten programs a month are sponsored by the School of Nursing. Over 5,000 participants attend these programs yearly.

AFFILIATED FACILITIES

There are many institutions in San Antonio that provide an excellent resource for programs of the Health Science Center. Many members of the staffs of these organizations hold joint appointments in the Dental, Graduate, Medical or Nursing Schools and participate in educational and research programs.

These institutions constitute an important resource for the education of students as well as the provision of needed laboratory space for the conduct of research.

A listing of these institutions follows:

ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The University of Texas at San Antonio, a major university having both undergraduate and graduate programs, is located on a 600 acre campus 5 miles north of the Health Science Center. Cooperative teaching and research between the two institutions is developing.

CLINICAL AGENCIES

In addition to the facilities mentioned below, the Nursing School utilizes many other agencies for limited or short-term clinical experience. These include nursing homes, clinics, schools, adult health centers, other community hospitals and physicians' offices.

The Bexar County Hospital, operated by the Bexar County Hospital District, adjoins the Health Science Center and is connected at several levels. The 12-story, 429-bed facility is a major teaching hospital for professional schools of the Health Science Center and provides all general hospital services as well as advanced emergency and critical care treatment.

The Robert B. Green Memorial Hospital is also operated by the Bexar County Hospital District. It is located in urban San Antonio and houses the ambulatory care clinics, a family care clinic, 57 obstetrical beds and 90 newborn bassinets. Its outpatient department includes 55 different clinics which treat more than 129,000 patients each year.

Ground was broken in the South Texas Medical Center on November 20, 1970, for the new Audie L. Murphy Memorial Veterans Hospital. It was completed and opened in October 1973, with a planned bed capacity of 760 for medical, surgical and psychiatric patients. It serves 40 counties of Southwest Texas. The facility provides 40,000 square feet of space for research.

Southwest Texas Methodist Hospital, a 487-bed non-profit facility, was the pioneer institution in the South Texas Medical Center. It offers the only obstetrical service in the medical center, as well as specialized treatment in its Neuroscience Pavilion, gastrointestinal diagnostic service, coronary care unit and cardiac catheterization lab.

San Antonio State Hospital, established in 1892, is a facility of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation. It serves 33 counties in South Texas with in-patient treatment of persons with mental disorders and/or alcoholism and drug abuse.

The San Antonio Metropolitan Health District is the designee of the Texas Department of Health Resources for provision of public health services in Bexar County. It provides a comprehensive range of services including immunizations, adult health clinics, well child conferences, maternity and family planning services and communicable disease control in a network of over 50 neighborhood clinics.

Brooke General Hospital is a major component of Brooke Army Medical Center. It has a bed capacity of 800 and offers definitive medical and outpatient care. Internship and residency training programs are available. The United States Army Institute of Surgical Research has gained international renown for its outstanding research and excellence in the treatment of serious burn cases.

Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center is a component of the Aerospace Medical Division of the Air Force Systems Command. It operates a 1000-bed general hospital that admits approximately 25,000 patients annually and its clinics see nearly 750,000 outpatients each year.

The Santa Rosa Medical Center has a total of 1,050 beds in five units: the General Hospital, Children's Hospital, Otto Koehler Radiation Therapy and Research Unit and the Outpatient Clinic are in downtown San Antonio; the Villa Rosa Psychiatry and Rehabilitation Center is in the South Texas Medical Center. The Santa Rosa System is developing specialized patient care, in pediatrics, orthopedics, nuclear medicine, neurosurgery and thoracic surgery.

The United States Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine is located at Brooks Air Force Base, Texas. It was originally organized in 1917 and has been continuously active since that time in research and development in medical aspects of serospace flight, in clinical practices of special interest to aerospace, and in post-graduate education in aerospace medicine and allied subjects.

The Baptist Memorial Hospital System operates three hospitals which offer general hospital service with a total capacity of 1,068 beds. Training in orthopedics and ophthalmology is available as a cooperative part of Bexar County Hospital University Residency Programs.

The University of Texas Health Science Center is also affiliated with the <u>San Antonio State Chest Hospital</u>. This is a 406-bed hospital with primary responsibility for the treatment of tuberculosis, emphysema and other lung disease cases.

The Cancer Therapy and Research Center is located in the South Texas Medical Center. It provides services for the care of cancer patients including Linear Accelerators and Electron Beam Therapy as well as the standard Cobalt Therapy. The Center is developing programs for training radiation therapy residents with the University.

OTHER AFFILIATED FACILITIES

An affiliation agreement is maintained between The University of Texas Health Science Center and the Southwest Foundation for Research and Education. This agreement allows the two institutions to share facilities and faculties. The Southwest Foundation is a biomedical research institution which has laboratories in San Antonio and a branch in Kenya, Africa. Its annual research budget is \$3,000,000. Its staff works primarily in the fields of cancer,

heart, endocrine, and infectious disease with emphasis upon virology and parasitology. The Foundation has 155,000 square feet of offices and laboratories. A large indoor and outdoor animal facility houses a primate colony and other animals to support the biomedical research effort.

An agreement between the Health Science Center and the Southwest Research Institute allows cooperation in research. The Southwest Research Institute; a nonprofit applied research organization, has its headquarters in San Antonio and also has laboratories in Houston and Corpus Christi and an office in Washington, D.C. The staff conducts research and development projects which include a broad spectrum of the biological and physical sciences. Its annual research budget is over \$25,000,000.

The Ecumenical Center for Religion and Realth located at the South Texas Medical Center helps physicians, ministers and related professionals work together to meet human needs. Activities of the Center are under the direction of a Board of Trustees representing the major religions of the community. Training courses and workshops for professionals are held in areas of personal problem solving and counseling.

PROGRAMS OF THE NURSING SCHOOL

The School of Nursing offers three programs of instruction: a Baccalaureate Program, a Master's Program and a Continuing Education Program in Nursing. The Baccalaureate Program includes planned learning opportunities designed to meet the needs of beginning and Registered Nurse students. The Master's Program is designed to provide advanced clinical study and preparation for teaching, administration and clinical specialization. The Continuing Education Program provides learning opportunities for the continuing education needs of Registered Nurses in South Texas.

THE BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM IN NURSING

PHILOSOPHY

The faculty of The University of Texas School of Nursing has a commitment to excellence in nursing to meet the needs of the public in South Texas. It values human life and recognizes individuality and dignity in human endeavor. Individuality is based on one's ability to interact with one's environment physically, emotionally, and socially.

The faculty believes that health care is the right of each person and is provided through cooperative efforts of a wide range of professionals using a variety of disciplines. Nursing is a helping profession committed to the prevention of illness, promotion of health and care of the sick.

Professional nursing is a deliberative process of interacting with individuals, groups or families for the purpose of identifying health related needs and assisting the individual, families or groups to meet these needs.

Undergraduate education in nursing, which provides a foundation for continuing personal, professional and educational development, includes study of the arts, sciences and humanities. The baccalaureate program is designed to produce a competent, self-directed, practitioner of nursing, who in a variety of settings is able to provide and evaluate nursing care of individuals and groups; who participates in the determination of the goals of the nursing profession; who actively searches for knowledge to improve the practice of nursing.

The faculty believes that learning is a lifelong process which is independent and self-initiated and results in a change or reorganization of behavior. Learning occurs best when students are actively engaged in the learning process.

THE BACCALAUREATE GRADUATE

The baccalaureate program is directed toward five objectives. At the completion of the program, the student:

- 1. Plans, provides and evaluates nursing care given to patients based on their individual needs and the available resources.
- 2. Communicates with patients, families and groups as well as other health care professionals on behalf of the patients.
- Accepts responsibility for continued personal and professional growth.
- Possesses the knowledge and skills associated with leadership positions in nursing.
- 5. Demonstrates involvement in contemporary, social and health issues.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM LEADING TO BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN NURSING

This program consists of two academic years of four semesters of lower-division courses taken in an approved college or university followed by two academic years or four semesters of upper-division nursing courses which are taken in The School of Nursing at San Antonio. Upon completion of the program, students are awarded the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree and are eligible to take the State Board Test Pool Examination for licensure as registered nurses.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Pre-Nursing Courses

Students may complete the 60 hours of general course work listed below at any accredited junior or senior college or university. Completion usually requires two academic years. All courses must be completed before enrollment for upper-division courses in nursing.

