The above recommended adjustments reflect those actions necessary to establish or maintain internal and external equity and/or accurately define and classify jobs. Salary ranges are supported by compensation data for the area concerned. These adjustments have been initiated by the various component institutions, appropriately reviewed, and have received the approval of the System Personnel Director and the Vice President for Operations.

1978-79 HOLIDAY SCHEDULE AND VACATION ALLOWANCE

The Appropriation Bill provides for thirteen specified holidays. During fiscal year 1978-79, two of these specified holidays fall on Saturday and are not to be observed. In addition, the Appropriation Bill provides for one additional working day at Christmas to be observed as a holiday by employees of State agencies during fiscal year 1978-79. The resulting number of holidays to be observed by State employees for fiscal year 1978-79 is therefore twelve.

The Appropriation Bill further provides that State institutions of higher education may rearrange holidays and reallocate any portion thereof to vacation allowance. Accordingly, in conformity with past practice and your approval of the holiday schedule submitted below, one and one-half days of the State holidays provided will not be observed by the University but will be reallocated to vacation allowance in lieu thereof.

The results of the foregoing action will provide in 1978-79 ten and one-half holidays and a total of twelve working days annual vacation leave for University employees with less than two years service. Vacation accrual will therefore continue to be one day per month of employment for this category of employees which constitutes a large portion of the work force. This is consistent with the practice observed for a number of years. Each of the other categories of service will be increased accordingly by one and one-half days. See following schedule.

1978-79 HOLIDAY SCHEDULE AND VACATION ALLOWANCE (Continued)

Although all employees are encouraged to utilize vacation in the year which accrued, employees may carry forward unused vacation from one fiscal year to the next. The schedule presented above indicates maximum carry forward authorized by the Appropriation Bill (the one and one half days for holidays converted to vacation time must be taken in the 1978-79 fiscal year).

*Those employees who wish to observe a religious holiday in addition to those cited above may do so by taking a vacation day or by observing some other religious holiday in lieu of the religious holidays cited above.

The foregoing holiday schedule and vacation allowance is to apply to The University of Texas System Administration and to any component institution in The University of Texas System that does not request a schedule specifically different.

GRANTS, CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS (STATE)

- 1. Interagency Contract IAC (78-79)-1294 between The University of Texas System Administration (University Lands Surface Leasing, Midland, Texas) and Texas Tech University, Lubbock, Texas in which Texas Tech University through its Department of Chemistry will establish and operate a program to measure factors affecting the quality of wine produced from grapes grown on University Lands as well as other parts of Texas. The total amount of the contract shall not exceed \$12,500 for the effective period of May 15, 1978 through August 31, 1978.
- 2. Interagency Contract IAC (78-79) 1277 between The University of Texas System System Personnel Office and the Texas State Library Records Management Division in which the State Library will microfilm approximately 135,000 documents relating primarily to Workmens Compensation Insurance claims. The total amount of the contract shall not exceed \$1,500 for the effective period of April 17, 1978 through August 31, 1978.
- 3. Unnumbered Interagency Contract between The University of Texas System and the Governor's Budget and Planning Office to enable The University of Texas System to initiate the Institute of Higher Education Management. The total amount of the contract shall not exceed \$79,011 for the effective period of May 1, 1978 through April 30, 1979.

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH ALLOCATIONS FOR PROGRAM SUPPORT

Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health Trustee Approved Program Support account to the following institutions and agencies:

The University of Texas at Austin

School of Law

1. Comparison of Mental Health Testimony in Texas and Ohio Death Penalty Procedings - \$605

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of the small grant of \$605.00 to the UT-Austin Law School for the period May 1 - July 31, 1978, to help defray travel and living costs of Professor George E. Dix while making this survey. Professor Dix has shown in several previous Hogg Foundation-funded projects a high degree of professional competence. His work is uniformly of high yield, and we expect similar productivity in this project.

Professor Dix proposes a comparative study of mental health testimony in capital punishment proceedings as customarily and historically followed in the States of Ohio and Texas. Under a July 1976 ruling, the Supreme Court held that states may validly impose the death penalty upon criminal defendants convicted of murder. The Eight Amendment requires, however, that the procedure used to choose which defendants are subject to the death sentence constitute an effective vehicle for considering all possible mitigating and aggravating characteristics of the offense and the defendant.

Law officials seek assistance from mental health professionals in making appropriate decisions. This project will investigate the extent to which mental health professionals are able to provide useful input to the several different statutory procedures. The product will be a scholarly article commenting on the value of mental health testimony in this difficult area of great concern. Information on Texas cases is already available and will provide data for comparison of sample death penalty cases from Ohio.

The <u>International Journal of Psychiatry and the Law</u> has agreed to publish the resulting manuscript. The Hogg Foundation will probably seek reprint copies for distribution to our special mailing list.

Col. O. Stanley Brown will serve as liaison person for the Hogg Foundation for this project. (RBC# H-39)

LBJ School of Public Affairs

2. Mexican American Health Care in South Texas - \$1,000

The Executive Committee of the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health is recommending for approval a second-year grant in the amount of \$1,000 for the period January 1 to December 31, 1978, to the LBJ School of Public Affairs to aid in supporting the project entitled "Mexican American Health Care in South Texas." This is a policy research project initiated last year by Dr. David C. Warner of the LBJ School. Thus far, various sections of the research report are in final form, but some work remains to be done on four chapters (nutrition, mental health, manpower, and migrant health). This second-year grant will enable Dr. Warner to bring this comprehensive research project to conclusion. The funds will be utilized to do follow-up work and to update some of the data. In addition, the funds would help to defray costs of typing, duplication, publication and distribution of the final manuscript.

 $\mbox{\rm Dr.}$ David Warner will submit a final report and fiscal accounting at the conclusion of the research project.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman and Mr. Reymundo Rodriguez will serve as liaison representatives on this project. (RBC# H-38)

The University of Texas at Dallas

School of Human Development - \$12,000

3. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a grant of \$12,000.00 for a research undertaking on "Effects of Father and Mother Custody on Children's Social Development." The research will be under the supervision of Dr. John W. Santrock of the School of Human Development. Approximately \$7,200.00 of the grant is intended for salaries, wages, and fringe benefits for research assistants. Because of Dr. Santrock's severe problem in obtaining funds for research equipment, the Hogg Foundation approved up to \$5,000.00 of this grant for the purchase of equipment, materials, and services that are essential for the observational and tape recording of sessions.

