The above recommended adjustments reflect those actions necessary to establish or maintain internal and external equity and/or accurately define and classify jobs. These adjustments have been initiated by the various component institutions, appropriately reviewed, and have received the approval of the System Personnel Director and the Vice President for Operations.

AGREEMENT WITH DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE REGARDING THE MV/IDA GREEN

System Administration recommends approval of an agreement with the Admiralty and Shipping Section of the Department of Justice. The agreement was signed by Richard Arnett, Assistant Attorney General, for the State of Texas and by James T. Fitzpatrick, General Counsel, The University of Texas System, for The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston. The Agreement reads as follows:

Re: United States of America v. The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston, el al; CA. No. 75-H-543 in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas

In consideration of your not arresting the M/V IDA GREEN, or attaching any funds or other property of the owners of the said vessel, pursuant to process issued in the captioned action, the undersigned hereby agrees:

- 1. To file, or cause to be filed, upon your demand an appearance on behalf of the owners of the M/V IDA GREEN in the captioned action; and also to file, or cause to be filed upon your demand, a claim by the proper claimant of the M/V IDA GREEN in such action, irrespective of her absence from the jurisdiction of said Court, and without regard to her whereabouts.
- 2. Upon demand, to cause to be filed in such action a bond, in form and sufficiency of surety satisfactory to you, or to the Court, in an amount to be agreed upon between us, or failing agreement, to be fixed by the Court, but in no event to exceed the value of said vessel as of January 27, 1978.
- 3. In the event of a final decree (after appeal if any) being entered against the M/V IDA GREEN and/or her owners in said action, the undersigned agrees to pay and satisfy up to and not exceeding the value of said vessel as of January 27, 1978, the said final decree, or any lesser amount decreed by the Court, or settled between the parties without final decree being entered, subject to specific legislative appropriation for this purpose
- 4. In the event the bond referred to under subdivision 2 is filed the undersigned shall have no further obligation under subdivision 3 supra.
- 5. It is the intent of this undertaking and guarantee that the rights of the parties shall be precisely the same as they would have been had the M/V TDA GREEN been arrested under process issued, and released upon the filing of a surety bond in the foregoing amount reserving on behalf of the said vessel and owners all other defenses including the denial of all liability for the subject damage.

It is further understood and agreed that:

- This agreement is to be binding and enforceable whether the M/V IDA GREEN be lost or not lost, and in port or not in port.
- 2. This agreement is without prejudice to any and all rights and defenses which may be available to the owners and/or underwriters of the M/V IDA GREEN under general maritime or statutory law, and is not to be construed in any sense as an admission that the United States Government is entitled to an in rem seizure of said vessel.

BOX FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH ALLOCATIONS FOR PROGRAM SUPPORT

Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health Trustee Approved Program Support account to the following institutions and agencies:

The University of Texas at Austin

Department of Educational Psychology

1. Training Program for Improving Skills in Learning, Memory and Problem Solving with the Elderly - \$9,887.00

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-year grant in the amount of \$9,887.00 for the period January 1, 1978 -- December 31, 1978 to the Department of Educational Psychology at The University of Texas at Austin.

These funds will be used to do research on the elderly and to develop a program for improving their skills in learning, memory and problem solving. The first phase of the research will involve an intensive study of 35 elderly persons to identify the kinds of methods, strategies, processes or "mental tricks" they use to help learn materials necessary in their everyday activities. Based upon these findings, a questionnaire employing these strategies will be administered to another group of 200 elderly persons. The latter study will assess the generalizability of the earlier findings and will seek to identify training variables which affect the acquisition of these skills. At the conclusion of the project, a set of pilot training procedures will be made available to other researchers and interested practitioners.

Dr. Claire E. Weinstein and Dr. Michael Duffy will be responsible for the administration of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period in January 1979.

Br. Charles M. Bonjean and Mrs. Bert Kurger Smith will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation for this project. (RBC# H-28)

Department of Sociology

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2. Research on Illicit Drug Dealing in the University Community ~ \$994.00

This project, previously supported by the Foundation, is simed at exploring an aspect of present day society which is widely discussed but little understood: illicit drug dealing. A number of studies and discourses exist on the pattern of drug usage and the dangers of abuse, but little is known about dealing per se -- how students and others become involved in this activity and what happens when they do. In order to formulate rational policies concerning the nature of response to illicit drug dealing, such concrete information is necessary.

Among the types of data analyzed to date by Dr. Sheldon Olson were records of 5,000 of the drug cases that came through the criminal justice system. An additional 5,000 cases have not yet been coded and analyzed and they would greatly improve the data base. The funds will be used for this purpose.

