GOVERNMENT-SPONSORED RESEARCH GRANT

Grant No. GU-1962, Institutional Grant for Science, by which the National Science Foundation provides \$26,325.00 for the year beginning June 13, 1966 for scientific purposes. This Institutional Grant is based upon grants made to units of The University of Texas that are not separately eligible for Institutional Grants in 1966.

The scientific and educational projects under this grant will be approved or administered by the Central Administration.

1. Approval Of Claim And Settlement For \$1,776.71 To Cover Loss On Steam Turbine At The Main University Under Our Boiler And Machinery Insurance Policy With The Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection And Insurance Company

Comptroller Sparenberg recommends that a loss claim be approved and ratified in the amount of \$1,776.71.

On April 19, 1965, a Westinghouse steam turbine (Turbine EM25 Serial No. 15-A-1231-1) driving a 1,200 ton refrigeration compressor in Central Water Chilling Station No. 1 failed. The failure was of a serious nature. The difficulty appears to have started with a bearing failure. Ultimately a journal bearing, thrust bearing, governor pump gears, and oil pump gears were involved.


When the failure occurred a Westinghouse Service Engineer was summoned at once with the hope that the repairs could be made with repair parts on hand. Since this turbine is insured under a policy provided by Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection and Insurance Company and the machine is inspected regularly by its inspectors, notification of the failure was given to this agency. Mr. John H. Chiles was the person notified.

The repair was completed in due time and the machine was brought back onto the line. The expense involved in restoring it to service was as follows:

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on August 26 and 27, 1966.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants, and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

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1. Contract AF 30(602)-4246, by which the Department of the Air Force, Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss Air Force Base, New York, provides \$254,833.00 for support of "Research in Russian-English Translation on Syntactic Level." The contract is effective for the period May 15, 1966 through September 14, 1968, with the final report due thirty days after approval of the draft copy. Of the sum of \$254,833.00, \$54,977.00 is allotted at this time for the period through September 30, 1966. The research will be performed at the Linguistics Research Center under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.
2. Modification No. 1, Change Order to Contract AF 33(615)-5014, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, changes the Office of Administration of the contract from Systems Engineering Group, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, to the Office of Naval Research Resident Representative, The University of Texas. The design and fabrication of 130 KMC propagation link instrumentation continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of C. W. Tolbert, Assistant Director
3. Modification No. 2, Change Order to Contract AF 33(615)-5014, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, changes the office of administration of the contract from Office of Naval Research Resident Representative, University of Texas, to Systems Engineering Group, Research and Technology Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio. 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FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council. I recommend approval.

The College of Engineering states that the changes are desirable in order to bring current catalogue materials in line with current and proposed course offerings that are designed to enhance the engineering degree program.