A progress report later this summer and again at the end of the project year in December 1978 are to be submitted to the Foundation by Dr. Santrock.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman is the liaison person for the Foundation.

The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston - \$78,388

4. After reviewing the first year progress report of this program the Ima Hogg Foundation approved a grant of \$78,388.00 for the second year of this project to develop a comprehensive treatment and training program of mental health services for children in Houston and Harris County, jointly with the Children's Mental Health Services of Houston. The Foundation is pleased with the progress Dr. Arthur Farley has made in developing this program. A second child psychiatrist, Dr. Betty Pfefferbaum, will join their staff in July. This grant is primarily for the salaries of the two senior psychiatrists and one secretary for the program.

It is believed that The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston along with the Children's Mental Health Services of Houston have a unique opportunity to develop a new kind of community oriented program in child psychiatry that will establish a model for other medical schools in metropolitan areas who are concerned with comprehensive mental health services for children and their families.

A progress report is to be submitted by Dr. Louis A. Faillace, Chairman, Department of Psychiatry, no later than December 1, 1978.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman is the liaison person for the Foundation.

Huston-Tillotson College - Austin, Texas

Sociology Department - \$10,798

5. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-time grant in the amount of \$10,798.00 for the period June 1, 1978 through August 31, 1979. The funds will be used to study the life cycle patterns of Aid-to-Dependent-Children families. Life histories will be obtained from 100 female heads of households each for Blacks, Mexican Americans and Anglos, all of whom currently receive Aid-to-Dependent-Children payments.

The Texas Department of Human Resources, The University of Texas School of Social Work and Huston-Tillotson College have each expressed interest in the research and will cooperate with the principal investigator.

Professor Rosalee Wingate will be responsible for administering the project and will submit both fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period in 1979.

Ms. Adrian Fowler and Dr. Charles M. Bonjean will serve as liaison persons for the Foundation.

University of Houston

Parent-Child Development Center - \$19,870

6. After careful review of the progress report of this project submitted by Dr. Dale L. Johnson, the Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved the second grant of a three year commitment. This support will make it possible for Dr. Johnson to continue his research project involving children and their parents who have graduated in earlier years from the special parent-child training program at the Parent-Child Development Center. Much of what is being learned concerning the assessment of cognitive and personality development in young Mexican-American children and the relationship of such development to parental behavior will be of great value to program developers, policy makers, and other research scientists concerned with these issues in the southwest.

Dr. Johnson is the director of this project and is responsible for submitting an interim progress report at the close of this grant period. Dr. Johnson is a professor, Department of Psychology, at the University of Houston.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman is the liaison person for the Foundation.

Schreiner College, Kerrville, Texas - \$3,750

7. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a six-month grant in the amount of \$3,750.00 to be used for training practitioners and for giving an educational program to the children of aging parents, as well as for training persons in associations dealing with retired people.

Dr. Sam Junkin, President of Schreiner College and Dr. Charles W. Grose, Office of the Academic Dean of Schreiner College, will be responsible for administration of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period, October 1, 1978.

Bert Kruger Smith will serve as liaison person for the Foundation.

Texas Department of Human Resources, Austin, Texas - \$4,512

8. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-time grant in the amount of \$4,512.00 for the period March 1, 1978 through August 31, 1978, to provide a statistical base for planning numerous service delivery and research projects focused on the problems of teenage motherhood in Texas. Data from Texas Live Birth Certificates will be analyzed to obtain knowledge of the incidence of teenage motherhood and the interrelations between the age of the young mother, her ethnicity and county residence, the legitimacy of the child, her use of prenatal services.

Mr. Arnold G. Ashburn, Assistant Commissioner for Planning and Evaluation, and Mr. Charley Jennings, Planning Data Division Administration, will be responsible for the administration of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period in September 1978.

Dr. Charles M. Bonjean will serve as liaison person for the Hogg Foundation.

Texas Youth Council, Austin, Texas - \$1,400

9. The Texas Youth Council applied in August, 1977, for funding of a series of ten forums in leading cities of Texas, and was advised to use two selected cities (Dallas and San Antonio) as pilot locations to assess possible impact of these seminars before proceeding with the series. The two sessions proved to be most useful, successful, and highly productive.

The Hogg Foundation, therefore, decided upon continuation of the seminars at the remaining eight locations. Experience gained in the pilot phase indicated a need for more staff interaction and planning at the selected locations and a small increase in travel and honoraria in order to secure the best available speakers. The total increase in funding requested was \$1,400.00 and the Executive Committee approved the supplemental grant as requested.

Mr. Ron Jackson, Executive Director of the Texas Youth Council, will be responsible for the administration of the project and will submit a detailed summary and fiscal accounting of the project at the conclusion of the series of forums.

Dr. Charles M. Bonjean and Colonel O. Stanley Brown will serve as liaison persons for the Foundation.

Austin State Hospital, Children's Psychiatric Unit, Austin, Texas - \$5,231

10. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-year grant in the amount of \$5,231.00 for the period from July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979, to make the educational services of a Teacher Aide, Level III, available to all students admitted for treatment to the Children's Unit. This work decreases the interim time of students between their admission dates and their enrollment in regular day school. It also enables educational testing and data collecting prior to enrollment.

Dr. Beverly Sutton and Mr. William L. Cottrell, Jr., are responsible for administration of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period.

Bert Kruger Smith will serve as liaison person for the Foundation.

Parenting Services, Inc., Amarillo, Texas - \$12,000

11. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-time grant in the amount of \$12,000.00 for the period April 1 - December 31, 1978. The funds will be used in conjunction with \$35,103.00 for the year provided by state and community sources.

The major purpose of Parenting Services of Amarillo is to assure competent care and rearing of infants of mothers of high economic and social risk. Educational and counseling services include preand post-natal instruction on both a one-to-one and group basis with volunteers trained as counselors and teachers. The volunteers, as well as the young mothers with whom they work, gain useful skills in parenting. However, the major goal of this endeavor is the prevention of child abuse in any of its varied forms.