^{*}If any course requirement is part of a two semester sequence, both courses must be taken. Excess hours can be counted toward electives.

^{**}House Bill 935, passed by the Sixtieth Legislature, provides that no person may receive an undergraduate degree unless he has taken and passed six semester hours in American Covernment and six semester hours in United States history. No more than three semester hours of credit by advanced standing examination in government and three in history may be used to satisfy this requirement.

^{***}Only university-parallel courses taken in an accredited college or university may be accepted as free electives. Technical or vocational courses are not university parallel courses. Neither nursing nor required physical education courses may be accepted as free electives.

Prerequisite courses taken more than eight years prior to a student's first enrollment in the nursing school are subject to the approval of the Admission, Promotion and Graduation Committee before credit is granted for these courses.

Up to twelve hours may be taken by correspondence.

Grade Point Average

The minimum grade point average required for consideration for admission is:

a. an overall average of 2.0 for all transferable courses including the 60 hours of prerequisite courses.

and

b. an average of 2.3 in all required pre-nursing courses excluding natural and physical science electives and free electives.

Physical Examination:

Students seeking admission are required to have a health history and physical examination completed within three months prior to enrollment.

All eligible applicants' credentials will be reviewed and a final decision about admission made by the Admission, Promotion and Graduation Committee of the School of Nursing.

Pre-Admission Test - The student must submit a report of scores for the SAT or ACT tests.

Pre-Admission Interview - A pre-admission interview with The Admission, Promotion and Graduation committee may be requested.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

A student seeking admission to the School of Nursing must present:

1) an application for admission to upper-division nursing courses; 2) two official copies of transcripts from each institution attended, at least one of which must include high school units and a report of scores on the admission tests; and 3) a health history and physical examination completed within three months prior to enrollment and reported on a form provided through the Admissions Office; 4) a report of scores on the SAT or ACT tests.

All credentials should be sent to the above addresses. All transcripts must be sent directly from the institution attended to the Office of Student Services. Students may apply for one program pattern only (basic generic pattern, flexible option pattern or credit by examination pattern). If the student fails to be accepted for the pattern selected and wishes to be considered for another pattern; the application must be reactivated for the second pattern desired.

The deadlines for submission of applications are as follows:

Fall Semester - March 1* Spring Semester - October 1*

Applicants will not be reviewed until after the above deadline dates. Applications received after the deadline dates will be considered only if the class is not already filled. All students will be notified whether or not they have been accepted into the School of Nursing. Due to limited positions available and the number of applicants expected, all applicants will be considered on a competitive basis.

Admission From Other Baccalaureate Nursing Programs

Transfer of nursing courses from another baccalaureste nursing school are considered and must be approved by the Admission, Promotion and Graduation Committee, after a completed application with transcript and rationale for transfer has been received.

^{*}Applications are to be submitted no earlier than 12 months prior to the application deadline.

UNDERGRADUATE CURRICULUM

The undergraduate nursing curriculum is completed in two major divisions, the first of which is the 60 semester hours of basic liberal arts required for admission into the University of Texas Nursing School at San Antonio. The second major division, Upper Division Nursing, encompasses the major in nursing and is presented in the four semesters of the junior and senior years. The curriculum includes 60 semester hours of required nursing courses and 9 semester hours of elective subjects of which 3 semester hours must be in nursing subjects while the remaining 5 semester hours may be in nursing or any other upper-level subjects that are approved by the Nursing School and awarded by an accredited four year institution of higher education. (These 9 hours may be taken on a pass-fail basis.) The normal structure of the upper-level undergraduate curriculum is shown below.

EXPLANATION OF COURSE NUMBERS

The Semester Hour

Instruction is given in courses and the unit of measure for credit purposes is the semester hour. One semester hour of credit is given for each one hour of class or three hours of laboratory experience per week, per semester, with the exception of summer session, where the class in clinical hours are concentrated into a shorter period of time.

Course Numbers

NURS designates all courses given in the School of Nursing. A five-digit number follows: the first digit indicates the earliest level at which a course may be taken, or at which a course is usually taken; the second and third digits indicate the semester hours credit given for the course; the last two digits are the course identification number.

Courses listed in this catalogue are subject to change without notice.

UNDERGRADUATE COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

NURS 31501. Nursing Process: Care of Well Individuals 15 semester hours

Prerequisite: 60 hours of required lower-division courses

The focus is on the concept of normal growth and development and the characteristics of healthy patterns of living along the age continuum.

Students, with faculty assistance, begin examining: the concept of wellness, communication skills, physical assessment skills, professional behavior, and the use of nursing process.

The clients/patients with whom the student deals are individuals who are self-sufficient or require minimal assistance in providing for their physical and emotional health.

Nine lecture and eighteen laboratory hours average per week per semester.* Laboratory fee \$8.00.

NURS 31202. Nursing of Individuals and Families with Minor Health Problems

12 semester hours

Prerequisite: NURS 31501

The focus is on planning and implementing care with individuals and families experiencing minor disruptions in their health status.

Student experiences include: providing planned care for ill individuals and their families, identifying need for health teaching and carrying out teaching plans and identifying the role of the professional nurse.

The individuals and families with whom the student deals require assistance in regaining physically and emotionally healthy living patterns. Six lecture hours and eighteen laboratory hours average per week per semester.* Laboratory fee \$8.00.

NURS 32020. Nursing Intervention in Impaired Health Status

20 semester hours

This course must be taken by written and clinical examinations and is prerequisite to subsequent courses.

The focus is on the demonstration of knowledge and skills in the assessment, planning and implementation of nursing care for patients manifesting the more common conditions requiring hospitalized care.

The student will draw on previously acquired knowledge from the biological, physical and social sciences in the application of principles to nursing care situations.

NURS 41203. Nursing Intervention in Major Health Problems

12 semester hours

Prerequisite: NURS 31202

The focus is on planning and implementing care with individuals, families and groups who are experiencing illness which results in major problems for that individual, family or group.

Student learning experiences include: recognizing and acting upon knowledge of pathophysiology and psychopathology, examining the influences of major health problems or relationships within a family, and applying nursing skills in a crisis producing situation.

The clients/patients with whom the students deal require intervention and observation by the nurse to sustain life or promote a comfortable death.

Six lecture hours and eighteen laboratory hours average per week per semester.* Laboratory fee \$8.00.

NURS 41204. Nursing in Health Care Systems

12 semester hours

Prerequisite: NURS 41203

The focus is on leadership functions of the nurse and interdisciplinary approaches to care in both hospital and community settings.

Student learning experiences include: applying concepts of wellness and illness, analyzing existing health care systems and patterns of health delivery and examining the health care issues which affect the practice of professional nursing.

The student deals with individuals, families and groups within the health care system who are dependent upon interaction of health professionals to promote or regain their former healthy status of living.

Six lecture and eighteen laboratory hours average per week per semester.* Laboratory fee \$8.00.

NURS 41521. Nursing Process: Individualized Patient Care

15 semester hours

Prerequisite: NURS 32020

The focus of this course is the study of factors contributing to the uniqueness of individuals and families. This knowledge is acquired through study of concepts such as autonomy, adaptation, body image, and perception. The roles assumed by the patient as well as the roles assumed by the nurse are explored.

The individuals and families with whom the student deals require assistance in regaining physically and emotionally healthy living patterns. Classroom and clinical experience.

