

2. Grant from Tarrant County Charitable Foundation Trust for support of proposal entitled, "Learned Control of Heart Rate." The project director is Dr. Robert J. Gatchel, Assistant Professor of Psychology. The amount of the grant is \$1,000, and the period for completion of the project is October 1, 1974, through September 30, 1975.

GRANTS, CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS (STATE)



PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION CATALOGUE

Dean Lorrin Kennamer, the College of Education, has filed with the Secretary of the University Council the following proposed changes in the College of Education catalogue which were approved by the faculty of the College of Education on June 26, 1975. These changes would appear in the 1976-1978 College of Education catalogue. The <u>Secretary</u> has classified these proposed changes as of exclusive application and primary interest to a single school or college.

FACULTY LEGISLATION:

Notice is hereby given that this legislation will be presented to the Board of Regents for adoption unless a signed protest, with reasons, is received by the Secretary of the University Council from a member of the Council within five working days of the date of this publication. If a protest is received, the proposed legislation will be presented to the University Council for action at its meeting on October 20, 1975.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED CHANGES IN 1976 - 1978 COLLEGE OF EDUCATION CATALOGUE

The proposed amendments and additions to the 1974 - 1976 College of Education catalogue combine the three degrees now offered in the College of Education into one degree, the Bachelor of Science in Education. In most cases the specific degree programs themselves have not been altered. The greatest change has been an increase of six semester hours for secondary education majors which brings that program in line with the 126 hours now required for elementary majors.

Six "Career Options" are listed under the proposed single degree, the sixth of which has innumerable possibilities. The new degree structure has these advantages:

 Student and parental anxiety about making an immediate career choice should be reduced since all students will have at least two semesters to investigate themselves, their interests, and their abilities before they must choose a specific degree program.

2. All of the "Career Options" have the same academic foundations and a student may find it possible to change programs without great penalty as late as the senior year.

3. The new degree program should be easier for students to understand. Each option clearly lists what is required and what kind of credential(s), if any, will be forthcoming upon completion of the program.

FACULTY LEGISLATION:

4. Individualized professional programs are possible under the proposal, programs which can immediately respond to para-professional and professional needs in the various fields of educational service. These fields could include preparation for educational work with Parks and Recreation, Art and Music therapy, adult education, and various youth organizations.

5. The proposal will encourage and accent the need for restructuring and adding courses to meet the changing requirements of new programs. It will force the constant evaluation of College of Education offerings in order to meet the needs of the educational marketplace.

6. The proposal has a flexibility now missing which should encourage better service to the professional educational community.

Amend the body of the section on the "Functions of the College of Education" on page 20 of the 1974-1976 College of Education catalogue to read as follows:

The College of Education performs several functions within The University of Texas at Austin. First, it is a professional school for the initial preparation of teachers for elementary schools and secondary schools. (It-provides-three-bachelor's-degree-programs-for-this-purpose----the Bachelor-of-Science-in-Elementary-Education,-the-Bachelor-of-Science-in Education, -and-the-Bachelor-of-Science-in-Physical-Education. Also acting on behalf of the University Council on Teacher Education, it serves as the selection agent for all those students who pursue legal certification to teach, whether enrolled in the College of Education or some other college of The University of Texas at Austin.

Second, the College of Education provides the professional sequence of

courses for all students preparing to teach while registered in and pursuing a degree from any other college of The University of Texas at Austin. <u>Third, the college offers individualized degree programs which do not lead</u> to teacher certification that are designed to meet the professional needs of educational and youth-serving agencies.

Amend items under the "General Requirements" section beginning on page 24 of the 1974-1976 College of Education catalogue as follows: (At-least-six-hours-of-advanced-course-work-in-the-major-field-of-study 5. must-be-completed-in-residence---Additional-hours-in-the-professional-ormajor-sequence-may-be-required-by-individual-schools-or-colleges-) 6. Of the courses offered for any undergraduate degree, at least six semester hours of upper-division courses in <u>each of two areas of</u> (the-aeademie) specialization(s) and twelve semester hours in the professional development sequence, including student teaching, must be completed in residence at The University of Texas at Austin.