Administration of the funds will be by Ms. Linda Simpson, Vice-President and Chairman of Funding of the Board of Directors. Evaluative, descriptive, and fiscal reports will be submitted at the close of the project.

Dr. Bernice Moore and Dr. Wayne Holtzman will serve as liaison persons for the Foundation.

Texas Committee for the Humanities and Public Policy, for use of Texas Coalition for Juvenile Justice, Dallas, Texas - \$5,328.50

12. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a one-time grant in the amount of \$5,328.50 for the period April 1 - May 31, 1978, to the Texas Coalition for Juvenile Justice. These funds will be used to support the first of a series of thirty free public forums on the subject of truants, runaways, and other status offenders. The goals of the project are to make the general public aware of the complex personal and legal plight of most status offenders, to involve them in a discussion of the subject, and to encourage their involvement in the formulation of policies and programs of treatment in their own communities.

The Texas Committee for Humanities and Public Policy has also reviewed the proposal and promised a dollar-for-dollar match for funds from other sources, including a present grant.

Mrs. Anita Marcus, President, Texas Coalition for Juvenile Justice, is responsible for the administration of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period in June.

Dr. Charles M. Bonjean and Colonel O. S. Brown will serve as liaison persons for the Foundation.

<u>Conference on Southwest Foundations, The Moody Foundation, Galveston, Texas - \$25,000</u>

13. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee approved a grant of \$25,000.00 to the Conference of Southwest Foundations for its project entitled "United States-Mexico Problems and Their Implications," for the period April 1, 1978 to March 31, 1979.

\$20,000.00 of the grant will be reserved for support of a proposal submitted to the Conference by the Department of Psychiatry at The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio. The project concerns a joint Mexico-United States border conference on common mental health research and training needs. Dr. Robert Leon and Dr. Cervando Martinez will direct a series of small conferences designed to improve mental health facilities and services throughout the border region.

The remaining \$5,000.00 of the grant is intended for support of a program to analyze the impact of the United States economy on the economy of Mexico and its border region. This project, under the direction of Professor Clark Reynolds of Stanford University, will be undertaken as part of the overall program of the Mexico-United States Border Research Program organized by Dr. Stanley R. Ross at The University of Texas at Austin.

Upon receipt of a progress report and fiscal accounting from the Conference at the end of the initial granting period in early 1979, the Hogg Foundation will consider a second year's support.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman will serve as liaison for the Foundation.

Children's Mental Health Services of Houston, Houston, Texas - \$23,124

14. After reviewing the first year progress report of this program the Ima Hogg Foundation approved a grant of \$23,124.00 for the second year of this project to develop a comprehensive treatment and training program of mental health services for children in Houston and Harris County, jointly with The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston.

A companion grant to The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston will enable the faculty from the medical school who will be supervising this training and treatment program to be enlarged as anticipated in order to meet the needs of expanded services.

A progress report is to be submitted to the Ima Hogg Foundation by Dr. James S. Robinson, Director, Children's Mental Health Services of Houston, no later than December 1, 1978.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman is the liaison person for the Foundation.

The Junior League of San Antonio, San Antonio, Texas - \$1,920

15. 

I. QUICK REFERENCE TO PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

1. PERMITS REQUIRED FOR ACCESS & PARKING.
Only vehicles bearing proper University permits may park on the

Only vehicles bearing proper University permits may park on the main campus (as shown

by the boundaries on the map accompanying these regulations) Monday through Thursday, 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and Friday from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm except that motorcycles and motor-assisted bicycles may drive through the main campus only after these hours, but must park only in areas designated for such vehicles.

- 2. EFFECTIVE DATE OF PERMITS. Parking permits, not temporary permits, are valid for the Academic year.
- 3. Parking Permits must be affixed to the inside of the vehicle as described in Section VI of these regulations. Permits which are taped or affixed by unauthorized materials or displayed on a vehicle other than the vehicle to which issued will subject the holder to a University ticket.
- 4. CLASS "F" PERMITS. Holders of Class "F" permits shall park only in areas designated on their permits. When no spaces are available or there is an urgent need, a temporary permit will be issued by the University Police or the Uniformed Officers in control stations.
- 5. CLASS "A" PERMITS Holders of Class "A" permits may park in any Class "A" or Class "C" parking area except carpool areas on
- Monday thm Thursday from 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and on Fridays ifrom 7:30 am to 5:00 pm, and in Class "F", "A", or "C" parking areas at other times except when prohibited by posted signs or markings.

 6. CLASS "C" PERMITS. Holders of Class "C" parking permits shall
 - 6. CLASS "C" PERMITS. Holders of Class "C" parking permits shall park only in Class "C" parking areas. They may pass through control stations after 5:00 pm weekdays and may park on the main campus after that time in any area not specifically reserved for other classes of permits, or when not in violation of posted signs or painted curbs and pavements.
 - 7. WHEN TWO CARS ARE REGISTERED. An alternate vehicle may be registered by faculty and staff at no extra cost with the understanding that if both cars are parked on campus at the same time, one must be parked at a meter or the permit will be revoked for a period of one year.
 - 8. FACULTY/STAFF LOCATED OFF MAIN CAMPUS. University faculty and staff employed at locations off the main campus are not eligible for parking permits under these regulations. These individuals should apply either to the University Police at Bellmont Hall or to the guards in control stations for temporary permits.
 - 9. LOADING ZONE PERMITS & WHERE TO OBTAIN. A passenger car or light pick-up may not use Loading Zone areas Monday through Thursday 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and Friday 7:30 am to 5:00 pm with out a LOADING ZONE PERMIT. Permits may be obtained from guards at the control stations, or from the University Police at Bellmont Hall, Room 823 When control stations are closed and after 5:00 pm, or on weekends, permission to use a Loading Zone area may be obtained by a telephone call to 471-4441 or PAX 1031.
 - 10. VISITORS & WHERE TO OBTAIN PERMITS. All visitors need permits to park on campus.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

Visitors who conduct important business with or render an important service for the University and who are not eligible for University permanent parking permits are classed as OFFICIAL VISITORS.

Official Visitors may obtain temporary parking permits from either the guards at the control stations or from the University Police at Bellmont Hall (stadium) Room823 Permits entitle the holders to park only in spaces designated "Official Visitor."

