The above recommended adjustments reflect those actions necessary to establish or maintain internal and external equity and/or accurately define and classify jobs.

Salary ranges are supported by compensation data for the area concerned. These adjustments have been initiated by the various component institutions, appropriately reviewed, and have received the approval of the System Personnel Director and the Vice Chancellor for Business Affairs.

SETTLEMENT OF CLAIMS

T. C. Bateson Construction Co. vs The State of Texas, et.al. (CD No. 202-76-S.A./GA). Natkin & Company and Todd-Ford, Inc. d/b/a Natkin/Todd Ford, a joint venture, and the State of Texas and the Board of Regents (acting through the Vice Chancellor and General Counsel) entered into a Mutual Covenant Not to Sue on April 23, 1979, with prior concurrence of appropriate authorities, under which the Board agreed to pay the joint venture parties the sum of \$675,000, and to refrain from suit against them and their subcontractors and hold them harmless from liability to plaintiff based on claims asserted by the University, and the joint venture parties agreed to dismiss their cross-action against the University, not to sue or press any claims against the University, to indemnify the University against any damages plaintiff recovers because of work done or claims made by them, and to waive any claims under the construction contract.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH ALLOCATIONS FOR PROGRAM SUPPORT

Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health Trustee Approved Program Support account to the following institutions and agencies:

CAN-DO-IT - Pilot Residential Treatment Program for Severely Emotionally Disturbed (hildren of Houston Texas - \$36,000,00

1. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a grant in the amount of \$36,000.00 to CAN-DO-IT, which is an acronym for Children: Action Now Developing Options in Treatment. CAN-DO-IT is a "grass roots" organization to aid the Houston community in developing treatment programs for the severely emotionally disturbed child. These are youngsters with acute inability to attend or function in school, who suffer depression to the extent of suicide attempts, incorrigibles or those who have severe emotional attacks. These funds would be used to assist in their commitment to DePelchin Faith Home so that the two units could be redesigned and restaffed for emotionally disturbed children. This new residential treatment program promises to be a truly outstanding and unique enterprise for this part of the country.

This matching grant on a two or one basis is contingent upon the raising of \$18,000 in new money by CAN-DO-IT.

Mrs. Muriel Folloder, President of the Board of Directors of CAN-DO-IT will submit a report to the Hogg Foundation once the official transfer of these funds to the DePelchin Faith Home has taken place. Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman and Mrs. Bert Kruger are the liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation.

Tarrant Council on Alcoholism & Drug Abuse of Fort Worth, Texas - \$7,560.00

2. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a grant in the amount of \$7,560.00 to the Tarrant Council on Alcoholism & Drug Abuse to aid in the establishing of a new service in the form of a decentralized drug abuse education, prevention, and referral service carried out by means of a van. This method of delivery is proposed as a cost-effective alternative to satellite clinics. Professional staff members and volunteers will present educational programs and prevention services in several target neighborhoods. The van itself also features a patch-in citizens band radio for on-site referral. The Hogg Foundation grant will make possible an in-depth formative and summative evaluation of this innovative service delivery system. 20% of the project director's time and two part-time research assistants are to be supported for the period April 1, 1979 through March 31, 1980.

Mr. Jay V. Harnish will serve as project director. A co-agency agreement between the Tarrant Council and The University of Texas at Arlington will provide the overall research direction from Professor Charles E. Ramsey, chairman of the Sociology Department. Mr. Harnish will submit a progress report and a final fiscal accounting in April, 1980.

Dr. Terrence R. Tutchings will serve as liaison person for the Hogg Foundation.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

The National Conference of Christians & Jews, Inc., South Texas Region of San Antonio, Texas - \$500.00

3. The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a one-time grant in the amount of \$500.00 for the period May 1, 1979 through December 31, 1979 to The National Conference of Christians & Jews, Inc., South Texas Region. The proposed youth program, "Alternatives to Delinquent Behavior," is a delinquency diversion program with an educational base that will serve as a demonstration project for the Austin Independent School District and the Austin Police Department. The goals of the project are to demonstrate the feasibility of a continuing criminal justice segment of public school curriculum and the viability of the program as a means for deterring pre-delinquents from criminal involvement. Hogg Foundation funds will support the stipend of a consultant and of a coordinator from the Austin Independent School District and the Austin Police Department, respectively. These two persons will be responsible for the planning, follow-up, and evaluation of the project.

Mr. Bill Pickle, Director of the South Texas Region, will be responsible for the overall administration of the program, and will submit a fiscal narrative and fiscal reports no later than December 31, 1979. Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman and Dr. Terrence R. Tutchings will serve as liaison persons from the Hogg Foundation.

Child and Family Service of Austin, Texas - \$5,000.00

4. The Hogg Foundation recommends for approval a grant in the amount of \$5,000.00 to Child and Family Service of Austin for the establishment of Consumer Credit Counseling.

The proposed Consumer Credit Counseling services are an important adjunct to the family counseling services presently provided by the agency. This would be one of the few programs to combine credit counseling and financial management assistant with other mental health services. The proposed Consumer Credit Counseling program will receive most of its budget support from the pledges of Austin creditors. The \$5,000.00 Hogg Foundation grant will provide for one-third of the salary of the coordinator/counselor, who will be responsible for new client intake, ongoing counseling, debt and budget management, and continuing creditor contact.

Second and third-year funding are tentatively committed contingent upon satisfactory completion of the first year's activity and with the understanding that second and third-year support by the Hogg Foundation should be considered an option to be used only if other support cannot be found.

A six-month evaluation report will be submitted to the Hogg Foundation in November, 1979, and a final fiscal accounting and narrative report will be submitted not later than May 31, 1980. Mr. J.B. Brannen, Executive Director of Child and Family Service, will be responsible for the administration of the project. Dr. Terrence Tutchings and Dr. Ralph Culler will serve as Hogg Foundation liaisons for this project.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH (Continued)

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio - Department of Psychiatry

Biological Psychiatry Research Program - \$25,000.00

5. After careful review of the second year progress report submitted by Dr. Robert L. Leon, the Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of this third year grant in the amount of \$25,000.00.

It is the understanding of the Foundation that this grant will be used primarily for the support of David Ross' work on Ca-ATPase, Augustine de la Pena's research on the psychophysiology of sleep, and Charles Bowden's platelets of depressed patients.

A report on the currently proposed work late this year is to be submitted by Dr. Leon in anticipation of a fourth year of support from the Mary Yates Memorial Fund. Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman will continue to serve as the liaison person for this project. A site visit by Dr. Holtzman and Mrs. Mary Auler will probably take place later this spring.

The grant is in the amount of \$5,416.00 and is for the period June 1, 1979 through September 1, 1980.
- 2. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and the Kilgore Children's Psychiatric Center and Hospital, Inc., Amarillo, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.
- 3. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and the Family Service of Amarillo, Amarillo, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.
- 4. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and the Methodist Home, Waco, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.