NURS 51622. Nursing Care and Health Care Systems 16 semester hours

Prerequisite: NURS 32020, 41521

The focus of this course is on the planning, implementation and evaluation of care for individuals, families and groups who are experiencing major health disturbances including crisis. Through the delivery of such nursing care, the student engages in exploration and study of the management and leadership functions of the nurse in hospital as well as community care settings. Classroom and clinical experience.

Elective Courses

Students are required to take a minimum of three semester hours of a nursing elective. Elective courses will be taught if a minimum of ten students enroll in the course. The School reserves the right to cancel a class with fewer than ten students enrolled.

Elective courses will be offered each semester and posted each fall for a twelve month period.

NURS 30111, 30211, 30311. Nursing Intervention in Health Promotion 1 - 3 semester hours

This topic includes courses related to the broad areas of nursing in health promotion as differentiated from nursing in situations where there is an identified illness. The focus of these courses includes individuals and/or groups through the life cycle.

NURS 30112, 30212, 30312. Nursing Intervention in 111ness 1 - 3 semester hours

These courses include those related to nursing in the broad practice area of nursing of patients with identified illness or dysfunction. Patients include individuals or groups of all ages. Courses focus on a variety of types of patients and a wide range of practice situations.

NURS 30113, 30213, 30313. Professionalism, Issues and Concepts 1 - 3 semester hours

This topic includes courses related to the broad areas of functional aspects of health care delivery from either a nursing or interdisciplinary health professions perspective.

*The lecture and laboratory hours are calculated on the basis of fifty minute clock hours.

Nine lecture hours = 7½ clock hours Six lecture hours = 5 clock hours Eighteen lab hours = 15 clock hours

GRADES, PROMOTION, AND GRADUATION

Grades

The standing of students in their work is expressed by grades made up from classwork and examinations. There are five grades: A (excellent), B (above average), C (average), D (pass), F (failure). Students may also register in certain courses on a pass-fail basis, in which case the grade is recorded as either Credit (CR) or Fail and no letter grade is assigned.

After being reported to the Registrar, a grade may not be changed unless an error has been made by the instructor.

Although a grade of D gives credit in a non-clinical nursing course, a minimum semester hour grade average of C is necessary for progress toward a degree. In computing this average, the following points are used:

A = 4 points

B = 3 points

C - 2 points

D = 1 points

F = 0 points

Incomplete Class or Laboratory Work

With the permission of the course instructor a grade of Incomplete (I) may be recorded if a student has not completed all class or laboratory assignments.

Incomplete work must be made up within four months after the symbol I is recorded, provided the student does not wish to progress immediately to the next course. If a student wishes to enroll in the next required course, the Incomplete must be removed by the 12th class day of the following semester.

Incomplete grades not completed within the specified time shall be changed to the grade of \underline{F} and the course must be repeated if credit is desired.

Examinations

Examinations must be taken at the date and time scheduled. If extenuating circumstances prevent the student from taking an examination, prior approval must be granted by the course instructor to postpone the examination. If a student misses an examination without prior approval by the instructor, a grade of 0 will be recorded for the examination.

Reports of Grades

Intrasemester Report from the Dean

At the middle of each semester, the faculty report to the Dean all students doing work below the passing grade. The Dean, in turn, forwards such reports to the student.

Semester Reports

Grade reports are sent to all students at the end of each semester.

Clinical Nursing Courses

A student must earn a minimum grade of C in each clinical nursing course. A grade of F in either laboratory or theory in a clinical nursing course results in a grade of F in that course. If a student earns a grade of less than C in a clinical nursing course and is in good standing in the School of Nursing, the course may be repeated one time. A student may not repeat more than two clinical nursing courses, excluding electives, which have been failed or withdrawn failing.

Repetition of a Failed Course

A student may request to repeat a course in the School of Nursing which was failed. This request will be referred to the Admission, Promotion and Graduation Committee for consideration. Students newly admitted and enrolled students have priority consideration for admission over repeating students. If the course is prerequisite to the next clinical course, the course must be repeated with at least a C before proceeding to the next course.

If a student is allowed to repeat a course which was failed in the School of Nursing, the official grade is the last one made. The official grade will be the one used in computing a student's grade point average, and although the failing grade will be on the permanent record, it will not be included in computation. A student may not repeat a course for credit in which the final grade was a \underline{C} or better.

Adding Courses

After registration, during the first four class days of any semester or the first two class days of any summer session, a student may add a course with the approval of the instructor, and the Dean.

Dropping Courses

Dropping refers to the procedure by which students remove themselves from one or more of the courses in which they are enrolled, while continuing in the remainder of their courses.

A student may drop a course under the following provisions:

- Students may, with the approval of their faculty coordinators and the Dean, drop a course at any time during the first four weeks of classwork of any semester, or during the first two weeks of classwork of any summer session, without having a grade recorded in the course.
- 2. With the approval of the instructor and Dean a student may drop a course at any time before the last day of classes in any semester or before final examination time in any summer session, if a C average was maintained at the time of the drop. The symbol Q is then recorded to indicate a drop without prejudice or penalty.

3. After the first four weeks of classwork of any semester, or after the first two weeks of any summer session, the Dean may permit a student to discontinue attending a class in which the student is not making a grade of at least C and shall advise the instructor that a grade of F should be reported at the end of the semester.

Withdrawal

Withdrawal refers to the procedure by which students remove themselves from all courses in which they are enrolled. A student wishing to withdraw from the School of Nursing for the remainder of a particular session initiates the process through the Student Information Office.

If an undergraduate student withdraws from The University of Texas School of Nursing, with proper permission, after the first four weeks of a regular semester or the first two weeks of a summer session, the symbol \underline{W} will be recorded for those courses in which a passing grade is maintained and the symbol \underline{F} for those which are failed. If a student withdraws from a clinical course while failing, petition for re-enrollment is permitted only once. Applications for readmission will be reviewed by the Admission, Promotion and Graduation Committee.

It should be clearly understood by all students that the Dean and Faculty of the School of Nursing have the authority to request the withdrawal from school, to drop from the rolls, and refuse re-admission of any students at any time if circumstances of a legal, moral, health, social or academic nature are considered to justify such action.

Changing Course Registration to or from Pass-Fail

Students may change their registration in a course from a Pass-Fail basis to a letter grade basis or from a letter grade basis to a Pass-Fail basis not later than the end of the official drop period which is the first four weeks of the regular semester and the first two weeks of the summer session.

CREDIT BY EXAMINATION

Credit by examination is validation of the candidate's competencies and the awarding of credit based upon satisfactory achievement on examinations. The candidate is then allowed to matriculate the courses appropriate for the demonstrated level of achievement. Credit by examination is not offered for nursing elective courses.

For Levels I, II, III, and IV

- To petition for such an examination, an individual must have met all requirements for admission to upper division courses in the School of Nursing.
- 2. The candidate should consult the Office of Student Services regarding applications, policies and scheduling.
- A student may not take an examination for credit in a course which was previously completed with either a passing or failing grade.
- 4. A student who is enrolled in the course must be in good standing in the course in order to take the examination.

- 5. A candidate for "credit by examination" will have access to any and all materials in campus learning centers, but will not receive tutoring by School of Nursing faculty in preparation for the examination.
- 6. A candidate for "credit by examination" may audit any or all of the lecture portion of any course in The University of Texas School of Nursing at San Antonio (subject to University audit fees).
- 7. A candidate for examination will be assigned to a faculty adviser, teaching in the course to be challenged, whose function will be to clarify the intent of the examination and to provide feed back on the results.
- 8. A nonrefundable fee of \$25.00 will be assessed each candidate writing the examination.
- 9. Fifty one semester credit hours can be awarded by "credit by Examination".
- 10. Only after the student is registered in the degree program, will credit be granted for a grade of C or higher on the examination.
- 11. The student may elect to have the credit recorded as a "pass" or as the actual grade achieved. In the latter event, the grade is included in computing the cumulative grade point average. No notation appears on the permanent record when the examination is failed.
- 12. Credit earned by examination shall not reduce by a corresponding amount courses which may be taken on a pass-fail basis.
- 13. A candidate may not retake any examination.