FACULTY LEGISLATION:

11. Each degree program is arranged in the sequence best calculated to insure orderly procedure of the student's college work. Any student, if registering for twelve semester hours or more in a long-session semester, must include a minimum of nine semester hours of courses other than <u>electives as</u> (the-last numbered-item) specified under "Prescribed Work in Academic Foundations" in one of the plans for a degree in the College of Education until each of these requirements has been satisfied. At the Dean's discretion, adjustment may be made when exceptional circumstances exist, or when a student has gained credit through <u>examination</u>, (Advanced-Placement-Examination) or when the student is enrolling for less than twelve semester hours of credit in a long-session semester.

14. Credit by (advanced-standing) examination (by-advanced-placement examination;-or-by-conversion-of-surplus-admission-units) is treated as any other earned credit in meeting degree requirements.

15. Course listings under areas of (academic) specialization(s) are informational. Each total listing defines the nature and distribution of a required specialization; advisers, with the dean's approval, may substitute other courses serving equivalent purposes. Since course offerings are being revised and improved constantly, listings for areas of (academic) specializazation(s) may change with each issue of the catalogue, but total hour and upper-division hour stipulations for each specialization are regulations which can be changed only by action of the General Faculty.

16. (Elective) Requirements under academic foundations may be met by appropriate courses also used in establishing an area of (academic) specialization, but the total number of semester hours required for the degree is unchanged.

18. For graduation, a student must make a grade-point average of at least 2.25 per semester hour on all courses undertaken at The University of Texas at Austin. In addition, <u>a student who has chosen Career Option IV or V must</u> make at least a 2.25 grade-point average on all courses undertaken at The University of Texas at Austin applicable to his areas of specialization. {eandidates-for-the-Bachelor-of-Science-in-Education-degree-or-the-Bachelor

of-Seience-in-Physical-Education-degree-must-make-an-average-of-at-least 2:25-per-semester-hour-on-all-courses-undertaken-at-The-University-of-Texas at-Austin-and-applicable-to-his-areas-of-specialization.) However, in order to enroll in Curriculum and Instruction 667S the student must present a cumulative 2.35 grade-point average on all courses undertaken at the University and a 2.50 grade-point average in both areas of (academic) specialization(s), or a 2.65 grade-point average in one area of (academic) specialization and no less than a 2.25 grade-point average in the other area of (academic) specialization. A student who has chosen Career Option I, II, or III (Gandidates-for-the-Bacheler-of-Science-in-Elementary-Education-degree) must present a <u>cumulative</u> 2.35 grade-point average on (in) all work undertaken at The University of Texas at Austin in order (for-which-a-grade is-recorded) to enroll in Curriculum and Instruction 367C, 667C, 667E, 967E, 667W, and Special Education 667.

Amend the "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Education" beginning on page 27 as follows: (For-Secondary-School-Teachers)

FACULTY LEGISLATION:

The curriculum for the (this) degree has two (three) components: (A) A basic core of liberal studies, called Academic Foundations, which totals forty-eight semester hours; and (B) one of the Career Options with the number of specified hours varying with the option chosen. Each Career Option consists of areas of specialization in subject fields used in public schools or in educational or youth-serving agencies, a professional development sequence of courses, and field experiences. The Career Options include programs for (I) Elementary School Teachers, (II) Kindergarten Teachers, (III) Special Education Teachers, (IV) Secondary School Teachers, (V) Physical Education Teachers, and (VI) Employees in Educational and Youth-serving-agencies. [advanced-study-in-an-academic-specialization,-consisting of-broad-coverage-in-a-field-of-knowledge-(called-a-composite-field)-or-of concentration-in-each-of-two-college-subjects;-(6)-a-sequence-of-professional eourses-and-other-experiences-called-professional-development.] A total of not less than 126 (420) semester hours of credit, forty-two of which must be of upper-division rank, (of-which-at-least-thirty-six-semester-hours-shall be-in-courses-of-upper-division-rank,) is required for the degree. 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BUSINESS CONTRACT ITEMS