Several articles have already resulted from Professor Olson's research. Moreover, the results were presented to the general public through the Foundation's <u>Human Condition</u> radio series. Future dissemination plans include a monograph and an hour long TV special on KLRN dealing with marijuana.

EXEC FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

The Foundation Executive Committee recommends funding of this project as requested in the amount of \$994.00 for a four month period, September-December, 1977. Dr. Olson, who will be responsible for the administration of the project, will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the program at the close of the grant period.

Dr. Charles M. Bonjean will serve as liaison for the Hogg Foundation. (RBC# H-29)

3. The Influence of Sex Roles and Social Psychological Variables on Occupational Aspirations - \$7,266.00

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant in the amount of \$7,266.00 for the period February 1 through August 31, 1978, to the Department of Sociology at The University of Texas at Austin. These funds will be used for graduate and undergraduate research assistance for a study to determine the influence of social psychological and demographic variables on the occupational aspirations of female eighth, tenth, and twelfth grade students. The study has the enthusiastic support of the Austin Independent School District, which hopes to use the findings in developing programs for their planned Career Development Center.

Dr. Judy Corder-Bolz and Dr. Cookie Stephan will serve as co-directors of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period in September 1978.

Or. Charles Bonjean will serve as Foundation liaison for the project. (REC# H-33)

The University of Texas at Arlington

Department of Psychology - \$884.00

4. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-time grant in the amount of \$884.00 for the period February 1, 1978 to February 1, 1979. These funds will be used to study persons in Veterans Administration Hospitals in Temple and Waco in order to study the effects of crowding on older individuals.

Bert Kruger Smith will serve as liaison person for the Foundation.

School of Social Work - \$4,000.00

5. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-year grant in the amount of \$4,000.00 for the period February 1, 1978 through

January 31, 1979. These funds will be used to support a research associate who will work with a U. T. Arlington professor of social work to develop computer programs for small on-site microcomputers in mental health settings. At present the programs that would help mental health personnel process data on these computers do not exist. Thus, the net effect of the project should be more efficient and effective information processing by mental health organizations.

Dr. Charles Bonjean will serve as liaison person for the Foundation.

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NOCE FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio

Department of Psychiatry - \$25,000.00

6. The Hogg Foundation approved a transfer in the amount of \$25,000.00 from the Mary Yates Memorial Fund for the second year of support of research in biological psychiatry at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. The progress report of the excellent work underway by Drs. Charles L. Bowden on lithium effects on erythrocytes of manic-depressive patients, Augustin de la Pena on psychophysiological correlates of insomnia, and David H. Ross on the fetal alcohol syndrome in the offspring of pregnant females, indicated that the program was of high quality and full of promise for future results that will greatly improve the understanding of biological factors underlying human behavior and mental illness.

Dr. Robert L. Leon and his associates will continue to monitor the activities of this grant and are responsible for submitting to the foundation reports and a fiscal accounting of these funds. A progress report summarizing the work accomplished by this second-year grant and an outline of plans for the third year will be submitted prior to the end of the current calendar year.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman will serve as liaison person for the Foundation.

The University of Houston

Departments of Foundation in Education and Curriculum and Instruction - \$8,167.00

7. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-time grant in the amount of \$8,167.00 for a study on "Dimensions of Socialization to School and Work in Kindergarten." This project is concerned primarily with belief structures and social perceptions that kindergarten children acquire about school; how and why they acquire them; and the effect which certain environmental and social variables have on these beliefs. The investigators for this study will supervise the collection of test data from kindergarten children in the Spring Branch Independent School District. In order to obtain longitudinal data on their belief structures and social perceptions as they develop in the kindergarten year these children will be interviewed at pre-registration, mid-year, and at the close of the kindergarten year. It is hoped that this pilot work supported by the Foundation will provide a strong basis for a more extensive longitudinal study supported by other sources in the future.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman is the liaison person for the Foundation.

The University of Houston at Clear Lake City

School of Human Sciences - \$2,728.00

8. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a supplementary grant in the amount of \$2,728.00 for the period June 1 through August 31, 1978. These funds will be used for a summer salary for one of two co-investigators studying the relationship between family system dynamics and parenting behavior. This project was approved for \$7,493.00 in November of 1977 and subsequently reported to the Board of Regents, but funds requested for summer salaries were denied at that time because the investigators' summer plans were not sufficiently clear. The current request met guidelines and suggestions and, indeed, the amount of work the co-investigator plans to undertake will probably require more than the six weeks for which she will be paid. The co-investigator will act as liaison with the study families, which involves contacting the fifty families who have been or are presently in therapy, discussing the research project, and requesting their participation.