- 5. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington and the Trinity Valley Mental Health/Mental Retardation Authority pursuant to Grant Award PR 557AH 80095 from the Office of Education, Bureau of Higher & Continuing Education, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. The total amount of this agreement shall not exceed \$2,300.00. The time of performance is February 15, 1979 April 1, 1979 and May 1, 1979 September 30, 1979.
- 6. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington and CPI, Associates pursuant to Grant Award PR 557AH 80095 from the Office of Education, Bureau of Higher and Continuing Education, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. The total amount of this agreement shall not exceed \$3,500.00 and the time of performance is January 1, 1979 to September 30, 1979.
- 7. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington and Dallas County Mental Health/Mental Retardation Center pursuant to Grant Award #PR 557AH 80095 from the Office of Education, Bureau of Higher and Continuing Education, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. The Dallas MH/MR will provide a social worker for curriculum development and instruction of continuing education course. The total amount of this agreement shall not exceed \$17,765.00 and the time of performance is January 1, 1979 to September 30, 1979.
- 8. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington and Electric Power Research Institute, Inc. (RP1419-1) whereby The University of Texas at Arlington is awarded \$550,500.00 in support of research to be directed by Dr. Mo-Shing Chen, Director, Energy Systems Research Center. The period of the agreement is April 1, 1979 through March 30, 1982.
- Purchase order No. 4782 dated March 8, 1979, from the Woods Hole oceanographic Institution, Woods Hole, Massachusetts in the amount of \$3,701.00. This purchase order is for services to be performed under the direction of Dr. Jon Tuttle in a proposal entitled "Isolation of Sulfide-Oxidating Bacteria From The Galapagos Rift Vent." It is for the period November 1, 1978 through October 31, 1980.
- 10. Letter subcontract EUSED-78-0004 between General Electric Company and The University of Texas at Arlington, Energy Systems Research Center, which provided an initial agreement and authorized \$20,000.00 to commence research activities pending the development of a fully-definitized subcontract. The fully-definitized subcontract was executed on January 26, 1979 and authorized a total amount of \$35,000.00 for the period June 19, 1978 through May 31, 1979, including the work completed under the initial letter subcontract.
- 11. Amondment to present Agreement between the North Central Texas Council of Governments and The University of Texas at Arlington for the intern services of John Geider. The tenure has been extended for three additional months, ending June 30, 1979. All other provisions will remain the same.

II. General Regulations

- 2. The provisions of these regulations must be complied [compiled] with on all parts of the campus throughout all hours of the day and night with the following exception: Any vehicle with a current University decal may park in any University lot except those areas that are "No Parking", "Handicapped Parking", "Police Parking", or "University Vehicle Parking" during the following periods: 5 [9]PM Monday 7AM Tuesday; 5 [9]PM Tuesday 7 AM Wednesday; 5 [9]PM Wednesday 7 AM Thursday; 5 [9]PM Thursday [1] 7AM Friday; 5 [9]PM Friday 7 AM Monday.
- 6b. and the owner or <u>driver</u> [drive] will be expected to pay the wrecker a fee in lieu of towing.
- 8. No vehicle shall be parked on the campus except where posted signs indicate that parking is permissable. Legal parking is permitted in any unimproved University owned property that is properly marked and designated as a parking area. [Legal-parking-is-permitted-in any-unimproved-unmarked-University-owned-parking-area-that-may-be in-use-at-any-particular-time].
- 13. No parking is permitted along or upon any campus controlled street at anytime. [The-University-reserves-the-right-to-modify-or-change any-regulations-within-the-year]
- 14. The University reserves the right to modify or change any regulations within the year.

III. Bicycles

- 1b. A bicycle may be ridden on any campus street or other areas where pedestrians may walk with the following exceptions: inside any building, any landscape improvements not open to pedestrian use (including malls, flower beds, hedges, shrubbery), and outside areas designated for other than pedestrian use, where official signs prohibit parking or riding.
- Id. Bicycles MAY NOT be secured to any tree, shrub or plant, stairway or walkway. Bicycle racks are placed at strategic points on campus.

IV. Registration of Vehicles

- 3. Graduate students who are teaching or on research and funded by The University of Texas at Arlington AND WHO ARE APPOINTED FOR AT LEAST 20 HOURS WEEKLY (50% OF TIME) ON A PERSONNEL TRANSACTION FORM (PO-1) are eligible for faculty/staff parking privileges. Adjunct or visiting professors who teach less than 20 hours weekly are eligible for faculty/staff parking privileges. Both graduate students and visiting or adjunct professors must present a letter to the UNIVERSITY POLICE from either the Department Chairman or Administrative Director of a unit to qualify for a faculty/staff decal.
- 9. The fees for registration and parking for motor vehicles on the campus of The University of Texas at Arlington shall be as shown in Table [Falbe] I. All parking fees are payable at the Bursar's Office, First Floor, E. E. Davis Hall, prior to the registration of the motor vehicle with the Parking Office.

V. Parking Areas

- 1. Controlled parking areas include all parking lots on the campus and all streets abutting the campus. Signs and markings have been placed to designate controlled parking areas.
- 6. Faculty-and-staff-members-who-have-obtained-parking-decals-may-use any-faculty/staff-parking-lot-on-campus.

VII. Parking Decals

6. A replacement decal will be issued without charge whenever there is a sale or transfer of the vehicle, a replacement of the rear window or windshield, or defective decal, provided the remnants of the original decal are turned in to the Parking Office. Otherwise, a \$1.00 fee will be charged and PROOF OF OWNERSHIP [SHIP] of the vehicle to be registered must be shown.

IX. Enforcement

3. The enforcement fees assessed for violation of these regulations constitute an indebtedness [indebetedness] to The University of Texas at Arlington. In the event that a person fails to pay such fees within the time prescribed herein, The University of Texas

will take any or all of the following actions:

- Suspend the privilege of driving or parking on campus;
- Withhold any remuneration [renumeration], refund, or monetary payment to which the person may be entitled;
- Deny readmission to The University of Texas at Arlington; Withhold the individual's grades and/or transcript;
- D.
- Withhold any degree to which the person may be entitled.
- In the event that the privilege to drive and park on the campus has been suspended, such privileges may be reinstated by payment to the Bursar's Office of all unpaid enforcement fees. [plus-a-reinstatement fee-ef-\$5-00]
- 7. Parking offenses are recorded either in the name of the person in whose name the <u>vehicle</u> [veheile] is registered with some official state motor vehicle registration department or agency, or in the name of the person who has signed a financial responsibility agreement for parking violation which is on file with the Parking Office. Other offenses are recorded in the name of the person driving said vehicle and in the name of the person who has registered it with the Parking Office or who maintains the vehicle.

