AND IMA HOGG FOUNDATION

Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health and Ima Hogg Foundation to the following institutions and agencies:

1. Can-Do-It, Houston, Texas

Comprehensive Mental Health Day Center for Children - \$10,000

The Ima Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a second and final planning grant for the period January 1, 1985 to December 31, 1985. These funds will be used primarily for the consultation related to the provision of day treatment for Houston children. During the coming year the Can-Do-It consultant, Mr. Paul Waldner, will help to develop guidelines of eligibility for service, assist in designing a brochure for distribution to potential referring agencies and address the issue of day treatment training. Ms. Stephanie Smith, Executive Director will be responsible for the administration of the project.

2. Houston Child Guidance Center, Houston, Texas

Family Crisis Intervention Program - \$122,444

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a grant for the period January 1, 1985 to August 31, 1985. This supplemental grant will enable the Guidance Center to implement a third crisis team for the Family Crisis Intervention Program. As before, the Ima Hogg Foundation monies will be used primarily for salary support of key program staff. Dr. Jay Tarnow, the Executive Director will be responsible for the administration of the program.

3. Houston Child Guidance Center, Houston, Texas

Houston Child Guidance Center Day Treatment Program - \$49,899

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a grant for the period January 1, 1985 to August 31, 1985. These funds will support the developmental phase of the Guidance Center's new day treatment program. This new program addresses a well-recognized need in the community to provide these services for Houston's children. Dr. Jay Tarnow, the Executive Director will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

4. Lutheran Social Service of Texas, Inc., Houston, Texas

Crisis/Emergency Mental Health Services - \$30,000

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a grant for the period March 1, 1985 to February 28, 1986. This grant will allow Lutheran Social Service to provide crisis intervention services to the growing numbers of families for whom this type of intervention is appropriate. Many of these families cannot afford the institutional alternatives to crisis treatment. Dr. Douglas Radabaugh, Regional Director will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

5. Mental Health Association in Texas Austin. Texas

Mental Health Code Committee - \$35,000

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a third-year and final grant for the period February 1, 1985 to January 31, 1986, to aid in the support of the revision and implementation of the Mental Health Code. The Committee will seek to continue work done during the past two years and will engage in the following activities: 1) finalizing proposed revisions to the Code; 2) providing consultation to key persons who implement the Code; 3) holding seminars statewide for general and for target audiences; 4) publishing the Mental Health Code newsletter; 5) producing videotapes and brochures for specific professions, and 6) developing a handbook on the Mental Health Code. Mrs. Stella Mullins, Executive Director will be responsible for administering the program.

6. Department of Psychology, University of Houston

"From Infancy to Adolescence" -- A Proposal to Follow Houston Parent-Child Development Center Families - \$24,088

The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a grant for the period January 1, 1985 to August 31, 1985. This grant will support a follow-up study of children, now young adolescents, who were infants in the original Houston Parent-Child Development Center program. Drawing upon data collected earlier on their personality characteristics, behavior problems, and school achievement, the current study will make a truly significant contribution to understanding the importance of infant stimulation, early family education, and intensive day-care programs for very young children as such treatment programs affect later child development among Mexican-American children. Dr. Dale L. Johnson is responsible for the administration of the program.

7. Timberlawn Psychiatric Research Foundation, Inc., Dallas, Texas

National Conference on Chronically Ill and Emotionally Handicapped Children - \$1,000

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant in the amount of \$1,000 in support of the expenses and honorarium of Dr. John Talbott, President of the American Psychiatric Association, who will be serving as a consultant and speaker in Dallas April 19-21, 1985. Dr. Talbott is an outstanding mental health authority who will participate in a National Conference on the Chronically Ill and Emotionally Handicapped Children. He will consult with the Texas Society of Child Psychiatry concerning the care of children with chronic mental illness, and will serve as a keynote speaker at a program organized by Dr. John G. Looney of Timberlawn Psychiatric Research Foundation, Inc.