Austin Child Guidance Center, Austin, Texas - \$13,598.00

9. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-year grant in the amount of \$13,598.00 for the period March 1, 1978 to February 28, 1979, with the possibility of minor support reaching into a second year to be determined by an evaluation of progress at the close of the first year.

This grant is intended specifically to support the Center's program designated Project SEY. Project SEY is a program focusing on a neglected group, namely, sexually abused adolescents. Project SEY has come into being after considerable exploratory work and preliminary discussion. Various workshops, including consultative services from the U. T. Health Science Center at San Antonio, have helped to shape what appears to be a viable program. There is considerable interest in the thrust of these kinds of services, which need replication throughout the state and the nation.

Bert Kruger Smith and O. Stanley Brown will serve as liaison persons for the Foundation.

Combined Community Action, Inc., Smithville, Texas - \$12,000.00

10. The Hogg Foundation made a one-year commitment in the amount of \$13,500.00 to aid in supporting this demonstration project and has found that the project merits a second-year grant in order to assess fully the impact of this important undertaking, which will contribute to the development and understanding of the concept of self-health in the total community health education process. The project has been designed to emphasize educational intervention in the area of health for families in two rural counties, Bastrop and Fayette, through the aid of a family nurse practitioner under the direct supervision of a physician. Reduction in emotional stress in physical health problems and information and referral will be emphasized.

The Hogg Foundation approved a second-year grant in the amount of \$10,000.00 for the period January 1 through December 31, 1978, plus an additional \$2,000.00 which was set aside as a challenge grant to be matched by local funds. The City of Smithville and the Combined Community Action Agency have met the stipulations of the challenge grant. The \$12,000.00 will be matched against the Texas Department of Human Resources funds.

Mr. Reymundo Rodriguez and Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman will serve as liaison persons for the Foundation.

Parking and Traffic Regulations: Approval is requested for the following revisions to the Parking and Traffic Regulations. These changes will become effective for the 1978-79 fiscal year.

Article I, Section 11

Visitor parking is restricted to those parking spaces marked as such and under no circumstances are students, employees or faculty members allowed to park in the visitors parking spaces. When groups of visitors are involved, arrangements should be made with the University Police for temporary permits for the visitors to park in other areas if the visitor reserved spaces are not sufficient. See exception in Article III, Section 9.

Article III, Section 8 Parking Permit Fees:

A. TYPE A PARKING PERMIT DECALS - \$72.00 a year for numbered spaces. The president, vice-president, academic deans and departmental chairmen are eligible to purchase Type A parking permit decals. A vehicle displaying a valid Type A parking permit may park in the assigned numbered reserved space or in a regular reserved space. The person or persons named above, at their discretion, may authorize another person to park their vehicle (bearing a current valid decal) in their numbered reserved space during their absence. The person or persons named above must send written authorization to the University Police who will issue a special permit which must be displayed in the lower right portion of the front windshield in order for the vehicle to be legally parked in the authorized numbered space only.

Article III, Section 8

I. AFTER HOURS PARKING PERMIT DECAL - \$3.00 a year. Only students are eligible to purchase after hours parking permit decals. Vehicles bearing an after hours parking permit decal may park on the campus only between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6 a.m. on weekdays. In addition, they may park on campus all day Saturday, Sunday and official UTHSCSA holidays as published by the president.

Article III, Section 9

All parking assignments will be in effect from 6:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on weekdays. In addition, reserved areas will be main-tained on Saturday mornings until 12:00 noon. A policy of unassigned parking for any properly registered vehicle, except two wheel vehicles (see Article III, Section 8E), will be in effect at all other times including official holidays of The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. Handicapped zones, no parking zones, loading dock zones and limited time parking zones are in effect 24 hours a day seven days a week.

Article IV. Enforcement

Section 1.

- A. (3) Appeals
 - (a) Appeal of a campus type traffic ticket may be made within five fifteen days to the Traffic Committee. The action of the Committee is final.
 - (b) Any person who has received a campus traffic ticket may appeal by filing a written statement, setting forth the grounds on which he believes that the campus ticket should be dismissed. If the person receiving the ticket desires to appear in person before members of the Traffic Committee, he shall request such personal appearance in the written statement. The written statement must be presented to received by the Chairman of the Traffic Committee within five fifteen days from the date of issue on the ticket.