Contract between the National Labor Relations Board and the University for a Cooperative Education Program involving alternate periods of planned work experience in National Labor Relations Board offices and related study at the University for one or more cooperative education students. Students employed in the program will be compensated by the NLRB at the GS-3 level of the Federal Pay Scale during their first training period and if retained will be compensated at the GS-4 level during the second period. Page 53: Health Requirements

A medical health data form to be filled out by the applicant (and-a-lieensed Dector-of-Medicine,) must be submitted as part of the normal application. Forms to be used for this purpose will be furnished with the application blank.

Page 58: Application Procedure

(3) A health data form to be completed by the applicant. (and-a-kieensed physician.)

Page 71: Absence and Withdrawals

Students who have been promoted to the next year in the School of Medicine and wish to withdraw to enroll in the Graduate School at the Medical Branch or in another recognized graduate school, must submit a written request to the Office of Admissions and Student Personnel Services. If the request is approved by the <u>Dean of Medicine or his designated representative</u>, the student may delay his registration in the School of Medicine for one calendar year. Each student must submit a written request for readmission and must furnish evidence satisfactory to the Dean of Medicine or his designated representative that he is ready to resume medical studies. The request for readmission must be filed at least one month prior to the proposed date of reentry into the School of Medicine.

Page 78: Scholarship, Grading and Promotion

The exact mechanism of grading (various-types-of) examinations and (or) personal performance varies among the separate departments and course committees. (teachers-and-there-is-no-set-pattern.) The final grade for a reportable period is determined by the majority opinion of the faculty (teachers) involved in the presentation of the course. All final grades are reported to the Office of Student Personnel Services for posting on the permanent record and for release to the student. Grades are reported as follows:

Page 79: Scholarship, Grading and Promotion

National Board Examinations Parts I and II are required of all students and scores are posted on the official transcript. Scores are taken into consideration in determining a student's final grade in <u>some</u> (a-given) subjects and (4ex) eligibility for graduation. The final grades in each grading sequence are presented to an evaluation committee which determines if the respective student is eligible for promotion to the next grading sequence. The following grading and promotions regulations have been adopted by the Faculty of Medicine:

2. In order to be eligible for promotion to the Basic Science Core, Phase II, or the Clinical Science Core, a student must have achieved an overall average of at least 74 and cannot have more than one "D" grade. If more than one "D" is recorded during a grading sequence, the appropriate Evaluation Committee will designate which "D" or "D's" must be removed via reexamination or other requirement. The proper sequencing of make-up work and examinations will be the responsibility of the Office of the Dean of Medicine in cooperation with the appropriate department or course committee. 3. In order to be eligible for graduation or assignment to the Track Program, a student must achieve a grade of at least "C" (74) in each Clinical Science Core course and clerkship. If a student achieves a "D" or "D's" during the Clinical Science Core, remedial work in deficient courses will be scheduled during the first few terms of the Track Program. Coordination of the remedial work will be the responsibility of the selected track coordinator and the Office of the Dean of Medicine.

4. (2_{\star}) Any student who repeats the Basic Science Core or any grading sequence therein may repeat the Clinical Core or Track Program only if recommended by the respective evaluation committee and approved by the Dean of Medicine; however, no student may repeat more than one grading sequence in the Basic Science Core or one phase of clinical studies nor may he repeat a given grading sequence more than one time.

5. Any exceptions to the rules on grading and promotions must be made on the written recommendation of a member of the Faculty of Medicine or a member of the Administration to the respective Evaluation Committee. Any such recommendation and subsequent action must be approved by both the Evaluation Committee and Dean of Medicine and must be reported in writing to the Faculty of Medicine.