Non-payment of enforcement fees may result in the removal and impoundment of the vehicle. Prior to the vehicle being placed upon the impoundment list for failure to pay past-due enforcement fees, the person involved will be notified by letter of the action to be taken if all past-due enforcement fees have not been paid within ten school days after the date of the letter and the procedure for appeal. If the records indicate the vehicle has not been registered with the Parking Office, the notification of unpaid enforcement fees will be sent to the registered owner; otherwise, the letter will be sent to the address of such person as shown in the records of the Parking Office.

X. Appeals

The Appeals Board is not a part of the University Police Department but information is included as a courtesy to inform all faculty, staff, and students of the right to appeal and the procedure for appealing a University citation.

A person receiving a University citation that believes they have ample justification or mitigating circumstances leading to their receiving a citation should first request an interview with the Chief of Police or in his absence, the Captain. (The purpose for the interview with the Chief of Police is to review the citation for technical errors which may alleviate the person from any further inconvenience. If, after having an interview with the Chief of Police or Captain, the person has failed to receive satisfaction, it is at this time a person files for an appeal. [a-person-receiving-a-University-eitation-may-appeal the--eitation-to-the-Parking-and-Traffie-Appeals-Gommittee-WITHIN-5-SCHOOL-DAYS-from-the-date-of-receiving-the-citation-by filing-a-Parking-and-Traffie-Appeal-Form-which-is-available-at the-Bursar-s-Office).

2. [1] A person receiving a University citation may appeal the citation to the Parking and Traffic Appeals Committee WITHIN 5 SCHOOL DAYS from the date of receiving the citation by filing a Parking and Traffic Appeal Form which is available at the Bursar's Office.

The reason for appeal should be given, either to dispute whether the violation occurred at all, or to claim that the action which resulted in the citation was justified by circumstances.

Appeal committees consist of faculty, staff, and student members. When hearing is scheduled, the person appealing will be notified of the time and place so that he may attend and will be allowed up to five minutes for a personal presentation. If the person appealing is not present, the appeal will be decided on the basis of the written statement of reasons on the Parking and Traffic Appeal Form.

Appeals should not be made for the purpose of changing the rules, which are not made by the Appeals Committee, but by the University Parking Committee.

3. [2] If the Appeals Committee finds the person appealing guilty, the enforcement fee must be paid to the Bursar's Office within five (5) days of the notice of the decision of the Appeals Committee.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

I. QUICK REFERENCE TO PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

- 1. FERMITS REQUIRED FOR ACCESS & PARKING. Only vehicles conspicuously displaying proper University permits (as specified in Section VI, infra) may park on the main campus (as shown by the boundaries on the map accompanying the regulations) Monday through Thursday, 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Motorcycles, motor assisted bicycles and motor scooters may drive through the main campus only after these hours, but must park only in areas designated for such vehicles.
- 2. EFFECTIVE DATE OF PERMITS. Parking permits, not temporary permits, are valid for twelve months, beginning September 1.
- 3. PARKING PERMITS must be affixed to the inside of the vehicles as described in Section VI of these regulations.. Annual permits which are taped or affixed by unauthorized materials or displayed on a vehicle other than the vehicle to which issued will subject the holder to a University citation. Temporary permits must be located so as to be readily seen from the outside of vehicle.
- 4. CLASS "F" PERMITS. Holders of Class "F" permits shall park only in areas designated on their permits. Class "F" Lots are reserved from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Mondays through Fridays. Holders may park in other parking areas at other times except when prohibited by posted signs or markings. When no spaces are available or there is an urgent need, a temporary permit will be issued by the University Police or the Uniformed Officers in control stations.
- 5. CLASS "A" PERMITS. Holders of Class "A" permits may perk in any Class "A" parking area except carpool areas on Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and in Class "C" parking areas after 2:00 p.m. Holders may park in other parking areas at other times except when prohibited by posted signs or markings.
- 6. CLASS "C" PERMITS. Holders of Class "C" parking permits shall park only in Class "C" parking areas. They may pass through control stations after 5:00 p.m. weekdays and may park on the main campus after that time in any area not specifically reserved for other classes of permits, or when not in violation of posted signs or painted curbs and pavements. (See numbers 4 & 5 above).
- 7. WHEN TWO CARS ARE REGISTERED. An alternate vehicle may be registered by faculty and staff at no extra cost with the understanding that if both cars are parked on campus at the same time one must be parked at a meter or the parking permit will be revoked for the remainder of the permit year.

- 8. FACULTY/STAFF LOCATED OFF MAIN CAMPUS. University faculty and staff employed at locations off the main campus are not eligible for parking permits under these regulations. These individuals should apply either to the University Police at Bellmont Hall or to the guards in control stations for temporary permits.
- 9. LOADING ZONE PERMITS & WHERE TO OBTAIN. A passenger car or light pick-up may not use Loading Zone areas Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. without a LOADING ZONE PERMIT. Permits may be obtained from guards at the control stations, or from the University Police at Bellmont Hall, Room 823. When control stations are closed, permission to use a Loading Zone area may be obtained by a telephone call to 471-4441 or PAX 1031.
- 10. VISITORS & WHERE TO OBTAIN PERMITS. All visitors need permits to park on campus. Visitors who conduct important business with or render an important service to the University and who are not eligible for University permanent parking permits are classed as OFFICIAL VISITORS. Official Visitors may obtain temporary parking permits from either the guards at the control stations or from the University Police at Bellmont Hall (stadium) Room 823. Permits entitle the holders to park only in spaces designated "Official Visitor." NOTE: Temporary permits must be displayed while the vehicle is parked. All other visitors may park only at the University Visitor Center, east of the LBJ Library (between 26th Street and Manor Rd.) or may only drive-through the campus. Faculty, staff and students are not normally eligible for Official Visitors permits. Violators may be cited.
- 11. SPEED LIMIT. The speed limit on all parts of the main campus, whether on streets or in parking areas, is 15 mph unless otherwise posted.
- 12. POSTED SIGNS take precedence over painted curbs and pavement markings.
- 13. PARKING IMPROPERLY. A vehicle may not be parked on a street where angle parking is required with the back of the vehicle toward the curb. Parking wholly within the marked boundaries of the parking space is required at all times. Vehicles shall not park so as to obstruct walkways or to inflict damage to shrubbery, trees, grass, etc.
- 14. BICYCLES. Bicycles must be operated in accordance with the ordinances of the City of Austin and according to specific provisions of these regulations shown in Section IV. Whenever a usable path or part of street is set aside for exclusive use of bicycles, the riders shall use such path and not use the street.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

Eicycles must be parked only in bicycle racks or designated areas.