All other visitors may park only at the University Visitor Center, east of the LBJ Library (between 26th Street and Manor Rd.) or may only drive-through the campus.

Faculty, staff and students are NOT eligible for Official Visitors permits. Violators will be subject to parking tickets.

- [//. SPEED LIMIT. The speed limit on all parts of the main campus, whether on streets or in parking areas, is 15 mph unless otherwise posed. POSTED SIGNS take precedence over painted curbs and pavement markings.
- /2. PARKING IMPROPERLY. A vehicle may not be parked on a street where angle parking is required with the back of the vehicle toward the curb. Parking wholly within the marked boundaries of the parking space is required at all times.
- /3. U-TURNING is permitted on the Main Campus when the turn can be made safely without backing or interfering with other traffic, or when not prohibited by an official traffic control device.
- BICYCLES. Bicycles must be operated in accordance with the ordinances of the City of Austin and according to specific provisions of these regulations shown in Section IV.

 Whenever a usable path or part of street is set aside for exclusive use of bicycles, the riders shall use such path and not use the street.

 Bicycles must be parked only in bicycle racks, or designated areas.
- BICYCLE RECISTRATION. Bicycles may be registered on campus by contacting the Crime Prevention Unit of The University Police (471-4441 or PAX 1031) between 8:00 am-Noon any Monday, Tuesday or Friday. Bicycles may also be registered at any City of Austin fire station.
- #4 PEDESTRIANS--RIGHTS AND DUTIES. Pedestrians are subject to all official traffic control devices. They have the right-of-way

at marked crosswalks, in intersections and on sidewalks extending across a service drive, building entrance, driveway or street.

Pedestrians crossing a street at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles on said street.

Pedestrians shall also yield the right-of-way to bicycles in designated bikeways.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

Pedestrians shall not leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.

They may cross an intersection diagonally only where permitted by

special pavement markings.

17 ENFORCEMENT-SERVICE CHARGES AND IMPOUNDMENTS. Failure to pay the service charges on University tickets as shown on the reverse of the violator's copy may subject the violator to either tow-away of the vehicle or enforcement in the City of Austin Municipal Court.

Vehicles will be towed-away for violations shown on pages 14 and 15

, & APPEAL TO A TICKET. University parking and traffic tickets may be appealed within ten (10) calendar days from date of ticket by filing a written statement with the Parking and Traffic Section, Service Building, Room 1 on East 24th Street.

II. INTRODUCTION

Under the provisions of Sections 51.202 et seq of the Texas Education Code, the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System has promulgated Parking and Traffic Regulations to regulate and control parking and traffic and the use of parking facilities, provide for the issuance of vehicle identification insignia, (parking permit) and provide for jurisdiction over offenses. This booklet contains those regulations and procedures applicable to any who would walk or drive and park a motor vehicle or bicycle on the

main campus of The University of Texas at Austin. They are supplementary to the rules and regulations of the City of Austin and the State of Texas which govern

pedestrians and the use of motor vehicles and bicycles.

As used herein, "Campus" refers to all University owned or controlled property whether or not within the confines of the control stations of the Main Campus. With respect to permits, these regulations apply only to the Main Campus, which is all

University-owned or controlled property within the boundaries shown on the map accompanying these regulations.

The origin, administration and enforcement of the regulations contained in this booklet are as follows:

Parking and Traffic Policy Committee. This committee is composed of faculty, staff and students and is responsible for formulating regulations for the control of parking and traffic upon the campus in the form of recommendations to the President of the University. Within the limitations imposed by restricted facilities and staff, it attempts to provide reasonable regulations for the control of the very high density of vehicular and pedestrian traffic upon the main campus of the University, toward the goal of optimum convenience and safety for all concerned. Suggestions for changes in these regulations, requests for individual consideration or any communications concerning unique problems arising from parking and traffic, or the regulations concerning them should be directed to this Committee.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

TRAFFIC AND PARKING REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

Parking and Traffic Section of the Physical Plant. The Parking and Traffic Section is responsible for all administrative functions relating to the issuance of parking permits, the collection of service fees for parking and traffic violations, the acceptance of appeals from such violations, and the issuance of refunds upon withdrawal from the University. Questions relating to these functions should be directed to Parking and Traffic Administration, Service Building 1.

Parking and Traffic Appeals Panel. This panel is composed of faculty, staff and students and hears appeals from tickets issued by University police for violation of parking and traffic regulations. (See Section VIII)

University Police. The University Police has the responsibility and the legal authority for the enforcement of the parking and traffic regulations listed in this booklet. University police officers may issue TRAFFIC TICKETS ENFORCEABLE IN COURT in the same way as those issued by the Texas Highway Patrol (see Section VIII). On special occasions and in emergencies, such parking limitations may be imposed by the Chief of the University Police as are required by the conditions which prevail. When conditions warrant such action, he may also waive parking limitations which are ordinarily imposed.

The University reserves the right to enforce parking and traffic regulations (1) through the issuance of traffic tickets and the collection of service fees for offenses, (2) through the impoundment of vehicles

interfering with the movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic or involved in specified parking offenses, (3) by the suspension or revocation of permits for repeated offenses (4) by providing an option for either the vehicle owner to appear in court or have his vehicle impounded for non-payment of service fees, and (5) by such other methods as are commonly employed by City or State police in the control of traffic.

Proof of the fact that any parking or traffic control device, sign, signal or marking was actually in place at any location on the campus of the University of Texas at Austin, Austin, Texas shall constitute prima facie evidence that the same is official and was installed under the authority of the law.

When any person is charged with having stopped, parked, and left standing a motor vehicle on the campus of the University of Texas at Austin, Austin, Texas in violation of any provision of the Parking and Traffic Regulations of the University of Texas at Austin, proof that said vehicle was, at the date of the offense, bearing a valid University of Texas at Austin parking permit shall constitute prima facie evidence that said vehicle was then and there stopped, parked, and left standing by said holder of the parking permit. However, if such vehicle does not bear a valid University of Texas at Austin parking permit, proof that said vehicle at the date of the offense alleged was owned by the person charged with the offense, shall constitute prima facie evidence that said vehicle was then and there stopped, parked, and left standing by said owner.

The University assumes no responsibility for the care and/or protection of any vehicle or its contents at anytime it is operated or parked on the campus.