Page 80: Degree of Doctor of Medicine

The degree of Doctor of Medicine is awarded upon satisfactory completion of the prescribed curriculum in the School of Medicine, recommendation of the Faculty of Medicine and certification by the Board of Regents. Candidates must (1) be at least 18 years of age at the time the degree is awarded; (2) present evidence of good moral character; (3) offer satisfactory evidence of having properly fulfilled all academic curricula including acceptable (passing) performance on Parts I and II of National Board Examinations, and (4) comply with all necessary legal and financial requirements.

Page 82: Curriculum

The (new) curricular pattern consists of three major divisions, the Basic Science Core, Clinical Science Core and the Track Program. The Basic Science Core consists of Gross Anatomy and Embryology, Microanatomy, Neuroscience, Biochem-istry, Cell Biology, Physiology, Microbiology, Endocrinology, Introduction to Patient Evaluation, Pathology, Pharmacology, Integrated Functional Laboratory, Preventive Medicine and Community Health, Introduction to Clinical Medicine, Radiology, and Medical Ethics. (the-basie-seience-subjects-formerly-taught-in the-first-two-years-of-the-medical-curriculum-plus-three-new-courses,-Endocrinolegy,-Cell-Bielegy-and-Neuroscience,-and-a-patient-related-course,-Introduction to-Patient-Evaluation.) (Thus,-the) The student has patient contact during his initial period of training. The Basic Science Core is scheduled in 4 fifteenweek (periods-or) terms. (with-Term-III-and-Term-IV-being-separated-by-a-four week-waeation-period.) Immediately following Term IV of the Basic Science Core is a ten-week (block-of-time-for-a-concentrated) course in Introduction to Clinical Medicine during which the student rotates through various clinical services, perfects his skills in performing a physical examination, and learns the rudiments of diagnosis. (and-the-operations-of-the-Medical-Branch-Hospitals. The-ten-week-course-in) The Introduction to Clinical Medicine Course facilitates the transition of the student from the Basic Science Core to the Clinical Science Core. (See examples of weekly schedules on pages 。)

Page 86: Clinical Science Core

Courses of instruction in Anesthesiology, Dermatology, Medical Jurisprudence, Neurology, Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology are presented during eight months of the Clinical Science year. (See example of annual schedule.) During the Clinical Science Core, a student must decide whether or not he desires to graduate following the Clinical Core. A student who elects to graduate following the Clinical Science Core, who is academically and personally qualified as determined by a (the-respective) Faculty (Grading-and-Prometions) Committee, and who obtains an approved university internship or residency through the National Intern and Resident Matching Program or through individual arrangements, will be permitted to graduate and to enter postgraduate training rather than to enroll for the Track Program.

A student who does not elect to graduate after the Clinical Science Core or who fails to qualify for graduation at this time will, if he progresses normally, enroll for the Track Program. (Essentially, the) The Track Program is a 48week elective period in which the student selects from among specialty tracks in accordance with his career goals. These tracks permit the student to plan his program in association with faculty counselors. The Track Program <u>is</u> (will-be) sufficiently flexible to permit the student to concentrate his studies in a given discipline or to explore the various clinical services or basic science programs. Each medical and surgical specialty has a track which includes obligatory (track-segments) and elective segments. Tracks are also available in the basic sciences and permit a student to work toward a Master of Arts or Doctor of Philosophy degree in addition to the Doctor of Medicine degree. Page 88: Track Program

The Track Program does not lend itself to a general listing of clock-hour requirements. Tracks may vary in structure according to the courses planned by the students. In general, the Track Program consists of <u>forty-eight weeks</u> (six-8-week-periods-or-terms) of a minimum of 40 hours/week. Eight of the forty-eight weeks is a free elective, part or all of which may be taken as a vacation. However, eight of the forty-eight weeks may be taken as a vacation and the student may spend 1,600 clock hours on the basis of a 40 hour week schedule.