- 15. BICYCLE REGISTRATION. Bicycles may be registered on campus by contacting the Crime Prevention Unit of the The University Police (471-4441 or PAX 1031) between 9:00 a.m. and noon any Tuesday or Friday. Bicycles may also be registered at any City of Austin fire station.
- 16. PEDESIRIANS -- RIGHTS AND DUTIES. Pedestrians are subject to all official traffic control devices. They have the right-of-way at marked crosswalks, in intersections and on sidewalks extending across a service drive, building entrance, driveway or street. Pedestrians crossing a street at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-ofway to all vehicles on said street. Pedestrians shall also yield the right-of-way to bicycles in designated bikeways. Pedestrians shall not leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield. They may cross an intersection diagonally only where permitted by special pavement marking.
- 17. ENFORCEMENT, CHARGES AND IMPOUNDMENTS. Failure to pay the charges on University citations as shown on the reverse of the violator's copy may subject the violator to either impoundment and/or in the case of students they may be barred (Section VIII). Vehicles will be impounded for violations shown in Section VII.
- 18. APPEAL TO A CITATION. University parking and traffic citations may be appealed within twelve (12) calendar days from date of citation by filing a written statement with the Parking and Traffic Office, Service Building, Room 1 on East 24th Street. (See Section VIII). If desired the violator may request, in writing, a court appearance citation be issued in lieu of the University citation.
- 19. DISABLED VEHICLES. If a vehicle becomes disabled, a telephone call must be placed to the University Police Department who will either render assistance or authorize temporary parking.

II. INTRODUCTION

Under the provisions of Sections 51.202 et seq of the Texas Education Code, the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System has promulgated Parking and Traffic Regulations to regulate and control parking and traffic and the use of parking facilities, provide for the

issuance of vehicle identification insignia, (parking permit) and provide for jurisdiction over offenses. This booklet contains those regulations and procedures applicable to any who would walk or drive and park a motor vehicle or bicycle on the main campus of The University of Texas at Austin. They are supplementary to the rules and regulations of the City of Austin and the State of Texas which govern pedestrians and the use of notor vehicles and bicycles.

The operation of a motor vehicle or bicycle on the University of Texas at Austin campus is a PRIVILEGE granted by the University and is not an inherent right of any faculty/staff member or student. All faculty, staff and students who have motor vehicles in their possession or control for use, operation or parking on the University campus are encouraged to register said vehicles with the Parking and Traffic Office. Registration of a motor vehicle does not guarantee a parking place on campus. However, owners of registered vehicles will receive a reduced penalty for violations of certain University parking regulations, (see Section VII).

The University is not responsible for fire, theft, damage to, or loss of such vehicles parked or operated on the University campus. No bailment is created by the granting of any parking or operating privileges regarding a vehicle on any property owned, leased or otherwise controlled by the University.

As used herein, "Campus" refers to all University owned or controlled property whether or not within the confines of the control stations of the Main Campus. With respect to permits, these regulations apply only to the Main Campus, which is all University-owned or controlled property within the boundaries shown on the map accompanying these regulations.

The origin, administration and enforcement of the regulations contained in this booklet are as follows:

Parking and Traffic Policy Committee. This committee is composed of faculty, staff and students and is responsible for formulating regulations for the control of parking and traffic upon the campus in the form of recommendations to the President of the University. Within the limitations imposed by restricted facilities and staff, it attempts to provide reasonable regulations for the control of the very high density of vehicular and pedestrian traffic upon the main campus of the University, toward the goal of optimum convenience and safety for all concerned. Suggestions for changes in these regulations, requests for individual consideration or any communications concerning unique problems arising from parking and traffic, or the regulations concerning then should be directed to this Committee.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

Parking and Traffic Appeals Panel. This panel is composed of faculty, staff and students and rules on appeals from citations issued by University police for violation of parking and traffic regulations. This panel also conducts hearings concerning impoundment or barring of readmission, withholding of grades and transcripts based on overdue charges. (See Section VIII)

Parking and Traffic Administration. This office is responsible for all administrative functions relating to the issuance of parking permits, the collection of charges for parking and traffic violations, the acceptance of appeals from such violations and the issuance of refunds upon withdrawal from the University. Questions relating to these functions should be directed to Parking and Traffic Administration, Service Building 1.

University Police. The University Police has the responsibility and the legal authority for the enforcement of the parking and traffic regulations listed in this booklet. University police officers may issue TRAFFIC CITATIONS ENFORCEABLE IN COURT in the same way as those issued by the Texas Highway Patrol (see Section VIII). On special occasions and in emergencies, such parking limitations may be imposed by the Chief of the University Police as are required by the conditions which prevail. When conditions warrant such action, he may also waive parking limitations which are ordinarily imposed.

The University reserves the right to enforce parking and traffic regulations (1) through the issuance of citations and the collection of charges for offenses, (2) through the impoundment of vehicles interfering with the movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic or involved in specified parking offenses, (3) by the suspension or revocation of permits for repeated offenses, (4) by providing an option for either the vehicle owner or the person who has signed a financial responsibility agreement for parking violations to appear in court or at a University hearing for non-payment of charges, (5) by barring readmission of any student for non-payment of outstanding charges, (6) by withholding a student's grades and official transcript, (7) by denying parking permits to those with overdue charges, and (8) by such other methods as are commonly employed by City or State police in the control of traffic.

Proof of the fact that any parking or traffic control device, sign, signal or marking was actually in place at any location on the campus of the University of Texas at Austin, Austin, Texas shall constitute prima facie evidence that the same is official and was installed under the authority of the law.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

When any person is charged with having stopped, parked and left standing a motor vehicle on the campus of the University of Texas at Austin, Austin, Texas in violation of any provision of the Parking and Traffic Regulations of the University of Texas at Austin, proof that said vehicle was, at the date of the offense, bearing a valid University of Texas at Austin parking permit shall constitute prima facie evidence that said vehicle was then and there stopped, parked and left standing by said holder of the parking permit. However, if such vehicle does not bear a valid University of Texas at Austin parking permit, proof that said vehicle at the date of the offense alleged was owned by the person charged with the offense, shall constitute prima facie evidence that said vehicle was then there stopped, parked and left standing by said owner.

The University assumes no responsibility for the care and/or protection of any vehicle or it's contents at anytime it is operated or parked on the campus.

Any motor vehicle or bicycle parked on the University campus for a period of time in excess of 48 hours. The University may deem, as authorized by law, the same to be abandoned and dispose of such vehicle as provided in Sections 10.4 and 10.6 of Chapter VII, Part Two of the Regents' Rules and Regulations.

III. DEFINITIONS

University Campus: All University of Texas owned or controlled property.

Main Campus: All University owned or controlled property within the boundaries shown on the map accompanying these regulations.

Official Visitor: Individuals not normally eligible for University parking permits who come to the main campus to conduct importent business with the Institution's administrative officers or to render an important service. Vehicles bearing University parking permits will not be subject to citation when displaying an Official Visitor permit issued by the University Police Department. Parking Area: Any area on the main campus which has been designated and marked for parking whether on streets or in lots.