Flexible Option Process

The first course in the flexible option process, 32020 Nursing Intervention in Impaired Health States, must be taken as "credit by examination." The second and third courses, 41521 Nursing Process: Individualizing Patient Care and 41622 Nursing Care and Health Care Systems, will be taken in residence.

- 1. To petition for such an examination, an individual must have met all requirements for admission to upper division courses in the School of Nursing.
- 2. The candidate should consult the Office of Student Services regarding applications, policies and scheduling.
- A student may not take an examination for credit in a course which
 was previously completed with either a passing or failing grade.
- 4. A candidate for "credit by examination" will have access to any and all materials in campus learning centers, but will not receive tutoring by School of Nursing faculty in preparation for the examination.
- 5. A nonrefundable fee of \$25.00 will be assessed each candidate writing the examination.
- 6. Successful completion of 32020 Nursing Intervention in Impaired Health States will result in the awarding of 20 semester hours of credit.
- 7. A candidate who fails 32020 Nursing Intervention in Impaired Health States has one opportunity to retake the course for credit.

PLEXIBLE OPTION PROCESS

Description

The Flexible Option is an alternative approach to the undergraduate program which is designed for individuals who are able to exhibit a variety of nursing knowledges and skills at the time of entry into the nursing program. The expectations of the students in relation to knowledge and skills is the same as in the undergraduate program described earlier. The content of the flexible option process is the same as the content of the undergraduate program but has been reorganized to facilitate concentrated study.

The process is two semesters in length (beginning Fall and ending Spring semester) and includes evening and week-end classes as well as planned clinical experience. It is designed so an individual can maintain full time employment while enrolled.

In addition to the required activities of the flexible option process, each student must complete nine semester hours of upper division electives. Three semester hours of electives must be in nursing; six of the elective hours may be taken at any college or university in courses at the junior and senior level.

Students who successfully complete this process will be awarded the degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

Admission Requirements

Admission requirements for the flexible option process are the same as those for the undergraduate program. Please refer to that section of the catalogue for a description of the requirements and policies.

Requirements for Graduation

Successful completion of the flexible option process in nursing, and successful completion of the nine (9) semester hours of elective courses.

CORRESPONDENCE WORK BY RESIDENT STUDENTS

Students wishing to enroll for correspondence courses and/or courses in another institution while enrolled in the School of Nursing must obtain permission from the Dean for such courses to be accepted for credit by the School of Nursing. Students must be in good scholastic standing and must have demonstrated their ability to carry the increased course load to receive such permission.

Not more than 12 hours of the 120 hours required for the degree may be taken by correspondence.

PREVIOUS COLLEGE COURSE WORK

Transferred grades are recorded as submitted. Only grades of courses taken at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio Nursing School are used in computation of grade point average.

An applicant, whether a new student or a former student of the School of Nursing who has attended another college, will submit all previous college records when applying for admission to the School of Nursing.

Former students who attend another institution are responsible for getting a transcript of their records to the School of Nursing before reentering.

RESERVATION OF WORK BY UNDERGRADUATES FOR GRADUATE CREDIT

Undergraduate students in the School of Nursing may be admitted to graduate courses in nursing only in the last semester of the senior year and hours thus taken may not be counted toward the undergraduate degree in nursing.

Courses taken by undergraduate students which are to be reserved for graduate credit may be applied toward the graduate degree only after the student has been admitted to and is enrolled in the graduate program.

GRADUATION

Requirements

- 1. To be eligible for graduation, a student must have a 2.0 grade point average for the required 60 semester hours of upper division course work. At least 36 of the last 60 semester hours of the nursing major must be completed in residence at The University of Texas School of Nursing.
- 2. A student must have returned all property of the University and have met all financial obligations due the University.
- 3. A student must complete requirements for the degree within four years of the date of entry into the school.

Procedures

A student must supply the School of Nursing with transcripts of courses taken outside the school, as the courses are completed. After registering for initial upper-division courses in the major, a student is then notified of the courses lacking and the requirements that must be satisfied to receive the degree.

Students may enroll in absentia in the semester in which they expect to receive their degree while completing requirements for that degree.

A candidate for a degree must (1) register in the semester in which the degree is to be received and (2) apply for a degree by filing a "Diploma Name Card" with the Office of Student Services, preferably at registration, in the term in which the degree is to be granted.

Degrees will be conferred only on official dates publicly announced.

Convocation will be held once a year in December to honor prospective graduates. Graduation exercises will be held in May.

GRADUATION WITH HONORS

To be graduated with honors a student must have the following gradepoint average on upper-division hours in nursing taken in the School of Nursing:

Registration as a Professional Nurse

All students seeking registration must take and pass the State Board Test Pool Examination, administered by the Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas. The Board of Nurse Examiners may refuse to admit persons to its examinations or may refuse to issue a license or certificate of registration for any of the following reasons:

- the violation, or attempted violation, of any of the provisions of the law regulating the practice of professional nursing;
- (2) conviction of a crime of the grade of felony, or a crime of a lesser grade which involves moral turpitude.
- (3) the use of any nursing license, certificate or diploma which has been fraudulently purchased, issued, counterfeited, or materially altered;
- (4) the impersonation of, or the acting as proxy for, another in any examination required by this law to obtain a license as a registered nurse;
- (5) intemperate use of alcohol or drugs which, in the opinion of the Board, endangers patients;
- (6) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct which, in the opinion of the Board, is likely to injure the public.

Application for registration by examination requires submission of a complete application and transcripts of all work completed at least one month in advance of the State Board Test Pool Examination. The following procedures will be followed by the School of Nursing and the applicant:

- (1) Students will receive the application form and instructions for completion approximately one month prior to graduation.
- (2) The application is to be completed, notarized, and returned to the Student Services Office as soon as possible with the registration fees.
- (3) The second set of transcripts submitted at the time of admission to upper-division nursing courses will be submitted with the application and fees. If the student has failed to file the second set of transcripts on admission, it will be necessary to furnish them at this time, and a delay in application may result.

- (4) All 120 hours for the degree must be completed before the student is eligible to take the State Board Test Pool Examination and obtain a temporary permit.
- (5) Students planning to take the State Board Test Pool Examination in another state must obtain information regarding procedure from the agency responsible for professional nurse registration in that state.

STUDENT POLICIES

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT

A student's combined employment and semester - hour load should not exceed 40 hours per week in either long-session semester or summer terms.

Students may be employed as nursing aides, performing functions for which they have been trained by the institution and for which the institution has a clearly discernible policy either in writing or by precedent defining the scope of these functions. Any individual not licensed in the State of Texas to practice professional nursing, and who engages in such practice, is doing so illegally and may be prosecuted accordingly. Supervision by a professional, licensed nurse does not provide protection to the student or make the student's actions legal.

Students should be aware that 1) the School of Nursing assumes no responsibility for their activities as an employee of an agency: 2) they are personally responsible and liable for any activity they participate in while employed; 3) professional liability insurance purchased by students through the School of Nursing is only valid in their student role, not their employment role; 4) individuals who practice illegally may jeopardize their future since persons who are convicted of violation of the Nurse Practice Act may not be eligible to write State Board examinations and subsequently receive licensure.

Students employed in an agency have responsibility, personally and professionally, to engage in only those activities which fall within their job description as non-professional workers (i.e., aides). They have a responsibility to refuse to participate in activities which they have not been legally licensed to perform (i.e., giving medication, assuming total responsibility for a division, etc.).

Students may not wear their student patch or student name tag while employed.

PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

All nursing students enrolling in nursing courses will be required, prior to official registration, to show evidence of professional liability insurance coverage in at least a minimum amount of \$5,000 limit each claim and \$15,000 limit aggregate. The policy must cover a two-year period to begin the first class day and to provide coverage through the last Level IV class day. If the student withdraws, the insurance carrier will normally refund the unused portion of the premium.

UNIFORMS

Students are responsible for purchasing white uniforms and laboratory coats. Name pins will be available for a small fee through the School of Nursing. Identification patches will be worn on all uniforms and laboratory coats and may be purchased from the Health Science Center Bookstore.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If students, after registration, change their home or their campus address, they are expected to notify the Office of Student Services. They will be held responsible for a communication from the School Offices sent to them at the address last given.

RELEASE OF TRANSCRIPTS AND ACADEMIC RECORDS

Transcripts and other information from a student's academic records will be released by the Registrar only upon written request from the student or other person authorized by law. Transcript service will be provided to registered students at no charge and 3 transcripts will be given upon graduation. A one dollar (\$1.00) per transcript charge will be made for any additional transcripts.

FULL TIME STUDENT STATUS

A full-time undergraduate student is one who is registered for 12 or more semester hours during a regular semester. Full-time enrollment is six or more semester hours in one summer session or nine hours in two sessions of one summer.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Tuition and Fees

Tuition charges, as indicated below, are the same for both residents and non-residents of Texas. Tuition and fees are subject to change at any time by legislative or Regental action.

Late Registration Fee

A late registration fee of \$5.00 will be charged for any student registering after the date of official registration. This fee may be waived only in extenuating circumstances by the Dean or the Dean's delegate. The late registration fee is not refundable.

Fee for Credit by Examination

A fee of \$ 25.00 per examination will be required of undergraduate students who seek credit by examination. Procedures are set forth in the Credit by Examination section.

Fees for Auditing Nursing Courses

Students enrolled in nursing courses may audit additional nursing courses at a cost of \$5.00 for each additional course.

Students not enrolled in nursing courses may audit nursing courses at a cost of \$25.00 for each course.

Other Expenses

Uniforms, cap, shoes, name pin and identification patch are all purchased prior to the first nursing course at an approximate cost of \$100.00.

Cost of books and supplies is estimated to be approximately \$200.00.

Students should all have a watch with a second hand and a pair of bandage scissors and a stethoscope.

REFUND OF TUITION AND FEES

Regular Session

Any student officially withdrawing from school during the first week of class work will receive a refund of 70 percent of the refundable fees; during the second week the amount will be 60 percent; during the third week, 40 percent; and during the fourth week, 20 percent. No refunds are made upon withdrawal during the fifth week and thereafter and in no case shall the total refund exceed 70 percent of the tuition and fees.

Summer Session

Any student officially withdrawing the first, second, or third class day will receive a refund of 70% of the refundable fees; the fourth, fifth, or sixth day, the amount will be 60%. No refunds are made upon withdrawal the seventh class day and thereafter.

Refunds will be prepared within 30 days and mailed to the student's forwarding address left with the Registrar.

FINANCIAL AID

Financial assistance may be given in the form of low interest loans, grants, scholarships, work-study, or a combination of these. Financial aid is awarded to students on the basis of need.

Inquiries and application for financial assistance should be directed to the Financial Aid Administrator, Office of Student Services, The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, 7703 Floyd Curl Drive, San Antonio, Texas 78284 - 512-696-6957.

The dates when applications for student financial assistance are due are as follows:

Nine-month academic year -- May 1
Fall semester only -- May 1
Spring semester only -- October 1
Summer only -- March 1

Students who have been awarded financial assistance will receive their money soon after the beginning of each semester. The student should make certain, however, that sufficient funds are available for initial expenses in the event there should be some delay in the disbursement of checks.

Some of the sources of financial assistance for students are as follows:

Nurse Training Act

This act authorizes funds of various types for assistance to nursing students. While some funds may be available for scholarships and traineeships, most of the assistance will be in the form of loans, as follows:

All undergraduate postsecondary students are eligible to apply for Basic Grant Assistance. No annual payment of a basic grant can exceed one-half of the costs of education or \$1400, which ever is less. Additional information and an Application for determination of Family Contribution may be obtained from the Financial Aid Office.

State Tuition Scholarships Program

Enacted by the 62nd Legislature, this Program provides for scholarships covering all or any part of tuition costs for students in financial need entolled in State supported baccalaureate nursing programs.

Allstate Foundation Scholarships

Through the generosity of the Allstate Foundation, a limited number of scholarships are available for students in the basic baccalaureate program.

Vocational Rehabilitation

The Texas Rehabilitation Commission offers assistance for tuition and non-refundable fees to students who have certain disabling conditions provided their vocational objectives have been approved by a TRC counselor.

Examples of such conditions are orthopedic deformities, emotional disorders, diabetes, epilepsy, heart conditions, etc. Other services are also available to assist the handicapped student to become employable. Application for such service should be made at:

Mary Margaret Moran Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 1975 given in the memory of Mary Margaret Moran, a nurse employed at Veterans Administration Hospital in San Antonio. Recipients of this scholarship must be academically outstanding, financially in need, and professionally dedicated. Contact the Financial Aid Administrator in the Office of Student Services for an application or additional information.

The Nursing Student Loan Program

Funds are provided for low-cost loans to nursing students. The maximum total for one student for any one academic year is \$2,500 and a total of \$10,000 is the maximum amount which may be awarded to any one student for all the years in school. Loan provisions include cancellation of all or part of the loans for service in nursing under specified circumstances following graduation.

Hinson-Hazelwood College Student Loan Program

Only legal residents of Texas qualify for this loan. The program requires that an applicant be enrolled or accepted for at least one-half the normal course load.

Students may borrow up to \$1,500 per academic year provided the total amount does not exceed \$7,500 at any time. Summer loans not to exceed \$500 may be made in addition to loans made for the nine-month academic year.

Funds will be available approximately eight weeks after an application has been approved.

Federally Insured Loan Program

Under this program a student may borrow as much as \$2,500 per year, not to exceed \$10,000 for all years of school, from a bank or other financial institution, although the application must first be certified by the educational institution.

Basic Educational Opportunity Crant Program

The Basic Educational Opportunity Grant Program is authorized under Sub Part 1 of Part A of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended by the Education Amendments of 1972.

Emergency Loan Funds

Students enrolled in The University of Texas Health Science Center School of Nursing for at least half-time are eligible for participation in the Student Short Term and Student Emergency Loan Fund programs. Contact the Financial Ald Administrator in the Office of Student Services for additional information regarding these funds.

GRADUATE PROGRAM LEADING TO MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

PHILOSOPHY OF GRADUATE EDUCATION

The graduate faculty of The University of Texas School of Nursing at San Antonio believes that graduate programs in nursing should be designed to provide qualified individuals with an education which will enable these persons to make significant contributions to the improvement of health care and the advancement of nursing practice. Furthermore, such education should emphasize the holistic individual

The content of graduate education for nurses has relevance to the theory and practice of nursing, the present and future role of nursing in the health system, and the social and ethical problems related to the professional issues. Such content is designed to prepare nurses to assume principal functional roles as educators, researchers, administrators, clinical specialists, consultants, or varied combinations of these roles.