If a motor vehicle or bicycle is parked on *University Campus* and is not moved for a period of 45 days, or is not operable, the University may deem the same to be abandoned. Abandoned motor vehicles or bicycles or motor-assisted bicycles may be disposed of in the same manner as such vehicles are disposed of by the City of Austin.

III. DEFINITIONS

University Campus: Al! University of Texas owned or controlled property.

Main Campus: All University owned or controlled property within the boundaries shown on the map

accompanying these regulations.

Official Visitor: Individuals not eligible for University parking permits who come to the main campus to conduct important business with the Institution's administrative officers or to render an important service.

Parking Area: Any area on the main campus which has been designated and marked for parking whether on streets or in lots.

No Parking Zone: In addition tozones marked by posted signs, any yellow-painted curbs or yellow-painted zones on pavements denote no parking at any time.

Tow-away Zone: An area designated by an official posted sign which constitutes public notice that a vehicle parked in violation will be removed.

Motor-assisted bicycle: A bicycle which may be propelled by human power or by a motor, or both; said motor of a capacity of less than 60 cc piston displacement, and capable of a maximum speed of not more than 20 mph on a surface with not more than 1% grade in any direction when the motor is engaged.

IV. GENERAL

Only vehicles bearing proper University permits may enter or park on the campus Monday through Thursday from 7:30 am to 8:45 pm, and Friday from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm. except that motorcycles and motor-assisted bicycles may only drive through the main campus after these hours, and must park only in areas designated for such vehicles. Permits are not required after these hours, nor on official University holidays, nor on days when no classes, final examinations or registration periods are scheduled, except where parking is restricted by posted signs. Official visitors and drivers of commercial vehicles may obtain temporary permits at traffic control stations. Metered parking spaces may be used by any vehicle, except motorcycles, motor-assisted bicycles,

and bicycles, at any time, except where their use is restricted by posted sign. These regulations apply to motor propelled vehicles and to bicycles,—all must honor the regulations listed in this booklet at all times.

THE SPEED LIMIT ON ALL PARTS OF THE MAIN CAMPUS IS 15 MILES PER HOUR AT ALL TIMES UNLESS OTHER-WISE POSTED. PEDESTRIANS ALWAYS HAVE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY AT CROSSWALKS AND IN INTERSECTIONS.

ALL VEHICLES ARE REQUIRED TO STOP COMPLETELY AT STOP SIGNS AND TO PROCEED WITH CAUTION. A flashing yellow light requires slowing the vehicle and proceeding with caution. A flashing red light requires stopping the vehicle completely and proceeding with caution. U-TURNING is permitted on the Main Campus when the turn can be made safely without backing or interfering with other traffic, or when not prohibited by an official traffic control device.

No vehicle or bicycle may be placed, used, parked or left within any University Building at any time except with proper authorization.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

Bicycles shall be operated in conformity with the applicable ordinances of the City of Austin and the following:

- (a) Bicycles may not be ridden on pedestrian walkways and sidewalks.
- (b) Operators of bicycles on University streets shall comply with all stop signs, yield signs, and other official traffic regulations, except that bicycles may proceed in either direction on Inner Campus Drive.

V. PARKING REGULATIONS

The various classes of parking permits and their eligibility requirements, privileges and limitations are described in detail in the following section. Specific areas available for parking for each class of permit are indicated on the color-coded map. Metered spaces are open to all motor vehicles, except motorcycles and motor-assisted bicycles,

at all times, except where their use is restricted by posted signs.

Parking is PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES where indicated by signs, yellow-painted curbs or yellow-painted

pavement markings.

Parking adjacent to orange-painted curbs is restricted to AUTHOR-IZED VEHICLES ONLY from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays. Parking at unpainted curbs is controlled by area parking signs. Posted parking signs must be honored at all times and take precedence over curb markings.

Other regulations concerning parking and driving on the Main Campus are shown in Section VII. DRIVING AND PARKING OFFENSES.

On University holidays and on days when no classes, final examinations, nor registration periods are scheduled, only those parking restrictions which regulate parking at all times will remain in effect.

VI. PARKING PERMITS

A. For Faculty and Staff, an application for a parking permit will be issued, upon request, by Parking and Traffic Administration, located in the Service Building, Room 1. Permits will be issued only to the vehicle for which the faculty or staff member, spouse, or parent is the registered owner or for which the faculty or staff member has assumed financial responsibility for any parking violations by filing a notarized Financial Responsibility Agreement with the Parking and Traffic Section.

. An alternate vehicle may be registered at no additional cost with the understanding that if both cars are parked on campus at the same time, one must be parked at a meter or the permit will be revoked for a period of one year. Permits will be issued only to those members of the faculty or staff who are employed on the Main Campus.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

For STUDENTS, a parking permit will be issued only for a vehicle owned by the student, his spouse, parents, or guardians or for which the student has assumed financial responsibility for any parking violations by filing a notarized Financial Responsibility Agreement with the Parking and Traffic Section. Only one vehicle will be registered for

each eligible student. In order to obtain a permit, a student must supply all information called for on a Motor Vehicle Registration Card and, in addition, must present (a) a copy of the current License Receipt and (b) a paid fee receipt for the semester involved.

A PERMIT TO PARK on campus will not be honored:

- 1. unless current permits are properly displayed as follows:
 - a. if only ONE vehicle is registered for parking, one permit shall be affixed to the inside of the windshield directly in front of the rear view mirror so as not to obstruct the driver's forward view, and the second permit shall be affixed to the inside of the rear window in the lower corner on the driver's side of the car; or
 - b. if TWO vehicles are registered for parking under the Alternate Permit policy (faculty and staff only), permits shall be affixed on the inside of each vehicle in the respective positions described in A.l.a. above, and the portable card shall be displayed on the dashboard or at some other place where it can be seen easily through the windshield from the outside of the vehicle;
 - c. if a vehicle is registered for car pool parking, a permit shall be affixed to the windshield and to the rear window in the respective positions described in A.l.a. above, beside any other permit in these areas, and the portable car pool card shall be displayed on the dashboard or at some other place where it can be seen easily through the windshield from the outside of the vehicle.
- if taped or affixed by unauthorized materials; and
- 3. unless displayed on the vehicle to which the permit was issued.