No Parking Zone: In addition to zones marked by posted signs, any yellow-painted curbs or yellow-painted zones on pavements denote no parking at any time.

Tow-Away Zone: An area designated by an official posted sign which constitutes public notice that a vehicle parked in violation will be removed.

Loading Zone: A zone marked by posted signs and orangepainted curbs or zones reserved for loading/unloading only (Section V & VI).

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

Motor-assisted bicycle: A bicycle which may be propelled by human power or by a motor, or both; said motor of a capacity of less than 60 cc piston displacement and capable of a maximum speed of not more than 20 mph on a surface with not more than 1% grade in any direction when the motor is engaged.

IV. GENERAL

Only vehicles conspicuously displaying proper University permits may enter or park on the campus Monday through Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., and Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., except that motorcycles and motor-assisted bicycles may only drive through the main campus after these hours, and must park only in areas designated for such vehicles. Permits are not required after these hours, nor on official University holidays, nor on days when no classes, final examinations or registration periods are scheduled, except where parking is restricted by posted signs. Official visitors and drivers of commercial vehicles may obtain temporary permits at traffic control stations. Metered parking spaces may be used by any vehicle, except motorcycles, motor-assisted bicycles and bicycles, at any time, except where their use is restricted by posted signs. These regulations apply to motor propelled vehicles and to bicycles, - all must honor the regulations listed in this booklet at all times.

THE SPEED LIMIT ON ALL PARTS OF THE MAIN CAMPUS IS 15 MILES PER HOUR AT ALL TIMES UNLESS OTHERWISE POSTED. PEDESTRIANS ALWAYS HAVE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY AT CROSSWALKS AND IN INTERSECTIONS. ALL VEHICLES ARE REQUIRED TO STOP COMPLETELY AT STOP SIGNS AND TO PROCEED WITH CAUTION. A flashing yellow light requires slowing the vehicle and proceeding with caution. A flashing red light requires stopping the vehicle completely and proceeding with caution.

No vehicle or bicycle may be placed, used, parked or left within any University Building at any time except with proper authorization.

Bicycles shall be operated in conformity with the applicable ordinances of the City of Austin and the following:

- (a) Bicycles may not be ridden on pedestrian walkways and sidewalks.
- (b) Operators of bicycles on University streets shall comply with all stop signs, yield signs, and other official traffic regulations, except that bicycles may proceed in either direction on Inner Campus Drive.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

V. PARKING REGULATIONS

The various classes of parking permits and their eligibility requirements, privileges and limitations are described in detail in the following section. Specific areas available for parking for each class of permit are indicated on the color-coded map. Metered spaces are open to all motor vehicles, except motorcycles, motor scooters and motor-assisted bicycles, at all times, except where their use is restricted by posted signs. Parking meters are in use from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Parking is PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES where indicated by signs, yellow-painted curbs or yellow-painted pavement markings. Parking adjacent to orange-painted curbs is restricted to AUTHORIZED VEHICLES ONLY from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays. Parking at unpainted curbs is controlled by area parking signs. Posted parking signs must be honored at all times and take precedence over curb markings.

Other regulations concerning parking and driving on the Main Campus are shown in Section VII. DRIVING AND PARKING OFFENSES.

The absence of sufficient authorized parking space on the University campus during a particular period of time will not be considered by The University as a valid justification for violation of parking and traffic regulations. The mere fact that citations are not issued for any offense does not indicate that these regulations have been modified to exclude that offense.

On University holidays and on days when no classes, final examinations, nor registration periods are scheduled, only those parking restrictions which regulate parking at all times will remain in effect except that Official Visitor and Class "O" spaces located on Inner Campus Drive will be restricted as posted.

VI. PARKING PERMITS

A. FACULTY AND STAFF.

A parking permit will be issued, upon application, to Parking and Traffic Administration, located in the Service Building, Room 1. Permits will be issued to the vehicle for which the faculty or staff member, spouse or parent is the registered owner or for which the faculty or staff member has assumed financial responsibility for any parking violations by filing a notarized Financial Responsibility Agreement with the Parking and Traffic Office.

NOTE: Vehicles owned by students may NOT normally be registered in the name of the Faculty or Staff member.

An alternate vehicle may be registered at no additional cost with the understanding that if both cars are parked on campus at the same time, one must be parked at a meter or the permit will be revoked for the remainder of the permit year. In addition, a citation will be issued by the University Police Department. Permits will be issued only to those members of the faculty or staff who are employed on the Main Campus.

ANNUAL PERMIT TO PARK on campus will not be honored:

- 1. unless current permits are properly affixed on the interior of the car as follows:
 - the interior of the car as follows:

 a. if only ONE vehicle is registered for parking, one permit shall be affixed in the center of the windshield at the bottom so as not to obstruct the driver's forward view, and the second shall be affixed to the inside of the rear window in the lower corner on the driver's side of the car; or
 - b. if TWO vehicles are registered for parking under the Alternate Permit Policy, then one permit shall be affixed on the windshield of each vehicle (none on the rear) as above;
 - c. if a vehicle is registered for Car Pool parking, the permit shall be affixed to the center of the windshield at the bottom so as not to obstruct the driver's forward view. The portable car pool card shall be displayed on the dashboard or at some other place where it can be seen easily through the windshield from the outside of the vehicle.
- 2. If taped or affixed by unauthorized materials; and
- 3. unless displayed on the vehicle to which the permit was issued.

NOTE: Motorcycle, motor-assisted bicycles or motor scooter permits are mounted externally on the rear fender.

B. STUDENTS

A parking permit will be issued for a vehicle owned by the student, his/her spouse, parents, or guardians or for which the student has assumed financial responsibility for any parking violations by filing a notarized Financial Responsibility Agreement with the Parking and Traffic Administration. Only one passenger vehicle is authorized to be registered by each eligible student. Students may also register one motorcycle, motor-assisted bicycle or motor scooter upon separate application to Parking and Traffic Administration, located in the Service Building, Room 1. In addition, students must present a paid fee receipt for the semester involved. Students may be required to also present a current license receipt.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

ANNUAL PERMIT TO PARK on campus will not be honored:

- 1. unless a current permit is properly affixed in the center of the windshield at the bottom so as not to obstruct the driver's forward view.
- 2. if taped or affixed by unauthorized materials
- unless displayed on the vehicle to which the permit was issued

NOTE: Motorcycle, motor-assisted bicycles or motor scooter permits are mounted externally on the rear fender.

C. TEMPORARY PERMITS

A temporary permit to park on campus will not be honored unless it is displayed conspicuously on or near the windshield so that it may be seen from the outside.