The master's program is directed toward achievement by the student of the following objectives:

- Consistent demonstration of a high level of competence in the selected areas of nursing based on understanding of the holistic individual.
- 2. Application of principles of teaching, administration or clinical specialization in a creative manner,
- 3. Consistent demonstration of a critical, logical and analytic approach to problems,
- 4. Acceptance of responsibility for personal, professional and educational development.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A baccalaureate degree in nursing from a nursing program accredited by the National League for Nursing. Applicants who have a baccalaureate degree in a field other than nursing shall be required to take and pass examinations for each of the four required upper division nursing courses in The University of Texas School of Nursing at San Antonio undergraduate curriculum as a condition of admission.
- 2. A basic statistics course which must be completed prior to enrollment or during the first semester of the master's program.
- 3. Licensure as a registered nurse.
- 4. A minimum gradepoint average of B (3.0 on a 4.0-point scale) for all upper division and graduate courses undertaken.
- 5. A minimum score of 1,000 on the Graduate Record Examinations Aptitude Test or a minimum score of 50 on the Miller Analogies Test. The scores must not be more than five years old.
- 6. Satisfactory academic and professional references.
- 7. All undergraduate course deficiencies must be removed prior to a student's enrollment in graduate study, with the exception of the basic statistics course (see 2. above).
- 8. Approval of admission of the applicant by the Graduate Admissions, Promotions and Graduation Committee of the School of Nursing. An interview with this committee may be requested.
- 9. Approval of admission of the applicant by the Graduate Executive Committee of The University of Texas Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at San Antonio.
- 10. For successful applicants, a health and physical examination completed with in three months prior to enrollment and reported on a form provided by the School of Nursing.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Application materials should be requested from the Office of Student Services. The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, 7703 Floyd Curl Drive, San Antonio, Texas 78274 (phone (512) 696-6421).

Completed application forms, evidence of current licensure as a registered nurse and physical examination forms should be returned to the above office. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that each of the following materials required to complete the application is sent directly to the Graduate Admissions Office by the person or organization concerned (not acceptable if sent by applicant);

- An official transcript from each college, university or professional school attended.
- 2. Four reference reports.
- 3. Report of score on GRE Aptitude or Miller Analogies Test.

The Graduate Record Examinations Aptitude Test consists of two parts, verbal and quantitative; the sum of the score on both parts is used as a criterion for admission. The Educational Testing Service administers this test at a multiplicity of designated college and university centers throughout the world on assigned dates in January, February, April, June, October and December of each year. An information bulletin and application may be obtained from the Graduate Admissions Office, or directly from Graduate Record Examinations, Educational Testing Service, Box 955, Princeton, New Jersey 08540. The test scores should be requested to be forwarded by the ETS directly to the Graduate Admissions Office, The University of Texas Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences at San Antonio (Code R-6908-8). Applications for taking the test must be submitted to the ETS about four weeks in advance, and scores are reported about six weeks after the test.

The Miller Analogies Test consists of 100 questions stated in the form of analogies. An information booklet listing the various college and university testing centers can be obtained from The Psychological Corporation, 304 East 45th Street, New York, New York 10017. The MAT is administered frequently at many of these centers, and the scores are usually reported within two weeks. The scores should be reported by the testing center directly to the Graduate Admissions Office.

Late Applications

Completed applications must be received by May 1 for the Fall Semester and by October 1 for the Spring Semester. Early filing is strongly encouraged. Applications received after the deadline will be considered only if there is space available.

ARMY NURSING PROGRAM

Nursing in the United States Army enrolled in Army Nurse Clinician courses may receive twelve semester hours of credit toward the graduate degree. The clinician courses are currently offered at the following facilities: Fitzsimons Army Medical Center, Denver, Colorado 80240; William Beaumont Army Medical Center, El Paso, Texas 79920; Martin Army Hospital, Fort Benning, Georgia 31905; Academy of Health Sciences, Brooke Army Medical Center, Fort Sam Houston, Texas 78234; Womack Army Hospital, Fort Bragg, North Carolina 28307; Silas B. Hays Army Hospital, Fort Ord, California 93941.

Applicants should follow the procedures for all graduate students outlined above, except for submission of the health and physical examination report.

CONDITIONAL ADMISSION

An applicant with less than minimum gradepoint average, GRE Aptitude or Miller Analogies Test score may be admitted conditionally in some cases. Such a student attending full-time will be required to achieve an average of B or better in the first nine semester hours of courses taken toward the degree. Part-time students admitted conditionally will be considered on an individual basis. If these special conditions on admission are not met, the student may be barred from subsequent registration in the graduate program.

SPECIAL ADMISSION

- 1. Applicants who do not meet the admission requirements may receive, in some cases, admission as special students on recommendation by the Graduate Admissions, Promotions and Graduation Committee to the Associate Dean of the Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences. The conditions of this admission will be delineated by the Committee.
- Special students will be given consideration for admission only after the fully qualified students have been admitted.
- 3. Applicants who meet criteria for admission to the graduate program in terms of grade point and MAT/GRE scores but whose records are incomplete pending receipt of State Board of Nurse Examiners Scores and/or transcript for final semester may be classified as special and admitted pending receipt of all documents. They may not remain in the program beyond one semester without removing this condition.
- 4. Applicants who do not qualify for the master's program but wish to take graduate courses may apply for admission as a special student to register for no more than two courses in the master's program. Credit for these courses toward the master's degree will be considered if the applicant is fully admitted.
- 5. Students who have been accepted in the graduate program of another accredited university and are in good standing may apply for admission as a special student to register for no more than three courses in the School of Nursing. Consent of the nursing faculty teaching each course must be secured. A transcript from the university from which the student is presently enrolled is required.
- 6. Students enrolled in other programs in The University of Texas who desire to take courses in the School of Nursing may apply for admission as a special student to register for courses with the permission of the instructor.

PROCEDURE AFTER ADMISSION

Successful applicants will be informed by mail about their admission and any condition imposed. Upon receipt of registration materials, students should contact their graduate advisor to finalize the details of registration and a course plan. Students must have their course plans approved each semester by their graduate advisor before they can register for courses.

All graduate students are required, prior to official registration, to show evidence of professional liability insurance coverage.

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING

The program leading to the Master of Science in Nursing degree spans three regular semesters. While selected graduate courses may be offered during summer session, students should not anticipate completing the program in less than three regular semesters of full-time study. The curriculum is organized into five areas: (1) core courses, (2) research, (3) specialized clinical content courses, (4) functional content courses in teaching, administration, or clinical specialization, and (5) electives. The student may complete a general program meeting the minimum requirements for the degree.

For this degree, a minimum of 36 semester hours of upper-division and graduate courses is required, including at least 18 semester hours taken in The University of Texas School of Nursing at San Antonio, six of which may be for thesis. The maximum number of semester hours of upper-division level course work which may be included is nine. All course work must be completed within five years of admission to the program. Completion of from two to three courses (8-9 semester hours) in a selected clinical area constitutes a clinical concentration, and completion of two courses (6-8 semester hours) in a functional area constitutes a functional concentration. Clinical areas offered include medical-surgical, psychiatric and maternal/parent-child health nursing. Functional areas include teaching, administration and clinical specialization. Elective courses may be taken outside the School of Nursing.

TRANSFER OF CREDIT

All academic work for the Master of Science Nursing is usually completed within The University of Texas School of Nursing at San Antonio. However, students may with the approval of their advisor, transfer from another accredited institution, a maximum of six semester hours of graduate credit applicable to a course of study leading toward the Master of Science Nursing degree. Additional general education graduate courses may be transferred from other accredited institutions upon the approval of the Graduate Curriculum Committee of the School of Nursing with the number not to exceed an additional six semester hours of credit.

For the approval of transfer credit:

- 1. The student must be enrolled in The University of Texas School of Nursing at San Antonio.
- 2. The enrolled student must submit:
 - Title and number of course(s) to be considered.
 - b. Official catalogue description containing the course title(s), number(s), and description(s) from the catalogue in effect at the time the course was taken.
 - c. A statement by the student indicating how the content of the course(s) applies to M.S.N. program.
- Course credits under consideration must be a part of a planned program of study approved by the Committee on Graduate Studies.
- 4. The student is responsible for requesting that an official transcript be sent from the institution in which the course was taken.