For permits less than a semester student class "D" and Class "A" health permits shall be \$1.00 a month.

All disabled veterans whose vehicles display the specially designed license plates issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the words 'DISABLED VETERAN" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e and all permanently disabled persons whose vehicles display the specially designed symbols, tabs, or other devices issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the word "DISABLED" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e.1 are exempt from parking permit fees and from parking meter fees and time limits. These exemptions do not permit parking a vehicle at a place or time that parking is prohibited."

C. Payment of fees

When an application is made for a permit, the fee charged will be for a complete year or for the entire unexpired portion of the University's academic year. Payment of the fee must be made before the permit will be issued. A one dollar fee will be charged for each set of replacement permits and for each card key replaced. Remnants of old permits are to be returned at that time.

D. Refunds

A request for refund will not be honored unless it is filed with the Parking and Traffic Office during the University's fiscal year for which payment of the permit was made. A request for refund must be accompanied by the remnants of the appropriate permit.

Refunds will be made to members of the faculty and staff upon request in the event their service is terminated by a resignation or leave of absence without pay. The refund will be based on the number of full months remaining in the University's academic year.

Refunds will be made upon request to students holding Class "C" or "M" permits who withdraw from the University at the end of the fall semester, but refunds will not be made to students holding "C" or "M" permits who withdraw at the end of the spring semester

A request for a refund will not be honored when a person's privilege to park and drive on campus has been suspended.

Class O parking permits will be issued to certain administrative officers as designated by the President. O permit holders may park in any O space.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

F. Class D Permits

Class D parking pennits will be issued to members of the faculty, staff, and student body whose physical infirmities make mandatory their parking near their work or classroom. Automobiles bearing Class D parking permits may be parked only in spaces specifically designated for the disabled. Class D permits may be issued for limited periods of time or for one year.

Class "D" permits may be issued to students upon certification by the Director of the Student Health Center.

Class "D" permits may be issued to members of the faculty and staff upon certification by the attending physician.

G. Class F (Faculty and Staff) Permits

Members of the faculty holding the rank of instructor or above, and staff members who are paid at a rate of \$1,318.00 per month or more, are eligible to apply for Class F permits. Reserved lot assignments will be drawn in a computer lottery system according to

rank for faculty and monthly salary for others. Reserved Parking Areas will be reserved for automobiles bearing permits issued for each specific area Mondays through Thursday from 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and Fridays from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm. If no spaces are available in the designated lot or if there is urgent need, special permits will be provided at traffic control stations for F permit holders to park on particular occasions for a limited period of time in other restricted areas. Certain spaces in each reserved area will be reserved at all times for those holding permits for that area.

On Mondays through Thursdays from 5:00 pm to 7:15 pm, the parking spaces on the Inner Campus Drive are reserved for F (and A) permit holders.

H. Class A (Faculty and Staff) Permits

Class A parking permits will be issued to the following:

- (1) Any full-time employee of The University of Texas at Austin.
- (2) Any part-time employee who is not registered in the University as a student.
- (3) Individuals registered at the University for courses of instruction, who work at least half-time for the University and who are employed at a full-time rate of \$556.00 or more permonth.
- (4) Temporary Class "A" permits may be issued to students upon certification by the Director of the Student Health Center.
- (5) Teaching assistants with less than a half-time appointment whose jobs involve supervisory roles in the public schools.

Class A permit holders may park in any Class A or C parking area except carpool areas on Mondays through Thursdays from 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and on Fridays from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm and in F, A, or C parking area at other times, except when prohibited by posted signs or markings. Inner Campus Drive parking spaces

are reserved for A (and F) permits on Mondays through Thursdays from 5:00 pm to 7:15~pm.

I. Class C (Student) Permits

Class "C" permit holders may park in any "C" parking area except carpool areas at any time. They are not permitted to park in "F" or "A" areas or to pass through traffic control stations between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekdays. At all other times they may park on campus in any area not specifically reserved for other classes of permits.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

J. Class M Permits

Class M parking permits will be issued to faculty, staff and students for motorcycles, motor -assisted bicycles and motor scooters. These vehicles may be parked ONLY in parking areas set aside for motorcycles,

, motor-assisted bicycles and motor scooters, regardless of the time of the day or day of the week.

K. Class H (Health) Permits

Class H permits will be issued without fee by the Director, Speech and Hearing Clinic, or by the Director, Perceptual Motor Clinic to parents who must bring and stay with their children while they are being

treated in one of the respective clinics. Limited space adjacent to each clinic is reserved for Class H permits, which are invalid elsewhere.

L. Class T (Texan) Permits

Class T parking permits will be issued without fee by the Manager of Student Publications to reporters, photographers and advertising salesmen who, for a limited period of time, must come to The Daily Texan to complete their work, or file a report, and leave on other assignments. Space adjacent to the Communication Center is reserved for these permits, which are invalid elsewhere.

M. Class K Permits

Class K permits will be issued without fee by the Director of News and Public Affairs, Communications Center, to the news broadcast staff who for a limited time must come to the studio to complete their work and leave on other assignments.

N. Class CP (Car Pool) Permits

Car Pool means an arrangement for the use of two or more vehicles by persons not having the same domicile.

Car pool permits will be issued to park in selected Class "F", Class "A", or Class "C" parking lots from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The car pool leader must qualify for the type permit for which he she applied in accordance with current regulations. A

portable car pool card and permits

for each vehicle will be issued to the car pool indicating the lot where the vehicle will park. The fee charged for a car pool permit will be the same as that charged for a similar regular type permit.

Vehicles with car pool permits for Class "F" or Class "A" parking lots but not displaying the

portable car pool card

will be allowed drive-through privileges any time and parking privileges after $5:00~\rm pm$ for that portion of the main campus within the control stations.

Vehicles bearing car pool permits

for Class "C" will be authorized drive-through and parking privileges between 5:00 pm and 8:45 pm Monday through Thursday but will not be permitted to pass through the traffic control stations between 7:30 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.

Applications for car pools may be filed with the Parking and Traffic Section, Service Building, Room 1.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

O. Class R (Retired Faculty, Staff) Permits

Faculty and staff members retired under the teacher retirement system continue to be eligible for the class of permit for which they were eligible at the time of retirement, Upon request, retired faculty and staff members will be issued a complimentary Retired Staff permit with Class "A" parking privileges only after 3:00 p.m. The widow or widower of the retired faculty or staff member is also eligible for the complimentary permit.