 - \$ 6.00 if purchased during the spring semester
 - \$ 2.00 if purchased during summer session
 - M-\$ 6.00 Faculty, Student and Staff for motorcycles, motor-assisted bicycles and motor scooters
 - \$ 4.00 if purchased during the spring semester
 - \$ 2.00 if purchased during the summer session
 - CP-\$48.00 Class F Carpool
 - \$20.00 Class A Carpool
 - \$10.00 Class C Carpool

For permits less than a semester, student class "D" and class "A" health permits shall be \$1.00 a month.

All disabled veterans whose vehicles display the specially designed license plates issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the words "DISABLED VET" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e and all permanently disabled persons whose vehicles display the specially designed symbols, tabs, or other devices issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the word "DISABLED" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e.1 are exempt from parking permit fees and from parking meter fees and time limits. These exemptions do not permit parking a vehicle at a place or time that parking is prohibited.

E. PAYMENT OF FEES

When an application is made for a permit, the fee charged will be for a complete year or for the entire unexpired portion of the University's permit year. Payment of the fee must be made before the permit will be issued.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

F. REPLACEMENT CHARGES

Any time replacement permits are issued there will be a one dollar charge made. Remnants of old permits are to be returned at that time. For each card key replaced there will be a two dollar charge made.

G. REFUNDS

A request for refund will not be honored unless it is filed with the Parking and Traffic Office during the University's fiscal year for which payment of the permit was made. A request for refund must be accompanied by the remnants of the appropriate permit.

Refunds will be made to members of the faculty and staff upon request and only in the event their service is terminated by a resignation or leave of absence without pay. The refund will be based on the number of full months remaining in the University's academic year. No refunds will be made after the end of the spring semester. Refunds will be made upon request to students who withdraw from the University at the end of the fall semester, but refunds will not be made to students who withdraw at the end of the spring semester. A request for a refund will not be honored when a person's privilege to park and drive on campus has been suspended, nor if outstanding charges or other debts remain unpaid.

H. CLASS O PERMITS

Class O parking permits will be issued only to those officials designated by the President. O permit holders may park in any O space.

I. CLASS D PERMITS.

Class D parking permits may be issued to members of the faculty, staff and student body whose physical infirmities make mandatory their parking near their work or classroom. Automobiles bearing Class D parking will normally be parked in spaces specifically designated for the disabled. If no "D" spaces are available, holders of "D" permits shall obtain a special temporary permit from traffic control stations for parking in other designated areas for a limited period of time. Class "D" permits may be issued for limited periods of time or for the entire academic year. Class "D" permits may be issued to students upon certification by the Director of the Student Health Center.

Center.
Class "D" permits may be issued to members of the faculty and staff upon certification by the attending physician using forms mailed by the Parking and Traffic Office.

If the applicant is confined to a wheelchair, the permit will be so marked.

All certifications must be renewed annually.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

J. CLASS F (RESERVED LOTS) PERMITS Members of the faculty holding the rank of instructor or above, and staff members who are paid at a rate of \$1393.00 per month or more, are eligible to apply for Class F permits. Reserved lot assignments will be drawn in a computer lottery system according to rank for faculty and monthly salary for others. Reserved Parking Areas will be reserved for automobiles bearing permits issued for each specific area, Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. If no spaces are available in the designated lot or if there is urgent need, special permits will be provided at traffic control stations for F permit holders to park on particular occasions for a limited period of time in other restricted areas. Certain spaces in each reserved area will be reserved at all times for those holding permits for that area.

K. CLASS A (UNRESERVED LOTS) PERMITS

Class A parking permits may be issued to any of the following:

- 1. Any full-time employee of The University of Texas at Austin.
- Any part-time employee who is not registered in the University as a student.
- 3. Individuals registered at the University for courses of instruction, who are employed for at least twenty hours per week, by the University, and appointed at a full-time rate of \$818.00 or more per month. (Verified by a copy of the PO1 form.)
- 4. Temporary Class "A" permits may be issued to students upon certification by the Director of the Student Health Center.
- Teaching assistants with less than a half-time appointment whose jobs involve supervisory roles in the public schools.

Class A permit holders may park in any Class A parking area except carpool areas on Monday through Friday from 7:30 s.m. to 5:00 p.m. and in Class C lots only after 2:00 p.m. Holders may park in other parking areas at other times except when prohibited by posted signs or markings

NOTE: Inner Campus Drive parking spaces are reserved for Class O, A, F and D permits only on Mondays through Thursdeys from 5:00 p.m. to 7:15 p.m.

L. CLASS C (STUDENT) PERMITS

Class "C" permit holders may park in any "C" parking area except carpool areas on Mondays through Fridays from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. They are not permitted to park in "F" or "A" areas or to pass through traffic control stations between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekdays. At all other times they may park on campus in any area not specifically reserved for other classes of permits.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

M. CLASS M PERMITS

Class M parking permits will be issued to faculty, staff and students for motorcycles, motor-assisted bicycles and motor scooters. These vehicles may be parked ONLY in parking areas set aside for motorcycles, motor-assisted bicycles and motor scooters, regardless of the time of the day or day of the week.

- N. CLASS H (HEALTH) PERMITS

 Class H permits will be issued without fee by the Director,
 Speech and Hearing Clinic, to parents who must bring
 and stay with their children while they are being
 treated in one of the respective clinics. Limited space
 adjacent to each clinic is reserved for Class H permits,
 which are invalid elsewhere.
- O. CLASS T (TEXAN) PERMITS

 Class T parking permits will be issued without fee by
 the Manager of Student Publications to reporters,
 photographers and advertising salesmen who, for a
 limited period of time, must come to The Daily Texan
 to complete their work, or file a report, and leave on
 other assignments. Space adjacent to the Communication
 Center is reserved for these permits, which are invalid
 elsewhere.
- P. CLASS K PERMITS

 Class K permits will be issued without fee by the Director of News and Public Affairs, Communication Center, to the news broadcast staff who for a limited time must come to the studio to complete their work and leave on other assignments. Permits are invalid elsewhere.

Q. CAR POOL PERMITS

All members of the car pool must be employed or registered on the main campus. Each member of the car pool must complete his/her portion of the application. Car pool members shall be INELIGIBLE TO OBTAIN ADDITIONAL PERMITS OF ANY TYPE.

For car pools with two members, each must have a different domicile. Car pools with three or more members, at least two must have different domiciles. Faculty and Staff members with the same domicile shall not normally be allowed to become members of different car pools.