All courses must have been completed no more than five years before the degree is awarded. Courses in which a grade of C or less has been earned will not be authorized for transfer.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

Courses completed by correspondence are not accepted for graduate credit.

RESIDENCE

Each degree candidate must complete two semesters of full-time study, or the equivalent, in residence at The University of Texas School of Nursing at San Antonio. No student may receive advice and assistance from a member of the faculty in the preparation of the thesis without being registered (if necessary, for multiple semesters) for the thesis.

IN ABSENTIA ENROLLMENT

It is a requirement that a student be registered for the semester in which he or she graduates. If a candidate has completed the last requirement for a degree including the submission of a thesis and needs to register only for the purpose of having the degree conferred he or she may register in absentia.

Students may enroll in absentia in the School of Nursing during the semester in which they expect to receive the Master of Science in Nursing degree while completing requirements for that degree at another university. These are the only purposes for which a student may register in absentia. Information concerning the procedure for registration in absentia may be obtained from the Office of the Registrar.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

Students are held responsible for knowing degree requirements and enrolling for courses that fit into their degree programs. The student is likewise held responsible for knowing the School of Nursing regulations with regard to the standard of work required for continuance in the graduate programs. Additional information should be obtained from the graduate advisor.

GRADES AND GRADE POINT AVERAGE

A maximum of six semester hours of electives applicable to each graduate degree may be taken on a credit-no-credit basis and/or pass-fail basis. If the course is taken on credit-no-credit basis and is passed, the symbol <u>CR</u> will appear on the transcript. If failed, no notation will appear on the transcript. Courses taken on a credit-no-credit basis are not computed in the grade point average. If the course is taken on a pass-fail basis and is passed, the symbol <u>P</u> will appear on the transcript, but is not computed in the grade point average; if failed, the symbol <u>F</u> appears on the transcript and is computed as a zero (0) in the grade point average.

Courses in which a student receives a \underline{D} or \underline{F} will not be counted toward the total number of courses and/or hours required for a graduate degree from the School of Nursing. Degree candidates are required to present an overall average of \underline{B} and a \underline{B} average in courses taken in the School of Nursing at the end of their program of study in order to graduate. Thesis courses are not counted in the average.

INCOMPLETE GRADES

Prior to recording a grade of incomplete, a written agreement must be signed by the instructor and student designating a specified time period in which the incomplete would be removed. Should the student fail to meet the terms of the agreement, the grade will be changed to an F.

CONTINUATION IN THE GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Registration in a graduate program beyond the first semester (or summer session) is dependent on two main factors: (1) satisfactory progress in absolving any admission conditions that were imposed and (2) maintenance of a B average for all upper-division and graduate courses taken in a given semester. Should a graduate student achieve less than a B average in a given semester or summer session, the student will be warned that continuance is in jeopardy. During the next semester or summer session in which a graduate student is registered for full-time study at the graduate level, the student must maintain a B average, or automatic dismissal will occur at the end of it; and during this period the student will not be permitted to drop any courses or to withdraw.

ADDING AND DROPPING COURSES

Adding Courses

After registration, during the first four class days of any semester or the first two class days of any summer session, a student may add a course with the approval of the instructor, advisor and the Dean.

Dropping Courses

Dropping refers to the procedure by which students remove themselves from one or more of the courses in which they are enrolled, while continuing in the remainder of their courses.

A student may drop a course under the following provisions:

- 1. Students may, with the approval of the instructor, advisor and the Dean, drop a course at any time during the first four weeks of classwork of any semester or during the first two weeks of classwork of any summer session, without having a grade recorded in the course.
- 2. With the approval of the instructor, advisor and the Dean a student may drop a course at any time before the last day of classes in any semester or before final examination time in any summer session. If a passing grade was maintained at the time of the drop, the symbol WP is then recorded. If the student was failing the course at the time of the drop a WF is recorded.

WITHDRAWAL

Permission for withdrawal from the Graduate Program may be granted by the Dean, on written request by the student, and after consultation with the student's advisor of the program. In the case of withdrawal after the first four weeks of the semester or after the first two weeks of the summer session (and thus the dropping of all courses) the grading symbol WP or WF will be recorded for each course not completed, depending on the student's standing on the last day of enrollment. In the case of withdrawal at the end of a semester or summer session, the appropriate grading symbol, A through F, will be recorded for each completed course, and WP or WF for each course not completed. Any student who withdraws at any time must complete a Terminal Clearance Form at the time of withdrawal. An application for readmission by a student who has previously withdrawn is subject to the same requirements, procedures, and acceptance considerations as apply to first-time applicants.

NURS 50405. Core I. Theoretical Foundation of 4 semester hours
Nursing

Prerequisite: Graduate standing

Philosophical and theoretical basis of concepts and operations inherent in nursing process. Three class hours and three practicum hours a week.

NURS 50406. Core II. Nursing in Clinical Situations 4 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and NURS 50405

Focus on critical analysis of nursing process with selected patients. Two class and six practicum hours a week.

NURS 50207. Professional Nursing--Issues

2 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing

Exploration and evaluation of concerns germane to contemporary nursing. May be taken concurrently with NURS 50405 or NURS 50406. Two seminar hours a week.

NURS 50308. Fundamentals of Research

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and basic statistics course, which may be taken concurrently.

The logic, methods, and techniques of empirical research. Development of a proposal. Three lecture hours a week.

Clinical Major Courses

Medical Surgical Nursing

NURS 50431. Advanced Human Physiology

4 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and an introductory course in physiology.

Advanced concepts and recent research focused on physiological systems of humans and the significance of alterations in their functioning. Required of medical-surgical nursing majors. Four lecture hours a week.

NURS 50332. Medical-Surgical Nursing I

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and NURS 50405, 50431.

Nursing responsibility for assessment and intervention with selected patients of any age who manifest deviations from health and require admission to a health care system. Two class hours and three practicum hours a week.

NURS 50333. Medical-Surgical Nursing II

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and NURS 50332

Nursing responsibility for the continuum of care for selected patients of any age who manifest deviations from health. Two class hours and three practicum hours a week.

Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing

NURS 50441. Psychotherapeutic Nursing/Individuals

4 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing

Theory and clinical practice emphasizing the concepts of language, anxiety, focal attention and self-esteem. Two lecture and six practicum hours a week.

NURS 50342. Nursing Therapy/Groups and Families

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and NURS 50441 (or may be taken concurrently with NURS 50441)

Theory and clinical practice relating to psychiatric groups and families including a patient member. One class and six practicum hours a week.

NURS 50343. Community Mental Health Nursing

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing, NURS 50441 and consent of instructor

Designed to acquaint the graduate student with community mental health (and to assist the student in defining the role of nursing in the mental health movement). One and one-half lecture and four and one-half practicum hours a week.

Maternal/Parent Child Health Nursing

NURS 50350. Maternal/Parent-Child Health Care

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing or consent of instructor

Readings, discussion and selected experiences designed to provide a broad understanding of the field of maternal/child health. Two classes and three practicum hours a week.

NURS 50351. Children with Acute or Chronic Illness

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and NURS 50350 or consent of instructor

Readings, discussion and selected experiences designed to provide a physiological, phychological and sociological basis for nursing practice in the areas of reproduction, parenting and child health. May be repeated as topics vary. One and one-half class hours and four and one-half practicum hours per week.

NURS 50353. Special Problems in Maternal Health Care 3 semester hours

Analysis of the conceptual and theoretical bases for nursing management of the expectant family at risk with emphasis on knowledge and skill necessary to provide intensive nursing care to women experiencing complications arising from or aggravated by pregnancy. May not be offered every year.

NURS 50354. Special Problems in Child Health Care 3 semester hours

The planning and management of health care for children in the context of their family setting, and study of the role of various community agencies in providing health care to the child in the family setting. May not be offered every year.

NURS 50355. Reproductive Physiology 3 semester hours The study of the anatomical structures of the reproductive system and the physiological changes that occur with pregnancy.