Page 96: Interdisciplinary Courses

(Behavioral-Science-Designed-to-introduce-the-entering-medical-students-to Behavioral-Science-concepts-as-they-apply-to-the-delivery-of-health-care-Emphasis-is-placed-on-the-sociaologica,-psychological-and-cultural-variables involved-in-the-concepts-of-health-and-disease---In-addition,-attention-is given-to-behavioral-areas-where-cultural-norms-are-frequently-confused-with seientific-fact.-A-liberal-use-of-visual-aids-are-built-into-the-curriculum-in an-effort-to-make-the-material-presented-relevant-to-the-practice-of-medicine. Introduction to Patient Evaluation.--This interdisciplinary course is conducted by the Departments of Psychiatry, Medicine, Surgery, Pediatrics, (and) Obstetrics and Gynecology, (*) Family Medicine, and Preventive Medicine and <u>Community Health</u>. It is built around the study and practice of the art of interviewing patients to determine their emotional and physical health. Several videotapes are made of each student as he interviews a patient. By this means, the student studies and improves his own interviewing technique. The course also includes year-long weekly seminars of ten students and two faculty members, as well as whole class lectures on the psychological development of the human from infancy to old age. The latter part of the course is devoted to the study of human sexuality.

Page 97: Interdisciplinary Courses

Medical Ethics.--An introductory course designed to acquaint students with the nature of ethical conflicts among physicians, patients, and community groups. Emphasis is placed on historical and philosophical analyses. Students meet in small groups to discuss physician oaths. codes of medical ethics, traditions and reforms in professional ethics, euthanasia, abortion, informed consent, and other significant legacies and problems in medical ethics. The course is conducted by an interdisciplinary course committee.

Medical Jurisprudence.--Conducted by Galveston lawyers and members of the Institute for the Medical Humanities, this lecture course introduces students to the forensic and legal problems of medical practice, including expert testimony and malpractice.

BUSINESS AGREEMENTS

The following agreements have been negotiated by the Business Manager and have been approved by the Deputy Chancellor, and State Board of Control where applicable. I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

1. Lease Agreement between Carolyn Grant Fay, Lessor and The University of Texas System Cancer Center, Lessee for 1.0000 acres of land in the P. W. Rose Survey, Abstract No. 645, City of Houston, Harris County, Texas. The term of this lease shall be for the period September 12, 1975 through September 11, 1977. The cost for the lease of this property is \$150.00 per month to be paid from auxiliary enterprise funds of the Anderson-Mayfair.

2. Lease Agreement between Center Pavilion Hospital, Inc., Lessor and The University of Texas System Cancer Center, Lessee for 300 square feet of space located in Houston, Harris County, Texas in the Center Pavilion Hospital at 1700 N. Holcombe Boulevard. The term of this lease shall be on a month to month basis not to exceed 24 months for the period beginning November 1, 1975. The cost of this space is \$.50 per square foot per month for a total of \$150.00 per month to be paid from a Federal Contract.

3. Lease UH-8732-L-Houston between Adams Petroleum Center, Lessor and The University of Texas System Cancer Center, Lessee for 2200 square feet of space located in Houston, Harris County, Texas located in the Adams Petroleum Center Building, 6910 Fannin. The term of this lease shall be for 24 months beginning the 1st day of December 1975 through November 30, 1977. The cost of this space is \$.52 per square foot per month for a total of \$1,144.00 per month.

Among the gifts made to the U. T. System Cancer Center by a recent donor was a 1974 Fleetwood 4-door Cadillac. In accordance with the wishes of the donor, the Cancer Center desires to sell the vehicle and apply the proceeds to cancer research. The high bidder for the vehicle was Dr. Benjamin M. Rigor, Sr., a staff member of the U. T. Health Science Center at Houston, with a bid of \$7,000. The Deputy Chancellor has approved this sale to Dr. Rigor. 