Car pool permits will be issued to park in selected Class "F", "A", or "C" parking lots from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The car pool leader must qualify for the type permit for which he/she applied in accordance with current regulations. A portable car pool card and permits for each vehicle will be issued to the car pool indicating the lot where the vehicle will park. The fee charged for a car pool permit will be the same as that charged for a similar regular type permit.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

Class "F" Car Pools:

- a. All Class "F" car pools will be assigned to a specific reserved lot. No specific spaces will be set aside for Class "F" car pools.
- b. Each Class "F" car pool will compete in the random selection process in accordance with the following priorities:
 - 1. two member car pools receive a rank 5
 - 2. three member car pools receive a rank 4
 - 3. four member car pools receive a rank 3
 - 4. five or more member car pools receive a rank 2 NOTE: No car pool will receive a rank lower than that to which the leader would be entitled to in his own right.
- c. Applications will be received on a first come first served basis. Assignments will not exceed ten percent of the specific lot's capacity.

Class "A" Car Pools:

- a. All Class "A" car pools will be assigned to specific "A" lots which will have spaces reserved for car pools. Currently spaces are reserved in A Lots 55, 61, 67 and 74.
- b. Priorities shall be assigned as follows:
 - 1. four or more members Priority one
 - 2. three members Priority two
 - 3. two members Priority three
- c. All applications will be received on a first come first served basis and given a priority (as in b. above) for the specific lot requested.

Class "C" Car Pools:

- a. must have a minimum of three members.
- b. Specific spaces are reserved for Class "C" car pools. Currently, spaces are in Lots 83 and 58.
- c. All applications will be on a first come, first served basis.
- d. Priorities will be assigned using factors such as distance travelled (one-way), number of people, etc.

Vehicles with car pool permits for Class "F" or Class "A" parking lots but not displaying the portable car pool card will be allowed drive-through privileges any time and parking privileges after 5:00 p.m. for that portion of the main campus within the control stations.

Vehicles bearing car pool permits for Class "C" will not be permitted to pass through the traffic control stations between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Applications for car pools may be filed with the Parking and Traffic Office, Service Building, Room 1.

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PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

R. CLASS R (RETIRED FACULTY, STAFF) FERMITS
Faculty and staff members retired (under the teacher retirement system) continue to be eligible for the class of permit for which they were eligible at the time of retirement.

Upon request, retired faculty and staff members will be issued a complimentary Retired Staff permit with Class "A" parking privileges only after 3:00 p.m.

S. TEMPORARY PERMITS

Loading Zone Permits.

Passenger cars may not use the LOADING ZONE AREAS Monday through Friday 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., without a loading zone permit and may be parked there only long enough to conduct the actual loading or unloading operation, whether on University business or otherwise. Loading zone permits are valid only for date and time issued and must reflect an expiration time. The loading zone permits may be obtained from the control station officer or from the University Police Office, Bellmont Hall, Room 823. When the control stations are closed, permission to use a loading zone may be obtained by a telephone call to the University Police, 471-4441 or PAX 1031. Passenger cars shall not be stopped in loading zones or service drives for the purpose of awaiting the arrival of passengers. Commercial vehicles may be parked in loading zones and service drives only for whatever length of time actual loading and unloading operations are in progress.

Official Visitors Permits.

Arrangements for the use of official visitor spaces are to be made in advance with the Chief, University Police, the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Deans and the Directors. Where groups are involved, the arrangements must be made by the appropriate Chairperson, Dean, Director, or equivalent administrator with the Chief, University Police, who will issue temporary permits.

The establishment of space for official visitors' parking must meet with the approval of the Parking and Traffic Policies Committee and is subject to the review of the President.

In all cases in which an automobile is parked in an official visitor's space, it must bear the appropriate temporary permit which shows the current date, specifies the parking time required, including the date and time of expiration, and bears the signature of the official authorized to issue the permit.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

Commercial Visitor Permits.

Arrangements for parking for other persons coming to the University campus on business matters may be made by administrative officials, chairpersons of departments, administrative staff members, or faculty members with the office of the Chief, University Police by identifying the person and the gate through which he will enter the campus. A temporary parking permit will be issued to such a visitor.

Parking permits will be issued to a limited number of persons who render a continuing service to University offices (e.g. computer engineers, typewriter servicepersons, etc.). Requests for such permits should be directed to the Director of Physical Plant.

Temporary permits will be issued to a limited number of persons coming to the campus to render a special service which is a specific part of the University's work. Requests for individual parking may be made to the Chief, University Police.

VIII. ENFORCEMENT

A. Parking and Traffic Citations

University Police are authorized to issue two types of citations for violation of campus parking and traffic regulations:

- (1) University Citations Those handled by the University of Texas Parking and Traffic Administration, subject to University charges and a right of appeal to the Parking and Traffic Appeals Panel.
- (?) Court Appearance (CA) Citations Those issued by the University Police but constituting
 a summons to appear in either the municipal court or
 a justice court. Criminal penalties, as provided by
 law, may be imposed by either the municipal court or
 a justice court for violations of University parking
 and traffic regulations.
- B. Policy with Respect to Court Appearance (CA) Citations

The University reserves the right to issue a CA citation for any violation. It is the general policy of the University, however, to issue CA citations only (1) for serious violations end (2) for excessive University citations as set forth in Paragraphs C and E below.

C. Policy with Respect to University Citations.

University citations are issued for offenses described in Section VII. The administrative charges are as shown. If not paid within twelve calendar days after issuance of the citation a \$5.00 late charge shall be assessed.

Every person receiving a University citation shall remit the amount of the charge to the Parking and Traffic Office, Room 1, Service Building within twelve calendar days after receipt of the citation, to avoid a late charge.

If a person desires to appeal, he/she shall comply with Paragraph D below within twelve calendar days after issuance of the citation.

Unpaid charges for parking offenses are recorded either in the name of the person in whose name the vehicle is registered with some official state motor vehicle registration department or agency or in the name of the person who has registered the vehicle with the Parking

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and Traffic Office. Unpaid charges for other offenses (e.g. moving violations) are reported in the name of the person driving said vehicle and in the name of the person who has registered it with the University Parking and Traffic Office or the registered owner.

If unpaid charges recorded in the name of any person equal or exceed the sum of \$25.00, the Parking and Traffic Administration will notify such person by letter sent to the address of such person as shown in the records of the Parking and Traffic Office. A copy of the letter also shall be sent to the registered owner if different from the person registering the vehicle with The University.

If, however, the records indicate that the vehicle has not been registered with the Parking and Traffic Office, the letter of notification will be sent only to the registered owner.

Such letter shall state that unless (1) payment of all accumulated charges is made within 12 calendar days after the date of such letter or (2) a written request is made within the same 12 days to appear before a University hearing for impoundment of the vehicle in case of faculty, staff, student or visitor, or for barring of readmission and/or withholding of grades and transcripts in case of students in accordance with the Regents' Rules and Regulations, Part One, Chapter VI, Section 9, the appropriate enforcement action will take place without further notice.

At such hearing, which will be held after a reasonable period of time, the person requesting the hearing will assume the burden of showing why the appropriate enforcement action should not take place.