NURS 50352. Health Promotion and the Expectant 3 semester hours Family

Prerequisite: NURS 50350 or consent of instructor

In-depth study of a selected aspect of maternal/parent-child health care. Two class hours per week and six practicum hours per week.

Functional Major Courses

Leadership Roles in Nursing

NURS 50461. Nursing Administration

4 semester hours

The application of theories of administration and management related to situations in which nurses work. Four class hours a week.

NURS 50462. Problems and Practicum in Nursing Administration.

4 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and NURS 50461

Proposes and tests hypotheses in nursing administration. Applies theory and concepts to administrative practice in nursing. Two class hours and six practicum hours a week.

Teaching of Nursing

NURS 50471. Curriculum and Instruction in Nursing

4 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing or consent of instructor

The nature of education and the major learning theories. Focus on the development of curricula for a variety of programs in nursing and the design of teaching and learning strategies for their implementation. Four class hours a week.

NURS 50372. Roles of the Teacher in Nursing

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: NURS 50405, 50471 and consent of instructor

Roles and functions of the teacher in contemporary nursing programs. Investigation of the teaching-learning situation of a group of students in a professional, technical or vocational nursing program. One class hour and six practicum hours a week.

Clinical Specialization

NURS 50381. Clinical Specialization I

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing, NURS 50405, (or may be taken concurrently with NURS 50405)

Examination of standards of health care and of health care delivery. Focus on theory and methods of consultation. Three class hours a week.

NURS 50382. Clinical Specialization II

3 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and NURS 50381

The parameters of the role of the clinical specialist. Each student contacts clients, works with them to design their care, and functions interdependently with members of the health team to accomplish patient goals. One class hour and six practicum hours a week.

NURS 60699. Thesis

6 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing, NURS 50308 and consent of instructor

Elective Courses

NURS 50191, 50291, 50391, 50491. Independent Study in Nursing

1, 2, 3, or 4 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and consent of instructor

Detailed or in-depth study in a specific topic area. Topic and mode of study are agreed upon by student(s) and instructor. May be repeated for credit when topics vary. Hours to be arranged.

NURS 50115, 50215, 50315, 50415.
Topics of Special Interest in Nursing

1, 2, 3, or 4 semester hours

Prerequisite: Graduate standing and consent of instructor

Conference courses dealing with areas of special interest. Credit may vary with topic. Registration may be repeated with varied topics.

NURS 50373. Instructional Technology

3 semester hours

Basic production techniques of audio-visual materials. Three class hours per week,

Late Registration Fee

A late registration fee of \$5.00 will be charged for any student registering after the date of official registration. This fee may be waived only in extenuating circumstances by the Dean or the Dean's delegate. The late registration fee is not refundable.

Fees for Auditing Nursing Courses

Students enrolled in nursing courses may audit additional nursing courses at a cost of \$5.00 for each additional course.

Students not enrolled in nursing courses may audit nursing courses at a cost of \$25.00 for each course.

Other Expenses

Cost of books and supplies is estimated to be approximately \$100.00/semester.

REFUND OF TUITION AND FEES

Regular Session

Any student officially withdrawing from school during the first week of class work will receive a refund of 70 percent of the refundable fees; during the second week the amount will be 60 percent; during the third week, 40 percent; and during the fourth week, 20 percent. No refunds are made upon withdrawal during the fifth week and thereafter and in no case shall the total refund exceed 70 percent of the tuition and fees.

Summer Session

Any student officially withdrawing the first, second, or third class day will receive a refund of 60% of the refundable fees the fourth, fifth, or sixth day, the amount will be 50%. No refunds are made upon withdrawal the seventh class day and thereafter.

Refunds will be prepared within 30 days and mailed to the student's forwarding address left with the Registrar.

FINANCIAL AID

Financial assistance may be given in the form of low interest loans, grants, scholarships, work-study, or a combination of these. Financial aid is awarded to students on the basis of need.

Inquiries and application for financial assistance should be directed to the Financial Aid Administrator, Office of Student Services, The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, 7703 Floyd Curl Drive, San Antonio, Texas 78284 - 512-696-6957.

The dates when applications for student financial assistance are due are as follows:

Term

Nine-month academic year -- May 1 Fall semester only -- May 1 Spring semester only -- October 1 Summer only -- March 1

Students who have been awarded financial assistance will receive their money soon after the beginning of each semester. The student should make certain, however, that sufficient funds are available for initial expenses in the event there should be some delay in the disbursement of checks.

Some of the sources for financial aid for graduate students are:

Nurse Training Act authorizes funds for various types of assistance to nursing students. While some funds are awarded as scholarships and traineeships, most assistance will be in the form of loans.

The Nursing Student Loan Program provides funds at low interest rates to nursing students. The maximum for any one student in an academic year is \$2,500 and a total of \$10,000 maximum for all years he or she is in school. Loan provisions include cancellation of all or part of the loans for service in nursing under specified circumstances following graduation.

The Federally Insured Loan Program allows a student to borrow as much as \$2,500 per year from a bank or other financial institution although application must first be certified by the educational institution.

Professional Nurse Traineeships and Psychiatric Mental Health (Graduate)
Traineeships are available to graduate students enrolled full-time who are
citizens of the United States, graduates of a state approved school of nursing,
currently licensed as professional nurses, and who are planning to use the
training for a career.

FULL TIME STUDENT STATUS

A full-time graduate student is one who is registered for 9 or more semester hours during a regular semester. Full-time enrollment is six or more semester hours in one summer session or nine hours in two sessions of one summer.

PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

All nursing students enrolling in nursing courses will be required, prior to offical registration, to show evidence of professional liability insurance coverage in at least a minimum amount of \$5,000 limit each claim and \$15,000 limit aggregate. The policy must provide coverage throughout the student's entire enrollment at the School of Nursing. If the student withdraws, the insurance carrier will normally refund the unused portion of the premium.

UNIFORMS

Graduate students are responsible for purchasing white uniforms and laboratory coats. Name pins will be available for a small fee through the School of Nursing. Laboratory coats may be purchased from the Health Science Center Bookstore.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If a student's home or campus address changes after registration, that student is expected to notify the Office of Student Services. Students will be held responsible for a communication from the school offices sent to them at the address last given.

ORGANIZATIONS

Nursing Student Organization

All students enrolled in the School of Nursing are eligible for membership in the Nursing Student Organization. Through this organization, students have representatives on nursing faculty committees and Health Science Center committees.

National Student Nurse Association

Students may join the National Student Nurse Association which is affiliated with the Texas Nursing Student Association. These organizations work in close cooperation with the American Nurse Association. The purpose of the NSNA is to promote a professional consciousness on the part of students and facilitate nursing activity and action.

Sigma Theta Tau

The Alpha Delta Chapter of Sigma Theta Tau, the only national honor society of nursing, was chartered at The University of Texas on May 25, 1963. There are over seventy-five constituent chapters in collegiate schools of nursing accredited by the National League for Nursing, across the nation. The purposes of Sigma Theta Tau are to: recognize the achievement of scholar-ship of superior quality, recognize the development of leadership qualities, foster high professional standards, encourage creative work and strengthen commitment on the part of individuals to the ideals and purposes of the profession of nursing.

Each year invitations to membership are extended to selected students in either the undergraduate or graduate program who range within the upper one-third of their graduation class. From time to time faculty members and community nursing leaders may be invited to membership.

Program meetings of an educational or scientific nature are held during each semester on each of the campuses.

Alumni Association

The primary purpose of the alumni organization is to further the interests of the School. Through its efforts, loan funds have been established, and students have been encouraged to enter the programs of the School. The membership of approximately 3,600 ex-students from all six campuses of the Schools of Nursing graduates are automatically members of their respective campus Alumni Associations. Dues are not assessed.