8. Department of Sociology, Stephen F. Austin State University

Alzheimer's Disease Conference - \$1,114

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant for the period June 1, 1985 to August 31, 1985. These funds will be used to bring two consultants, Drs. Philip Janson and Charles White, to the "Summer Focus on Aging," a conference devoted to the latest developments in research on Alzheimer's Disease to be held in the summer of 1985. Dr. David L. Petty will be responsible for administration of the project.

9. Department of Psychology, Texas Tech University

Community Parenting Skills Program - \$16,912

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a second-phase grant for the period February 1, 1985 to May 31, 1986. This grant will be used for support of a research/service/training project concerning child behavioral problems in the maintenance and treatment of conduct problem behavior and dysfunctional parent-child relationships. The proposed research is based on the premise that the initiation of new positive interaction behavior on the part of the parent triggers changes in the parent's perceptions of the cause and nature of the child's behavior problem and that these changes, in turn, serve to trigger additional behavior changes that serve to maintain the positive interaction skills. Dr. James E. Maddux and Dr. John H. Harvey will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

10. Department of Educational Psychology, The University of Texas at Austin

Attributional Mediators of Social Anxiety and Inhibition - \$7,613

The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a grant for the period January 1, 1985 through August 31, 1985. This grant is for support of a project to study the degree to which attributions people make about their own social anxiety are related to the inhibition, reticence, and awkwardness they exhibit socially, and to develop a specific kind of educational treatment designed to help individuals cope with such feelings. Dr. Mark R. Leary is responsible for the administration of this project.

11. Department of Preventive Medicine and Community Health, The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston

Aging, Health and Psychological Well-Being: A Three Generational Study of Mexican Americans - \$4,381

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee recommends for approval a second-year grant for the period January 1, 1985 to December 31, 1985. This grant is for the continuation of rigorous analysis of data from a three generational study of Mexican Americans. The research in this second year will be to conduct a number of analyses on the following areas: relationships between sex-role and psychological well-being of men; the influence of intergenerational solidarity on psychological well-being in the middle and younger generations; the interrelationship between alcohol consumption, physical symptoms and depression; and the investigation on whether depression is transmitted intergenerationally within families. Dr. Kyriakos Markides, principal investigator on the study, is responsible for administration of the project.

12. The University of Texas System Cancer Center, M. D. Anderson Hospital and Tumor Institute, Houston, Texas

Living Through Childhood Cancer - A Psychosocial Management Model - \$25,343

The Ima Hogg Foundation is recommending for approval a grant for the period February 1, 1985 to January 31, 1986. This project will restructure the Pediatric Unit to maintain a more normal flow of life for children receiving cancer treatment. The past decade has seen significant

advances in the treatment of cancer and the number of children surviving this disease has increased dramatically. Many of the treatments, including surgery, radiation, and chemotherapy, create devastating secondary effects for these children, including disfigurement, learning disabilities and emotional maladjustment. The children also suffer from the psychosocial aspects of the treatment. This innovative program will address many of these problems by creating an environment as normal as possible for these children during their treatment. Dr. Jan van Eys, Head of the division of Pediatrics, will be responsible for the administration of the grant.

13. School of Social Work, The University of Texas at Austin

An Exploratory Study of Black Families in Two Texas Communities: Their World Views and Mental Health - \$26,315

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a research grant for the period December 1, 1984 to November 30, 1985. The proposed research project is designed to examine the role of the family, extended kin, and other primary group relationships as resources in the stressful life events and buffers against mental disorders in Black couple-headed households. The role of sociocultural world views, social network, and social supports will be assessed in order to determine their effects on these Black families' coping strategies and patterns. It is expected that this study will generate knowledge useful for social policy development and social interventions for mental health service providers. Dr. Richard A. English, Robert L. Sutherland Professor of Mental Health and Social Policy in the School of Social Work, will be the principal investigator responsible for administration of the project.

There is no change in either the total number of semester hours required for the degree or the total number of required semester hours in College of Communication courses.