P. Temporary Permits

Louding Zone Permits. Passenger cars may not use the LOADING ZONE AREAS at restricted times without a loading zone permit and may be parked then only long enough to conduct the actual loading or unloading operations, whether on University business or otherwise. LOADING ZONE permits are valid only for date and time issued and must reflect an expiration time. The loading zone permits may be obtained from the control station officer or from the University Police Office, Bellmont Hall, Room 823. When control stations are closed and after 5:00 pm, or on weekends, permission to use Loading Zone may be obtained by a telephone call to the University Police, 471-4441 or P.A.X. 1031. Passenger cars shall not be stopped in loading zones or services drives for the purpose of awaiting the arrival of passengers. Commercial vehicles may be parked in loading zones and service drives only for whatever length of time actual loading and unloading operations are in progress.

Official Visitors Permits

Arrangements for the use of official visitor spaces are to be made in advance with the Chief, University Police, the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Deans, and the Directors. Where groups are involved, the arrangements must be made by the appropriate Chairperson, Dean, Director, or equivalent administrator with the Chief, University Police, who will issue temporary permits.

The establishment of space for official visitor s parking must meet

with the approval of the Parking and Traffic Policies

Committee and is subject to the review of the President.

In all cases in which an automobile is parked in an official visitor's space, it must bear the appropriate temporary permit which shows the current date, specifies the parking time required, including the date and time of expiration, and bears the signature of the official authorized to issue the permit.

Commercial Visitor Permits

Arrangements for parking for other persons coming to the University campus on business matters may be made by administrative officials, chairmen of departments, administrative staff members, or faculty members with the office of the Chief, University Police by identifying the person and the gate through which he will enter the campus. A temporary parking permit will be issued to such a visitor.

Parking permits will be issued to a limited number of persons who render a continuing service to University offices (e.g., computer engineers, typewriter servicemen, etc.). Requests for such permits should be directed to the Director of Physical Plant.

Temporary permits will be issued to a limited number of persons coming to the campus to render a special service which is a specific part of the University's work. Requests for individual parking may be made to the Chief, University Police.

VIII. ENFORCEMENT

A. Parking and Traffic Tickets

University Police are authorized to issue two types of tickets for violation of campus parking and traffic regulations:

- (1) University Tickets Those handled by the University of Texas Parking and Traffic Section, subject to University service charges and a right of appeal to the Parking & Traffic Appeals Panel.
- (2) Court Appearance (CA) Tickets Those issued by the University Police but constituting a summons to appear in either the municipal court or a justice court. Criminal penalties, as provided by law, may be imposed by either the municipal court or a justice court for violations of University parking and traffic regulations.
- B. Policy with Respect to CA Tickets. The University reserves the right to issue a CA ticket for any violation. It is the general policy of the University, however, to issue CA tickets only (1) for serious violations, (2) for violations by visitors and persons holding no university permit or driving automobiles which have not been registered with the University, and (3) for excessive University tickets, as set forth in Paragraph C below.
- C. Policy with Respect to University Tickets. University tickets are issued for offenses described on pages 14 & 15. The Administrative Service Charges are as shown. If not paid within ten calendar days after issuance of the ticket, the charges thereafter shall be doubled.

Every person receiving a university ticket shall remit the amount of the service charge to the Parking and Traffic Section, Room 1, Service Building within ten calendar days after receipt of the ticket, to avoid doubling of the charge.

If a person desires to appeal, he shall file his written appeal as provided in Paragraph D below within ten calendar days after receipt of the ticket.

Unpaid service charges for parking offenses are recorded either

in the name of the person in whose name the vehicle is registered with some official state motor vehicle registration department or agency. or in the name of the person who has signed a financial responsibility agreement for parking violations which is on file with the Park-

ing and Traffic Section. Unpaid service charges for other offenses are recorded in the name of the person driving said vehicle and in the name of the person who has registered it with the University Parking and Traffic Section or who maintains the vehicle. If unpaid service charges recorded in the name of any person equal or exceed the sum of \$50.00 the Parking and Traffic Section will notify such person by letter sent to the address of such person as shown in the records of the Parking and Traffic Section. If the records indicate the vehicle has not been registered with Parking and Traffic the notification of unpaid parking tickets will be sent to the registered owner. Such letter shall state that

CA tickets will be issued in lieu of the University tickets or the vehicle may be subject to impoundment unless payment of all accumulated service charges is made within 10 calendar days after the date of such letter. If such payment is not received and the registered owner has not made an election to appear in court in preference to impoundment of his/her vehicle, the vehicle will be impounded pending payment of all outstanding service charges.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

When Court Appearance tickets are issued, the University tickets will be cancelled. Failure to discharge CA tickets will result in the issuance of a warrant for the arrest of such person. A copy of the letter referred to in the preceding paragraph shall also be sent to the person in whose name the vehicle is registered with the Texas State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, if different from the person registering the vehicle with the University. Persons with unpaid service charges recorded in their names shall be ineligible to receive a parking permit while such service charges remain outstanding and unpaid.

D. Appeals from University Tickets. Any person who has received a University ticket may appeal by filing a written statement within ten calendar days after date of issuance with the Parking and Traffic Section setting forth the grounds on which the person believes the issuance of such ticket was improper or inequitable. The following information shall be included in the appeal:

(1) ticket number (s).

(2) license number of vehicle,

(3) Austin address and telephone number,

(4) date of appeal,

(5) signature, and

(6) printed name of person appealing.

Each appeal will be considered by an appeals panel consisting of faculty, staff, and student members.

The filing of an appeal constitutes certification by the individual who signs the same that the facts stated therein are true to the best of his belief. A person may file such supporting statements or materials as he deems appropriate.

If the person filing an appeal desires to appear in person before a panel he shall request such personal appearance in the written statement. Failure to request a personal appearance will result in the

Parking and Traffic Appeal Panel determining the appeal on the basis of the written statement of the person, the supporting materials submitted by the person and information supplied by the traffic officer issuing the ticket. If a personal appearance is requested, the person appealing shall be permitted to participate in the hearing and present such testimony and information as he deems appropriate. Such person shall also have the right to examine witnesses.