If timely payment is not received and neither the registered owner nor the person who has registered the vehicle with The University has elected to appear at a University impoundment hearing, the vehicle may be impounded pending payment of all outstanding charges, without further notice.

If timely payment is not received from a student and the student has elected not to appear at a hearing, the student may, in addition to the impoundment of his/her vehicle, be barred from readmission and his/her grades and official transcripts may be withheld, without further notice.

When Court Appearance citations are issued, the University citations will be cancelled. Failure to discharge CA citations will result in the issuance of a warrant for the arrest of such person.

Persons with unpaid charges recorded in their names

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

shall be ineligible to receive a parking permit while such charges remain unpaid. To obtain a permit, a person shall either pay these charges or request a University hearing.

D. Appeals from University Citation(s).

Any person who has received a University citation may elect one of the following:

- (1) file a request to have the University citation converted to a CA citation and appear in Court to contest the validity of the citation. Such request must be submitted in writing to the Parking and Traffic Office within 12 calendar days from the date of the citation, or,
- (2) file a request to have the University citation reviewed by the University Parking and Traffic Appeals Panel. Such request must be submitted in writing to the Parking and Traffic Office within 12 calendar days from the date of the citation.

If the person elects to request a review by the Parking and Traffic Appeals Panel, the written request must set forth the grounds on which the person believes the citation was improper or inequitable. The following information shall be included in the appeal:

- citation number(s),
- (2) license number of vehicle,
- (3) local address and telephone number,
- (4) date of appeal,
- (5) signature, and
- (6) printed name of person appealing.

Each appeal will be considered by an appeals panel consisting of faculty, staff and student members.

The filing of an appeal constitutes certification by the individual who signs the same that the facts stated therein are true to the best of his/her belief. A person may file such supporting statements or materials as he/she deems appropriate.

If the person filing an appeal desires to appear in person before a panel he/she shall request such personal appearance in the written statement. Failure to request a personal appearance will result in the Parking and Traffic Appeals Panel determining the appeal on the basis of the written statement of the person, the supporting materials submitted by the person and information supplied by the traffic officer issuing the citation. If a personal appearance is requested, the person appealing shall be permitted to participate in the hearing and present such testimony and information as he/she deems appropriate.

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Such person shall also have the right to examine witnesses.

The panel may order the payment of the charge in whole or in part, or the cancellation of the citation(s), as deemed appropriate. A person filing an appeal will be notified in writing of the decision of the panel. The decision of the Appeals Panel shall be final. If an appeal is denied and the person fails to pay the charges within 12 calendar days after date of letter of notification, a \$5.00 late charge will be assessed.

E. Suspension of Privilege to Drive and Park on Campus.

Any person who within a period of twelve months commencing on September 1 of any year receives University citations with charges equal to or in excess of \$50.00 shall lose his/her privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on the Main Campus for the remainder of the permit year and may subject their vehicle to possible impoundment for parking offenses during the period of suspension; upon payment of all charges the suspension will be vacated. In addition, a faculty or staff member found to have more t an one vehicle parked on campus at the same time (Sec. VI A) shall lose their privilege to drive and park on campus for the remainder of the permit year.

The loss of the privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus shall commence twelve days after the Parking and Traffic Office mails a letter to the person, at the address of such person as shown in the records of that office, stating that such person's privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus has been suspended. Such letter shall state the date on which the suspension commences and the date on which the suspension ends and will give notification of possible impoundment for parking offenses committed during the period of suspension and additionally, shall state the reason for such suspension.

Any person who (a) forges or alters a permit, (b) uses a forged or altered permit, (c) transfers a permit, affixes a permit to a vehicle other than that for which it was issued, or fails to destroy a permit when required to do so by these regulations, with the intention of providing any person with parking privileges he/she is not entitled to under these regulations, or (d) provides false information to obtain a parking permit with knowledge thereof, or (e) parks or drives a vehicle to which there has been affixed a permit which the registered owner, or regular driver, did not purchase.

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

or, (f) parks two vehicles on campus at the same time under the Alternate Permit Policy (Sec. VI), shall lose the privilege of driving or parking on the University campus for the remainder of the year. While a person's privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus is suspended, it is unlawful (1) for that person to drive or park any motor vehicle on the campus and (2) for any person to drive or park a vehicle registered in the name of such person on the campus.

If a person whose privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus has been suspended is charged with any violation while on campus, a CA citation will be issued for such violation. If a University citation is issued to such person, a CA citation for such offenses will be served upon such person by a peace officer. Failure to discharge such CA citations will result in the issuance of a warrant for the arrest of such person. Upon the issuance of the CA citation, the University citation will be cancelled.

If a person whose privilege of driving or parking on the campus has been suspended receives a University or CA citation by reason of having a vehicle on the campus during the period of his/her suspension, the period of suspension shall be extended so that it expires 12 months from the date the person receives such additional CA or University citation. In addition, the vehicle may be impounded and the violation of the suspension may be reported to the Dean of Students for possible disciplinary action if the person is a student, or to the appropriate Dean, Director or Administrative official, if the person is a faculty or staff member.

A person receiving notice that his privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus has been suspended may appeal the suspension within 12 calendar days on the grounds that the imposition of such suspension is improper or will create serious and substantial hardship. Such appeal shall be governed by the provision of Part D above. No appeal shall be considered if there are any unpaid citations outstanding at the time such appeal is filed, unless special arrangements are made with the Parking and Traffic Office.

F. Destruction of Permit When Suspended.

Every person receiving notice that his privilege of driving or parking on the campus has been suspended shall remove the parking permit(s) from every vehicle registered in his/her name and return remnants thereof to the Parking and Traffic Office within twelve calendar days after date of such notice. Failure to do so

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1979-80 (CONT'D)

may be reported to the Dean of Students if the person is a student, or to the appropriate Dean, Director or Administrative official, if the person is a faculty or staff member.

G. Eligibility to Obtain New Permit During Period of Suspension

A person wose privilege of driving or parking on the campus is suspended and not reinstated shall be ineligible to receive a parking permit of any type during the period of suspension.

Impoundment.

The term "impounding" includes removal or immobilization of the vehicle in question.

In addition to any service charge that may be levied by the University for an offense, the owner of an impoundment vehicle must also pay a commercial wrecker service fee in the amount of \$20.00 and storage charges in the amount of \$3.00 per day after the first 24 hours. When an impounding violation occurs and the owner or driver of the vehicle appears on the scene before the arrival of the wrecker, the vehicle will not be impounded. If the owner or driver appears on the scene after the arrival of the wrecker, and the wrecker driver has made a hook-up, the following will apply:

- (a) the vehicle will not be impounded;
- (b) and the owner or driver will be expected to pay the wrecker a fee, in lieu of towing, in the amount of \$10.00.

If the vehicle is impounded the registered owner/permit holder will be so notified at their address of record.