The panel may order the payment of the service charge in whole or in part, or the cancellation of the ticket(s), as deemed appropriate. A person filing an appeal will be notified in writing of the decision of the panel. If the appeal is denied and the appellant desires to further contest the validity of the ticket in municipal court, a court appearance ticket will be issued, and the University ticket will be cancelled. Such request shall be in writing and sent to the Parking and Traffic Section within ten calendar days of the date of the letter notifying the appellant of the panel's decision.

If an appeal is denied and the person fails to pay the charges within ten calendar days after being notified, a court appearance ticket will be issued, and the University ticket will be cancelled. In this event, the service charges shall thereafter be doubled.

E. Suspension of Privilege to Drive and Park on Campus. Any person who within a period of twelve months commencing on September 1 of any year receives two CA tickets or University tickets with service charges equal to or in excess of \$75.00, automatically loses his privilege

of driving or parking a motor vehicle on the Main campus for one year; upon payment of all service charges the suspended permit will be valid. The loss of the privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus shall commence three days after the Parking and Traffic Section mails a letter to the person, at the address of such person as shown in the records of the Section, stating that such person's privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus has been suspended by reason of excessive violations. Such letter shall state the date on which the suspension commences and the date on which it ends.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

Any person who (a) forges or alters a permit, (b) uses a forged or altered permit, (c) transfers a permit, affixes a permit to a vehicle other, than that for which it was issued, or fails to destroy a permit when required to do so by these regulations, with the intention of providing any person with parking privileges he is not entitled to under these regulations, or (d) provides false information to obtain a parking permit, with knowledge thereof, or (e) parks or drives a vehicle to which there has been affixed a permit which the registered owner, or regular driver, did not purchase, shall lose the privilege of driving or parking on the University campus for a period of one year. Such suspension shall commence three days after the Parking and Traffic Section mails a letter to the person, at the address of such person as shown in the records of the Section, stating that such person's privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus has been suspended and describing the offense. Such letter shall state the date on which the suspension commences and the date on which it ends. While a person's privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus is suspended, it is unlawful (1) for that person to drive or park any motor vehicle on the campus and (2) for any person to drive or park a vehicle registered in the name of such person on the campus.

If a person whose privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus has been suspended is charged with any violation while on campus, a CA ticket will be issued for such violation. If a university ticket is issued to such person, a CA ticket for such offenses will be served upon such person by a peace officer. Failure to discharge such CA tickets will result in the issuance of a warrant for the arrest of such person. Upon the issuance of the CA ticket, the university ticket will be cancelled.

If a person whose privilege of driving or parking on the campus has been suspended receives a university or CA ticket by reason of having a vehicle on the campus during the period of his suspension, the period of suspension shall be extended so that it expires 12 months from the date the person receives such additional CA or university ticket. In addition, the vehicle may be impounded and the violation of the suspension may be reported to the Dean of Students for

possible disciplinary action if the person is a student, or to the appropriate Dean, Director or Administrative official, if the person is a faculty or staff member.

A person receiving notice that his privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus has been suspended may appeal the suspension within five calendar days on the grounds that the imposition of such suspension is improper or will create serious and substantial hardship. Such appeal shall be governed by the provision of Part D above. No appeal shall be considered if there are any unpaid tickets outstanding at the time such appeal is filed.

F. Destruction of Permit when Suspended. Every person receiving notice that his privilege of driving or parking on the campus has been suspended shall remove the parking pennit from every vehicle registered in his name and return remnants thereof to the Parking and Traffic Section within five calendar days after receipt of such notice.

Failure to do so may be reported to the Dean of Students if the person is a student, or to the appropriate Dean, Director, or Administrative official, if the person is a faculty or staff member.

G. Eligibility to Obtain New Permit during Period of Suspension. A person whose privilege of driving or parking on the campus is suspended and not reinstated shall be ineligible to receive a parking permit of any type during the period of suspension.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D.)

H. Impoundment. The term "impounding" includes removal or immobilization of the vehicle in question.

In addition to any service charge that may be levied by the University for an offense, the owner of an impounded vehicle must also pay a commercial wrecker service fee in the amount of \$20.00, and storage charges in the amount of \$2.00 per day after the first 24 hours. When an impounding violation occurs and the owner or driver of the vehicle appears on the scene before the arrival of the wrecker, the vehicle will not be impounded. If the owner or driver appears on the scene after the arrival of the wrecker, and the wrecker driver has either made a hook-up or has signed the police report for custody of the vehicle, the following will apply:

(a) the vehicle will not be impounded;

(b) and the owner or driver will be expected to pay the wrecker a fee in lieu of towing in the amount of \$10.00.

FACULTY RECOMMENDATION. The following recommendation has been passed by the University Council. I recommend approval.

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THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT AUSTIN June 9, 1978

GRADUATE ASSEMBLY RECOMMENDATION. The following proposal has been passed by the Graduate Assembly. I recommend approval.

The Graduate Assembly at its meeting of January 25, 1978, approved the following paragraph on the Continuous Registration of Doctoral Students (D&P 1472-1478). It is proposed that it appear in the new edition of the Graduate Catalog, on page 25, as the concluding paragraph of the section entitled "Admission to Candidacy."

After a student has been admitted to candidacy for the Ph.D., he or she is required to enroll and pay tuition before the twelfth class day of the fall semester and the spring semester of each academic year until attaining the degree. A student may, under unusual circumstances, apply to his or her Committee on Graduate Studies for a leave of absence. The application for leave must be approved by the committee and by the Vice-President and Dean of Graduate Students.

Comparable paragraphs about the continous enrollment for other doctoral degrees, are also to be added: for the Doctor of Education degree a comparable statement is to be added to the paragraph on Admission to Candidacy on page 28 of the Graduate Catalog; for the Doctor of Musical Arts, to the second paragraph describing the degree and its requirements on page 28; and as the concluding paragraph in the description of the Pharm.D. degree on page 31.



ARTICLE II

SUBDIVISION I - VEHICLE REGISTRATION, PARKING PERMITS

Section 4

Persons who pay the required fee for one vehicle may obtain multiple parking permit decals for other vehicles which they may own $[\tau]$ by:




