

HOGG FOUNDATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH ALLOCATIONS FOR PROGRAM SUPPORT

Allocations were made from the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health Trustee Approved Program Support account to the following institutions and agencies:

Temple Coordinated Child Care Council, Inc., Temple, Texas - \$10,500

1. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a third and final year grant of \$10,500.00 for the Temple Coordinated Child Care Council Day Care Program. This grant will continue well-executed projects and continuing expansion of the program of the first two years of operation.

To the projects of the past two years has been added the new Head Start segment which will function in Belton and Killeen. Additional funds have made this possible from the Texas State Department of Human Resources and community funds. Expansion of afternoon and summer day care for children of mothers who are employed in low income jobs, which are held in two public schools, are making possible attendance of larger numbers of children. Close collaboration continues with the Central Counties Center for MH-MR Services which assures services to children and their families who are encountering emotional problems.

The third and final year grant program is from June 1, 1978 through May 31, 1979. A comprehensive report and fiscal accounting will be submitted to the Hogg Foundation by Ms. Mary H. Lynch, Executive Director, Temple Coordinated Child Care Council, Inc. at the termination of this grant.

Drs. Wayne H. Holtzman and Bernice Milburn Moore will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

Tri-County Community Action, Inc., Center, Texas - \$10,833

2. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of a grant of \$10,833.00 for the period September 1, 1978 to August 31, 1979, to the Tri-County Community Head Start Mental Health Program in Sabine, Shelby, and San Augustine counties. A mental health consultant will work in a demonstration program for children enrolled in a Head Start project and with their parents, teachers, and other staff members. Close cooperation between these three groups will be encouraged to offer maximum opportunities for growth and development of pre-school youngsters in an area where necessary services are minimal or non-existent. Of 112 children enrolled in four schools in Center, Tenaha, Hemphill, and Broaddus, Texas, 101 of them are from families with poverty-level incomes.

Parents will share in the chances to learn new family and personal skills by participation with their children and teachers in school and also in groups of their own. Home visits are planned where indicated by the mental health consultant.

Ms. Analea Rawson, director of the Head Start program of the Tri-County Community Action, will be responsible for furnishing the

Foundation a fiscal accounting of the funds used and also a final report of the project at the end of August, 1979.

Dr. Bernice Milburn Moore and Ms. Adrian Fowler will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

The Junior League of Austin, Parenting Office, Austin, Texas - \$4,400

3. After careful review of the report of this grant by Mrs. J. Douglas Hudson, the Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending a second year of support of the Parenting Office in the amount of \$4,400.00. These funds will go primarily for support of the director in close collaboration with the Junior League. The Hogg Foundation's first grant to this project of \$7,060.00 was matched by local grants from the State Department of Human Resources and the Austin-Travis County MHMR Center.

The Junior League of Austin mounted a comprehensive, multipurpose program for its Family Place Project combining several major services for families and children of Austin centered in a single location. In January, 1977, the League approved an implementation plan for creating a non-profit corporation, The Family Place, Inc., with representatives from the Child and Family Service, Austin Evaluation Center, Austin Child Guidance Center, and The Junior League. To this comprehensive family and child service program, the Junior League of Austin committed \$150,000. Other Austin family and child agencies are expected to avail themselves of space in The Family Place as time goes on.

A report of the progress of this second year along with a fiscal accounting of the funds is to be submitted to the Foundation by the new director, Jean Avera.

Drs. Wayne H. Holtzman and O. Stanley Brown will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

Toxas Association for Children with Learning Disabilities, El Paso, Texas - \$6,890

4. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval for a one-year grant in the amount of \$6,890.00 for the period July 1, 1978 to July 1, 1979.

Three primary goals are as follows: (1) the identification of services, goals and objectives to help individual learning disabled students with an appropriate education; (2) establishment of effective communications between home and school; and (3) information about procedures which can be undertaken for the child. When these initial goals are reached, there will be a network of well-trained and informed advocacy teams to assist parents and handicapped persons in achieving appropriate educational services.

Ms. Betty Deu Press, State President of the Texas Association for Children with Learning Disabilities, will be the person responsible for administration of the project. She will submit both a fiscal and a narrative evaluation at the close of the grant period in July of 1979.

Bert Kruger Smith will serve as liaison person for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

The University of Texas Medical Branch

Department of Community and Social Psychiatry and Pediatrics - \$15,687

5. This research grant entitled "Combined Psychologic Counseling and Medroxyprogesterone-Acetate Treatment of Adult Males and Sex Offending Behavior" has been reviewed by the Hogg Foundation Executive Committee and the Committee is recommending approval of \$15,687 for this project to assist largely in partial costs of a secretary, a research technician who will be performing androgen analyses, consumable laboratory supplies, and travel for reporting the research results, as well as minor publication costs in reporting the outcome of this study. The Texas Department of Corrections will be cooperating with Dr. Paul A. Walker, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychiatry, and his colleagues in this clinical research project combining psychotherapy and endocrine therapy for sex offenders. Dr. Paul A. Walker is also Director of the Gender Clinic. The Upjohn Pharmaceutical Company is providing medication, as well as some laboratory services, free of charge.

As a unique medical facility in this part of the country, the Gender Clinic can make some truly significant contributions through our understanding of impulse control in sex offenders so that they stand some chance of permanent rehabilitation.

Progress reports and a fiscal accounting of these funds will be furnished the Foundation by Dr. Walker during this grant period.

Dr. Wayne H. Holtzman is the liaison person for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

Houston County Child, Inc., Crockett, Texas -\$4,500

6. The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending approval of an emergency grant of \$4,500.00 for the period July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979 to the Houston County Child, Inc. (LIFT, Inc.) Summer Day Care Program to be used as a local matching grant for \$30,000 already allocated by the State Department of Human Resources. This is a summer project of child care for 65 youngsters from five to thirteen years of age and a summer program for 125 other children brought in from rural areas for learning experiences in group and personal behavior. Parents of these children are employed and are considered in the category of the working poor. Without this project, which carries the highest priority for the Department of Human Resources in the Nacogdoches region, these children will be left without personal attention as well as without opportunity to continue in a planned program of activities especially designed for rural youngsters in an area of minimal resources.

Adrian Fowler, Executive Assistant of the Hogg Foundation, will use this emergency funding project as an opportunity to explore with the

local communities of East Texas and the regional Department of Human Resources grant administrator the development of financial support of programs in rural areas. She will also assist in longrange planning for the enrichment of such programs in Texas.

Ms. Julia Ann Lee, Executive Director, and Mr. Jeff Moore, Jr., Assistant Director, Houston County Child, Inc. (LIFT, Inc.) will be responsible for administration of the Summer Day Care Program and will submit both a narrative and evaluative description as well as a fiscal accounting at the close of the grant period in July 1979.

Dr. Bernice Milburn Moore and Ms. Adrian Fowler will serve as liaison persons for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

The University of Texas at Austin

Center for Social Work Research

7. Community Support Program Research - \$6,638

The Hogg Foundation Executive Committee is recommending for approval a one-time grant in the amount of \$6,638.00 to the Center for Social Work Research at The University of Texas at Austin. These funds will be used to conduct a pilot study of Community Support Programs. These programs are currently in the developmental stage in 17 states, including Texas. Their goal is not only the provision of services by mental health specialists to the chronically mentally ill, but also the establishment of an organizational structure that makes it possible to integrate a wide variety of community services. The Center has proposed a study and evaluation of a number of these centers to attempt to determine those structural features that are most likely to contribute to the CSP goals as well as the problems that may hinder goal attainment. The present request is for funds for part of a pilot study which will develop and test specific information gathering instruments to be used in a larger study which, hopefully, will be funded by NIMH. The study sites are Wichita Falls, Texas and Minneapolis, Minnesota. The present grant will cover only the Texas research and the Center will seek funds elsewhere for the out of state data gathering.

Dr. David Austin will be responsible for the administration of the project and will submit both a fiscal accounting and a narrative evaluation of the project at the close of the grant period.

Dr. Charles M. Bonjean will serve as liaison person for the Hogg Foundation for this project.

BUSINESS CONTRACT

I recommend ratification of the following contract:

Student Loan Services Agreement between Republic National Bank of Dallas and The University of Texas at Arlington whereby Republic will perform EDP services for The University of Texas at Arlington in connection with National Defense/National Direct/ Nursing student loan program in which the University participates. Republic shall begin to perform data processing services hereunder on May 24, 1978, and shall continue for one year(s) beginning with the first full month of service, at the end of which period this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until written notice of termination is delivered by one party to the other.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS

The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors and fiscal officers.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular university operating procedures and contractual limitations. I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures.

GRANTS, CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS (NON-GOVERNMENTAL)

- 1. Contract No. 46914 between Science Applications, Inc., Huntsville, Alabama, and The University of Texas at Arlington for programmatic support to Science Applications, Inc. to develop a national plan for innovative shelter design. The amount of the contract is \$42,533.00 and the period of performance is March 24, 1978 through August 31, 1978.
- 2. Subcontract between The Pennsylvania State University and The University of Texas at Arlington whereas Penn State received Prime Grant No. AF8 from the National Institute of Corrections, Bureau of Prisons, U. S. Department of Justice, to support a project entitled "A Comparative Study of the Management Structure and Rehabilitative Services Generation in State-Operated Jails, Regional Jails, and Selected County/City Jails." The total estimated cost shall not exceed \$30,823.00 and the period of performance shall commence on December 1, 1977 and continue through November 30, 1978.
- 3. Purchase Order No. CX-1871 dated June 1, 1978, from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Lincoln Laboratory, Lexington, Massachusetts, in the amount of \$12,335.00. This purchase order is to conduct retrofit photovoltaic modifications as described on pages 21 and 22 of The University of Texas at Arlington proposal entitled "Performance Study of a Combined Solar Thermal and Photovoltaic System for a Single Family Residence" dated March 2, 1978. This purchase order is for the period June 1, 1978 through August 31, 1978.

- 4. Short Form Research Agreement RP 1175-2 between the Electric Power Research Institute Inc., and The University of Texas at Arlington whereby it is understood and agreed that the total estimated cost of performing the services set forth in Schedule of Work is \$25,500.00 and such cost shall be funded equally by EPRI and General Electric Company. The maximum expenditure for all purposes authorized by this Agreement is \$12,750.00. The term of this Agreement shall be from January 16, 1978 through January 15, 1979.
- 5. Amendment No. 3 to Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington and Electric Power Research Institute Inc. (RP849-3-3) whereby The University of Texas at Arlington is awarded an increase of \$35,048.00 bringing the total contract to \$272,859.00. This is in support of the project entitled "Determining Load Characteristics for Transient Performances" which is under the direction of Dr. Mo-Shing Chen, Director, Energy Systems Research Center. The period of performance has been extended through December 31, 1978.
- 6. Letter dated March 31, 1978, from Research Corporation, New York, awarding \$4,830.00 to The University of Texas at Arlington in support of proposal entitled "The Measurement of Differential Cross Sections for the Scattering of Positrons by Gas Atoms and Molecules" with the principal investigator Dr. Paul G. Coleman, Visiting Assistant Professor of Physics. The grant begins July, 1978 and carries no time limit.
- 7. Letter dated May 8, 1978 from the American Heart Association, Texas Affiliate, Inc., awarding The University of Texas at Arlington the sum of \$1,070.00 in support of grant "Portable Gas Analyzer." The principal investigator is Dr. John R. Axe, Biomedical Engineering program. The grant is for the period beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1978.

This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.

- 12. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and Tarrant County Tenants' Union, Fort Worth, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and the Lena Pope Home, Inc., Fort Worth, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.
- 16. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and the Senior Citizens Centers, Inc., Fort Worth, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.
- 17. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and Volunteers of America, Fort Worth, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.
- 18. Agreement between The University of Texas at Arlington Graduate School of Social Work and the Marillac Social Center, Dallas, Texas, to jointly offer a social work course to one or more social work graduate student(s) with the number of students to be mutually determined annually. This agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely, subject to annual review and revision.
- 19. Letter dated May 10, 1978, from the City of Fort Worth awarding \$3,500.00 to the Institute of Urban Studies, The University of Texas at Arlington, in support of proposal entitled "Victimization and Citizen Attitude Surveys: A Comparison of Interview Methods." I. General Information

Pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Education Code, the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System has promulgated these regulations pertaining to the operation and parking of vehicles on the grounds, streets, drives, alleys, and other institutional property of The University of Texas at Arlington. These regulations are to insure the safety of all persons who use the campus and to provide for optimum use of limited parking facilities. The regulations [apply-on-all-parts-of-the-eampus-throughout-the-day-and night] are supplementary to all laws and regulations of the State of Texas and the City of Arlington that govern the use of vehicles.

Motor vehicles of all types, including motorcycles, motor scooters, and motor bicycles, are subject to the provisions of these regulations and MUST HAVE A PROPERLY DISPLAYED CURRENT REGISTRATION DECAL IN ORDER TO PARK OR DRIVE ON THE CAMPUS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT ARLINGTON [must-have-a properly-displayed-eurrent-registration-decal-in-order-to-park-or-drive-on the-eampus-of-The-University-of-Texas-at-Arlington]. As used in these regulations, the term "campus" or "University campus" means all property owned or controlled by The University of Texas at Arlington.

Neither The University of Texas at Arlington nor its officers or employees shall assume any responsibility for the care or protection of any vehicle or its contents at any time that such vehicle is operated or parked upon the campus.

II. General Regulations

- The provisions of these regulations must be complied with on all parts of the campus throughout all hours of the day and night with the followexception: Any vehicle with a current University decal may park in any University lot except those areas that are "No Parking", "Handicapped Parking", or "University Vehicle Parking" during the following periods: 9 PM Monday - 7 AM Tuesday; 9 PM Tuesday - 7 AM Wednesday; 9 PM Wednesday - 7 AM Thursday; 9 PM Thursday - 7 AM Friday; 6 PM Friday - 7 AM Monday.
- THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT ARLINGTON RESERVES THE RIGHT TO IMPOUND ALL VEHICLES PARKED IN VIOLATION OF THESE REGULATIONS, [The-University-of Texas-at-Arlington-reserves-the-right-to-remove-all-vehicles-parked-in violation-of-these-regulations] all vehicles parked so as to obstruct ingress or egress to any building, and all vehicles parked so as to obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic. The owners of such vehicles shall be responsible for payment of all costs incurred in the removal and storage of such vehicles and neither the University nor its authorized personnel shall be liable for any loss or damage resulting from such removal or storage. The term "impounding" includes removal or immobilization of the vehicle in question. When an impounding violation occurs and the owner or driver of the vehicle appears on the scene before the arrival of the wrecker, and the wrecker driver has either made a hook-up or has signed the police report for custody of the vehicle, the following will apply:
 - (a) the vehicle will not be impounded;
 - (b) and the owner or driver will be expected to pay the wrecker a fee in lieu of towing.

The owners of impounded vehicles must come to the University Police Department to obtain a vehicle release form. Owners must present sufficient identification as being the owner of said vehicle before the release form will be issued.

- No vehicle shall be parked on the campus except where posted signs indicate that parking is permissable. Legal parking is permitted in any unimproved unmarked University owned parking area that may be in use at any particular time.
- Loading zones and service drives may be used only by trucks, pickups, and trailers during the time while <u>ACTUALLY LOADING OR UNLOADING</u> [aetually 10. leading-er-unleading].
- The University reserves the right to modify or change any regulations within [with] the year.

III. Bicycles

- Bicycles must be ridden in accordance with State and local laws. Additionally, certain regulations are in effect on the campus.
 - As a deterrent to theft, and to aid in prompt identification of a lost or stolen bicycle, the University Police will register an owner's bicycle at no cost provided the serial number is provided [supplied].
 - b. A bicycle may be ridden on any campus street or other areas where pedestrians may walk with the following exceptions [except-the-follewing]: inside any building, any landscape improvements not open to pedestrian use (including malls, flower beds, hedges, shrubbery), and outside areas designated for other than pedestrian use, where official signs prohibit parking or riding.
 - c. The operator of a bicycle must give right-of-way to pedestrians at all times.

- d. Bicycles $\underline{MAY\ NOT}\ [may-not]$ be secured to any tree, shrub or plant. Bicycle racks are placed at strategic points on the campus.
- e. Bicycles MAY NOT [may-net] be left unattended on any sidewalk, street, driveway, loading zone, fire lane, building porch or patio, or pedestrain walk.
- f. Violations of these regulations will result in the <u>bicycle being removed (impounded)</u> to the University Police Department where the owner may retrieve it after showing proper owner identification.
- g. The orange UTA Courtesy Bikes are for the use and convenience of persons traversing the inner campus from building to building, but may not be taken from the inner campus area for any reason.
- h. [g] All violations of campus bicycle regulations are considered traffic violations, and enforcement fees will be assessed accordingly.

IV. [III] Registration of Vehicles

- 1. All students, staff and faculty members of The University of Texas at Arlington who park motor vehicles within the controlled areas must register their vehicles with the Parking Office, room B-13, E. E. Davis Hall, on or before the date that a vehicle is to be operated or parked on the campus. [Registration-decals-entitling-the-owner-of-a-vehicle-to operate-and-park-such-vehicle-on-the-campus-of-The-University-of-Texas-at Arlington-must-be-obtained-from-the-Parking-Office, Room-B-13,-E.-E.-Davis Hall,-on-or-before-the-date-that-a-vehicle-is-to-be-operated-or-parked-on the-eampus-]
- 2. Students, faculty and staff may obtain registration decals for their vehicles upon completion of the registration forms and payment of the required parking fee. In the case of faculty and staff, only vehicles which are owned by the faculty or staff member, or his spouse, may be registered. (Only-graduate-students-who-are-teaching-or-on-research-and funded-by-The-University-of-Texas-at-Arlington-and-who-are-appointed-for at-least-20-hours-weekly-are-eligible-for-faculty/staff-parking-privileges. A-letter,-from-either-the-Bepartment-Chairman-or-Administrative-Birector of-a-unity-must-be-presented-to-the-University-Police-for-graduate-students to-qualify-for-a-faculty-and-staff-decal) A student is defined as any person enrolled in The University of Texas at Arlington for any day, night, short, special, audit or seminar courses. A student may register a vehicle only if it is owned by the student, his spouse, or his parents. Proof-of-swnership-is-required-at-the-time-of-registration-of-any-vehicle.
- 3. [4] Graduate students who are teaching or on research and funded by The University of Texas at Arlington AND WHO ARE APPOINTED FOR AT LEAST 20 HOURS WEEKLY ON A PERSONNEL TRANSACTION FORM (PO-1) are eligible for faculty/staff parking privileges. Adjunct or visiting professors who teach less than 20 hours weekly are eligible for faculty/staff parking privileges. Both graduate students and visiting or adjunct professors must present a letter to the UNIVERSITY POLICE from either the Department Chairman or Administrative Director of a unit to qualify for a faculty/staff decal.
- 4. [3] All disabled veterans whose vehicles display the specially designed license plates issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the words "DISABLED VETERAN" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e and all permanently disabled persons whose vehicles display the specially designed symbols, tabs, or other devices issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the word "DISABLED" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e.l are exempt from parking permit fees and from parking meter fees and time limits. These exemptions do not permit parking a vehicle at a place or time that parking is prohibited. PROOF OF DISABILITY MUST BE SHOWN at the Parking

Office at the time of registration of any vehicle. [A-veteran-of-the Armed-Forces-of-the-United-States-who,-as-a-result-of-military-service, has-suffered-a-70%-service-connected-disability,-and-who-receives-compensation-from-the-Federal-government-because-of-such-disability,-is-entitled-to-register-without-charge-one-passenger-car-or-light-commercial-vehicle-having-a-manufacturer's-rated-carrying-capacity-of-one (1)-ton-or-less-for-his-own-personal-use---Proof-of-disability-must-be shown-at-the-Parking-Office-at-the-time-of-registration-of-any-vehicle-An-organization-which-owns-a-motor-vehicle-used-exclusively-for-transportation-of-disabled-veterans,-is-entitled-to-register-said-vehicle without-charge.]

5. [4] Students, faculty or staff who pay the required fee for one vehicle may obtain MULTIPLE REGISTRATION DECALS [multiple-registration-decals] for other vehicles which they may own, provided no more than four vehicles are registered and PROOF OF OWNERSHIP IS SHOWN OF ALL VEHICLES AT TIME OF REGISTRATION [proof-of-ownership-is-shown-of-all-vehicles-at time-of-registration]. A fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each additional vehicle so registered.

EXAMPLES:

- 1. If you originally register one automobile and it becomes necessary to register an additional automobile you may do so by turning in the remnants of your first decal, pay the additional fee of \$1.00, and providing PROOF OF OWNERSHIP OF BOTH AUTOMOBILES [proof-of ownership-of-both-automobiles]. If the original decal cannot be returned an additional fee of \$1.00 will be charged. You will be issued two (2) pool decals with the same number.
- 2. If you originally register one automobile and it becomes necessary to register a motorcycle also you may do so by paying the additional fee of \$1.00 and providing PROOF OF OWNERSHIP OF BOTH YOUR AUTOMOBILE AND MOTORCYCLE [proof-of-ownership-of-beth-your-automobile-and motorcycle]. You will be issued a motorcycle decal. The decal for your automobile will remain the same.
- 3. If you originally register a motorcycle and it becomes necessary to register an automobile you may do so by paying the additional fee of \$1.00, additional price between your motorcycle decal and your automobile and showing PROOF OF OWNERSHIP OF BOTH YOUR MOTORCYCLE AND AUTOMOBILE [preef-ef-ewnership-ef-beth-your-metercyele-and automobile]. You will be issued an automobile decal. The decal for your motorcycle will remain the same. Multiple registration entitles the holder to PARK ONLY ONE VEHICLE ON CAMPUS AT ANY GIVEN TIME.
- 6. [5] Rider-Pool students, faculty or staff who pay the required fee for one vehicle may obtain a special Rider-Pool decal for other vehicles used in the Rider-Pool. A fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each additional vehicle so registered. A Rider-Pool must consist of at least two nor can it exceed eight vehicles. All persons must be together at the time of registration of vehicles. Those wishing to register more than one vehicle must bring PROOF OF OWNERSHIP OF EACH VEHICLE [proof-of-ownership-of-each-vehicle] to be registered. ONLY ONE OF SUCH VEHICLES MAY BE PARKED ON CAMPUS AT ANY GIVEN TIME.
- 7. [6] Individuals having physical handicaps may apply for special parking assignments by submitting a letter to the Parking Office setting forth the reason for the request. Written confirmation of the person's [person's] handicap must be obtained from the University Health Center before the Parking Office will issue a handicap decal.
- 8. [7] Temporary Parking Permits good for a period of seven consecutive days may be obtained for a fee of \$1.00. Such permits will allow students, faculty, and staff members who have not previously registered their vehicles to bring that vehicle on campus for short

periods of time.

- 9. [8] The fees for registration and parking for motor vehicles on the campus of The University of Texas at Arlington shall be as shown in Table I. All parking fees are payable at the Bursar's Office, E. E. Davis Hall, prior to the registration of the motor vehicle with the Parking Office.
- 10. [9] Students, faculty, or staff members who terminate their enrollment or their employment, as the case may be, PRIOR TO SPRING REGISTRATION and who have paid a vehicle registration fee for the long session may receive a partial refund of the fee in accordance with Table II, provided they turn in the remnants of their decal on or before the census date of the spring semester. NO REFUNDS ON PARKING DECALS WILL BE GIVEN AFTER CENSUS DATE OF SPRING SEMESTER.
- 11. [40] Any change affecting the registration of ownership of a vehicle for which a decal has been issued must be reported promptly to the Parking Office. Failure to report such a change will result in cancellation of parking privileges.
- 12. []] Dormitory students who pay the required fee for one vehicle may obtain additional decals for other vehicles which they may own provided each vehicle is registered separately.

- 3. No vehicle may be parked in an area other than that designated by the decal on the vehicle except as in Part II, Section 2.
- 4. [4] [5] Faculty and staff members who have obtained parking decals may use any faculty/staff parking lot on campus. [Bormitory-students-with valid-dormitory-decals-may-use-an-"A"-lot-between-2:30-p-m--and-7:00 a-m--daily] [Lipseomb-Bormitory-permit-holders-may-use-any-"A"-lot at-any-time].
- 5. The approved dimensions for vehicles to park in the small car parking lot is 67" (width) X 175" (length).

VI. [∀] Parking Techniques

- 4. No vehicles shall be parked;
 - A. In a backed-in position where diagonal parking is permitted.
 - B. For periods longer than those specifically designated.
 - C. With double or other forms of multiple parking.

VII. [¥4] Parking Decals

- A PERMIT TO PARK ON CAMPUS WILL NOT BE HONORED UNLESS THE DECAL IS PERMANENTLY AFFIXED TO THE LOWER LEFT-HAND CORNER OF THE BACK GLASS, EXCEPT CONVERTIBLES, STATION WAGONS, VEHICLES EQUIPPED WITH REAR WINDOW DEFROSTERS, OR ANY OTHER VEHICLE WHOSE REAR WINDOW IS CONCEALED. FOR THOSE VEHICLES THE DECAL MUST BE PERMANENTLY AFFIXED TO THE LOWER RIGHT-HAND CORNER OF THE FRONT WINDSHIELD. [A-permit to-park-on-eampus-will-not-be-honored-unless-the-decal-is-permanently-affixed-to-the-lower-left-hand-corner-of-the-back-glass, except-convertibles, -station-wagons, -vehicles-equipped-with-rear window-defrosters, -or-any-other-vehicle-whose-rear-window-is-concealed: --For-those-vehicles-the-decal-must-be-permanently-affixed to-the-lower-right-hand-corner-of-the-front-windshield]
- 2. Parking permit decals for motorcycles, motorbikes, and motorscooters without windshields must be permanently affixed [te-the-vehicle's gas-tank-er] in a location in which the decal may be easily seen and the number on the decal easily read. Application directions are

provided on the peel-off portion of the decal.

- 5. [6] The person in whose name the parking permit decal is issued is responsible for all the parking and traffic violations of that motor vehicle for which the permit was issued. If the operator of a motor vehicle involved in a violation is not the person in whose name that parking permit decal was issued, then both the operator and the person in whose name the permit was issued are responsible for the violation. [All-old-permits-must-be-removed-before-the-new-one-is-affixed].
- 6. [7] A replacement decal will be issued without charge whenever there is a sale or transfer of the vehicle, a replacement of the rear window or windshield, or defective decal, provided the remnants of the original decal are turned in to the Parking Office. Otherwise, a \$1.00 fee will be charged and PROOF OF OWNERSHIP [proof-of-ownership] of the vehicle to be registered must be shown.
- 7. [8] A decal holder is eligible for up to three reissues; thereafter, the \$1.00 fee must be paid for each decal reissued.
- 8. [9] If after having bought a parking permit, it becomes necessary to use a non-registered vehicle for emergency or other reasons, a special parking permit must be obtained from the PARKING OFFICE and affixed to the vehicle in the proper manner. A SPECIAL TEMPORARY PERMIT [special-temporary-permit] will be given for periods not to exceed five (5) school days and no more than three (3) in succession for Fall, Spring, or First and Second Summer sessions. After three (3) permits have been issued during any one session, a fee of \$1.00 is charged for each additional permit.

VIII. [VII] Visitor Parking

4. When groups of visitors are involved, arrangements shall be made with the Chief of Police, who will issue temporary permits for the visitors to park in other areas if the visitor reserved spaces are not sufficient. Any department or organization of The University of Texas at Arlington, which will have visitors on campus requiring more than fifty (50) parking spaces, should not send out any announcements or invitations without prior coordination with the Chief of Police.

THE UNIVERSITY RESERVES THE RIGHT, ON ANY LOT, TO RESERVE SPACES FOR VISITORS TO THE CAMPUS. [The-University-reserves-the-right, on any lot, to-reserve-spaces-for-visitors-to-the-campus]

IX. [VIII] Enforcement

- 1. Police officers of The University of Texas at Arlington are authorized to issue either of two types of <u>citations</u> [tiekets] for violations of these traffic and parking regulations:
 - A. University <u>citations</u> [tiekets] which may be satisfied by payment of the stated enforcement fee to the Bursar's Office, subject to a right of appeal to the Traffic and Parking Appeals Committee.
 - B. Court appearance <u>citations</u> [tiekets] which constitute a summons to appear in a justice or municipal court in the same manner as traffic tickets issued by the Texas Highway Patrol. Criminal penalties, as provided by law, may be imposed by the court for violation of these regulations.

[A-ticket-will-be-issued-by-the-University-Police-in-all-instances where-a-vehicle-is-operated-or-parked-on-the-campus-of-The-University of-Texas-at-Arlington-in-violation-of-these-regulations.]

2. An enforcement and administration fee of \$3.00 will be assessed for each University citation for violators with valid decals. The student, staff, or faculty member who receives a citation must pay the

\$3.00 enforcement fee at the Bursar's Office within five (5) school days from the date of the citation. An enforcement and administration fee of \$24.00 will be assessed for each University citation issued to any vehicle not displaying a current University parking decal. The student, faculty or staff member will be given the opportunity to register their vehicle in lieu of the FIRST no decal citation enforcement fee if the citation is brought to the University Parking Office within five (5) school days from the date of the citation. (This-dees not-apply-if-the-citation-was-received-on-a-second-vehicle-and-the first-vehicle-had-previously-been-registered)

IF A STUDENT OR FACULTY/STAFF MEMBER RECEIVES A CITATION FOR NOT DISPLAYING A CURRENT UNIVERSITY PARKING DECAL ON A SECOND CAR THAT IS FAMILY-DWNED, WHEN HE HAD PREVIOUSLY REGISTERED A FIRST VEHICLE, THE ENFORCEMENT FEE OF \$24.00 WILL BE REDUCED TO \$3.00 UPON THE SHOWING OF PROOF THAT THE SECOND VEHICLE WAS A FAMILY-OWNED VEHICLE. IN ADDITION TO PAYING THE \$3.00 ENFORCEMENT FEE, IT WILL BE PERMISSABLE TO REGISTER THE FIRST AND SECOND VEHICLES ON A POOL DECAL AS OUTLINED IN PART IV, SECTION 5.

EXAMPLES:

- A. [4] A student, faculty or staff member with a valid decal parks illegally on campus and receives a citation. Enforcement fee of \$3.00 is assessed.
- B. [2] A student does not purchase a parking decal and parks on campus. Enforcement fee is \$24.00 (fall semester); however, the student may purchase a decal for \$18.00 (day fee fall semester) and have the no decal citation voided by the University Parking Office if citation is brought in within five (5) school days from the date of the citation.
- C. [3] A faculty or staff member does not purchase a parking decal and parks on campus. Enforcement fee is \$24.00 (fall semester); however, the member may purchase a decal for \$24.00 (day fee fall semester) and have the no decal citation voided by the University Parking Office if citation is brought in within five (5) school days from the date of the citation.
- 3. [4] [5] [6] The enforcement fees assessed for violation of these regulations constitute an indebtedness to The University of Texas at Arlington. In the event that a person fails to pay such fees within the time prescribed herein, The University of Texas at Arlington will take any or all of the following actions:
 - A. Suspend the privilege of driving or parking on the campus;
 - B. Withhold any remuneration [renumeration], refund, or monetary payment to which the person may be entitled;
 - C. Deny readmission to The University of Texas at Arlington;
 - D. Withhold the individual's grades and/or transcript;
 - E. Withhold any degree to which the person may be entitled.

[Traffic-or-parking-citations-may-be-appealed-by-filling-out a-Parking-and-Traffic-Appeal-form-available-at-the-Bursar's Office---Reasons-for-appeal-should-be-given;-either-to-dis-pute-whether-the-violation-occurred-at-all;-or-to-claim-that the-action-which-resulted-in-the-citation-was-justified-by circumstances---Appeal-committees-consist-of-faculty;-staff, and-student-members---When-a-hearing-is-scheduled;-the-person appealing-will-be-notified-of-the-time-and-place-so-that-he may-attend-and-will-be-allowed-up-to-five-minutes-for-a-personal-presentation:--If-the-person-appealing-is-not-present, the-appeal-will-be-decided-on-the-basis-of-the-written-state-ment-of-reasons-on-the-Parking-and-Traffie-Appeal-form;-Appeals-should-not-be-made-for-the-purpose-of-changing-the-rules, which-are-not-made-by-the-Appeals-Gommittee;-but-by-the

- 4. [7] In the event that the privilege to drive and park on the campus has been suspended, such privilege may be reinstated by payment to the Bursar's Office of all unpaid enforcement fees plus a reinstatement fee of \$5.00.
- 5. [8] A person who has failed to pay enforcement fees assessed hereunder shall not be eligible to receive a permit to drive or park a vehicle on campus.
- 6. [9] [10] Handicap parking spaces are tow-away zones (at owner's expense) for vehicles not bearing a handicap decal.

[A-eourt-appearance-ticket-may-be-issued-to-any-person who-has-failed-to-pay-enforcement-charges-which-equal-or exceed-the-sum-of-\$6.00.--Upon-issuance-of-three-(3) court-appearance-tickets-within-a-permit-year.-the-of-fender's-campus-driving-and-parking-privileges-will-be-sus-pended-for-the-remainder-of-that-permit-year.]

Parking offenses are recorded either in the name of the person in whose name the vehicle is registered with some official state motor vehicle registration department or agency, or in the name of the person who has signed a financial responsibility agreement for parking violation which is on file with the Parking Office. Other offenses are recorded in the name of the person driving said vehicle and in the name of the person who has registered it with the Parking Office or who maintains the vehicle.

Non-payment of enforcement fees may result in the removal and impoundment of the vehicle. Prior to the vehicle being placed upon the impoundment list for failure to pay past-due enforcement fees, the person involved will be notified by letter of the action to be taken if all past-due enforcement fees have not been paid within ten school days after the date of the letter, and the procedure for appeal. If the records indicate the vehicle has not been registered with the Parking Office, the notification of unpaid enforcement fees will be sent to the registered owner; otherwise, the letter will be sent to the address of such person as shown in the records of the Parking Office.

X. Appeals

The Appeals Board is not a part of the University Police Department but information is included as a courtesy to inform all faculty, staff and students of the right to appeal and the procedure for appealing a University citation.

1. A person receiving a University citation may appeal the citation to the Parking and Traffic Appeals Committee WITHIN 5 SCHOOL DAYS from the date of receiving the citation by filing a Parking and Traffic Appeal Form which is available at the Bursar's Office.

The reason for appeal should be given, either to dispute whether the violation occurred at all, or to claim that the action which resulted in the citation was justified by circumstances.

Appeal committees consist of faculty, staff, and student members. When hearing is scheduled, the person appealing will be notified of the time and place so that he may attend and will be allowed up to five minutes for a personal presentation. If the person appealing is not present, the appeal will be decided on the basis

of the written statement of reasons on the Parking and Traffic Appeal Form.

Appeals should not be made for the purpose of changing the rules, which are not made by the Appeals Committee, but by the University Parking Committee.

 If the Appeals Committee finds the person appealing guilty, the enforcement fee must be paid to the Bursar's Office within five (5) days of the notice of the decision of the Appeals Committee.

I QUICK REFERENCE TO PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

1 PERMITS REQUIRED FOR ACCESS & PARKING.
Only vehicles bearing proper University permits may park on the main campus (as shown

bu the boundaries on the map accompanying these regulations) Monday through Thursday, 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and Friday from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm except that motorcycles and motor-assisted bicycles may drive through the main campus only after these hours, but must park only in areas designated for such vehicles.

- 2. EFFECTIVE DATE OF PERMITS. Parking permits, not temporary permits, are valid for the Academic year.
- 3. Parking Permits must be affixed to the inside of the vehicle as described in Section VI of these regulations. Permits which are taped or affixed by unauthorized materials or displayed on a vehicle other than the vehicle to which issued will subject the holder to a University ticket.
- 4. CLASS "F" PERMITS. Holders of Class "F" permits shall park only in areas designated on their permits. When no spaces are available or there is an urgent need, a temporary permit will be issued by the University Police or the Uniformed Officers in control stations.
- 5 CLASS "A" PERMITS. Holders of Class "A" permits may park in any Class "A" or Class "C" parking area except carpool areas on
- Monday thm Thursday from 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and on Fridays from 7:30 am (17:000 pm, and in Class "F", "A", or "C" parking areas at other times except when prohibited by posted signs or markings.

 6. CLASS "C" PERMITS. Holders of Class "C" parking permits shall
 - 6. CLASS "C" PERMITS. Holders of Class "C" parking permits shall park only in Class "C" parking areas. They may pass through control stations after 5:00 pm weekdays and may park on the main campus after that time in any area not specifically reserved for other classes of permits, or when not in violation of posted signs or painted corbs and pavements.
 - 7. WHEN TWO CARS ARE RECISTERED. An alternate vehicle may be registered by faculty and staff at no extra cost with the understanding that if both cars are parked on campus at the same time, one must be parked at a meter or the permit will be revoked for a period of one year.
 - 8. FACULTY/STAFF LOCATED OFF MAIN CAMPUS. University faculty and staff employed at locations off the main campus are not eligible for parking permits under these regulations. These individuals should apply either to the University Police at Bellmont Hall or to the guards in control stations for temporary permits.
 - 9. LOADING ZONE PERMITS 6 WHERE TO OBTAIN. A passenger car or light pick-up may not use Loading Zone areas Monday through Thursday 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and Friday 7:30 am to 5:00 pm with OUE a LOADING ZONE PERMIT. Permits may be obtained from guards at the control stations, or from the University Police at Bellmont Hall. Room823 When control stations are closed and after 5:00 pm, or on weekends, permission to use a Loading Zone area may be obtained by a telephone call to 471-4441 or PAX 1031.
 - VISITORS & WHERE TO OBTAIN PERMITS. All visitors need permits to park on campus.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

Visitors who conduct important business with or render an important service for the University and who are not eligible for University permanent parking permuts are classed as OFFICIAL VISITORS.

Official Visitors may obtain temporary parking permits from either the guards at the control stations or from the University Police at Bellmont Hall (stadium) Room823 Permits entitle the holders to park only in spaces designated "Official Visitor."

All other visitors may park only at the University Visitor Center, east of the LBJ Library (between 26th Street and Manor Rd.) or may only drive-through the campus.

Faculty, staff and students are NOT eligible for Official Visitors permits. Violators will be subject to parking tickets.

- [// SPEED LIMIT. The speed limit on all parts of the main campus, whether on streets or in parking areas, is 15 mph unless otherwise posed. POSTED SIGNS take precedence over painted curbs and pavement markings.
- /2. PARKING IMPROPERLY. A vehicle may not be parked on a street where angle parking is required with the back of the vehicle toward the curb. Parking wholly within the marked boundaries of the parking space is required at all times.
- /3. U-TURNING is permitted on the Main Campus when the turn can be Made safely without backing or interfering with other traffic, or when not prohibited by an official traffic control device.
- 14. BICYCLES. Bicycles must be operated in accordance with the ordinances of the City of Austin and according to specific provisions of these regulations shown in Section IV.
 Whenever a usable path or part of street is set aside for exclusive use of bicycles, the riders shall use such path and not use the street.
 Bicycles must be parked only in bicycle racks. Or designated areas.
- 15. BICYCLE REGISTRATION. Bicycles may be registered on campus by contacting the Crime Prevention Unit of The University Police (471-4441 or PAX 1031) between 8:00 am-Noon any Monday, Tuesday or Friday, Bicycles may also be registered at any City of Austin fire station.
- 16. PEDESTRIANS—RIGHTS AND DUTIES Pedestrians are subject to all official traffic control devices. They have the right-of-way

at marked crosswalks, in intersections, and on sidewalks extending across a service drive, building entrance, driveway or street.

Pedestrians crossing a street at any point other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles on said street.

Pedestrians shall also yield the right-or-way to bicycles in designated bikeways.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

Pedestrians shall not leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.

They may cross an intersection diagonally only where permitted by special pavement markings.

17 ENFORCEMENT-SERVICE CHARGES AND IMPOUNDMENTS. Failure to pay the service charges on University tickets as shown on the reverse of the violator's copy may subject the violator to either tow-away of the vehicle or enforcement in the City of Austin Municipal Court.

Vehicles will be towed-away for violations shown on pages 14 and 15

13 APPEAL TO A TICKET. University parking and traffic tickets may be appealed within ten (10) calendar days from date of ticket by filing a written statement with the Parking and Traffic Section, Service Building, Room 1 on East 24th Street.

II. INTRODUCTION

main campus of The University of Texas at Austin. They are supplementary to the rules and regulations of the City of Austin and the State of Texas which govern

pedestrians and the use of motor vehicles and bicycles.

As used herein, "Campus" refers to all University owned or controlled property whether or not within the confines of the control stations of the Main Campus. With respect to permits, these regulations apply only to the Main Campus, which is all

University-owned or controlled property within the boundaries shown on the map accompanying these regulations.

The origin, administration and enforcement of the regulations contained in this booklet are as follows:

Parking and Traffic Policy Committee. This committee is composed of faculty, staff and students and is responsible for formulating regulations for the control of parking and traffic upon the campus in the form of recommendations to the President of the University. Within the limitations imposed by restricted facilities and staff, it attempts to provide reasonable regulations for the control of the very high density of vehicular and pedestrian traffic upon the main campus of the University, toward the goal of optimum convenience and safety for all concerned. Suggestions for changes in these regulations, requests for individual consideration or any communications concerning unique problems arising from parking and traffic, or the regulations concerning them should be directed to this Committee.

Parking and Traffic Section of the Physical Plant. The Parking and Traffic Section is responsible for all administrative functions relating to the issuance of parking permits, the collection of service fees for parking and traffic violations, the acceptance of appeals from such violations, and the issuance of relands upon withdrawal from the University. Questions relating to these functions should be directed to Parking and Traffic Administration, Service Building 1

Parking and Traffic Appeals Panel. This panel is composed of faculty, staff and students and hears appeals from tickets issued by University police for violation of parking and traffic regulations, (See Section VIII)

University Police. The University Police has the responsibility and the legal authority for the enforcement of the parking and traffic regulations listed in this booklet. University police officers may issue TRAFFIC TICKETS ENFORCEABLE IN COURT in the same way as thuse issued by the Texas Highway Patrol (see Section VIII). On special occasions and in emergeneits, such parking limitations may be imposed by the Chief of the University Police as are required by the conditions which prevail. When conditions warrant such action, he may also waive parking limitations which are ordinarily imposed.

The University reserves the right to enforce parking and traffic regulations (1) through the issuance of traffic tickets and the collection of service fees for offenses, (2) through the impoundment of vehicles interfering with the movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic or involved in specified parking offenses, (3) by the suspension or revocation of permits for repeated offenses (4) by providing an option

for either the vehicle owner or the person who has signed a financial responsibility agreement for parking violations to appear in court or at a University impoundment hearing for non-payment of service fees, (5) by barring readmission of any student for non-payment of outstanding service charges, (6) by withholding a student's grades and official transcript, and to by such other methods as are commonly employed by City or State police in the

Proof of the fact that any parking or traffic control device, sign, signal or marking was actually in place at any location on the campus of the University of Texas at Austin, Austin, Texas shall constitute prima facie evidence that the same is official and was installed under the authority of the law.

When any person is charged with having stopped, parked, and left standing a motor vehicle on the campus of the University of Texas at Austin, Austin, Texas in violation of any provision of the Parking and Traffic Regulations of the University of Texas at Austin, proof that said vehicle was, at the date of the offense, bearing a valid University of Texas at Austin parking permit shall constitute prima facie evidence that said vehicle was then and there stopped, parked, and left standing by said holder of the parking permit. However if such vehicle does not bear a valid University of Texas at Austin parking permit, proof that said vehicle at the date of the offense alleged was owned by the person changed with the offense, shall constitute prima facie evidence that said vehicle was then and there stopped, parked, and left standing by

The University assumes no responsibility for the care and/or protection of any vehicle or its contents at anytime it is operated or parked on the campus.

If a motor vehicle or bicycle is parked on Unicersity Campus and is not moved for a period of 45 days, or is not operable, the University may doesn the same to be abandoned. Abandoned motor vehicles or bicycles or motor-assisted bicycles may be disposed of in the same manner as such vehicles are disposed of by the City of Austin

III. DEFINITIONS

University Campus: All University of Texas owned or controlled property.

Main Campus: All University owned or controlled property within

the boundaries shown

accompanying these regulations

Official Visitor: Individuals not eligible for University parking permits who come to the main campus to conduct important business with the Institution's administrative officers or to render an important service.

Parking Area: Any area on the main campus which has been designated and marked for parking whether on streets or in lots.

No Parking Zone: In addition tozones marked by posted signs, any yellow-painted curbs or yellow-painted zones on pavements denote no parking at any time.

Tow-away Zone: An area designated by an official posted sign which constitutes public notice that a vehicle purked in violation will be noved.

Motor-assisted bicycle: A bicycle which may be propelled by human power or by a motor, or both; said motor of a capacity of less than 60 ce piston displacement, and capable of a maximum speed of not more than 20 mph on a surface with not more than 1% grade in any direction when the motor is engaged.

IV. GENERAL

Only vehicles bearing proper University permits may enter or park on the examples Monday through Thursday from 7.30 am to 8:45 pm, and Friday from 7.30 am to 5:00 pm. except that motorcycles and motor-assisted bicycles may only drive through the main campus after these hours, and must park only in areas designated for such vehicles. Permits are not required after these hours, nor on official University holidays, nor on days when no classes, final examinations or registration periods are scheduled, except where parking is restricted by posted signs visitors and drivers of commercial vehicles may obtain temporary persoits at traffic control stations. Metered parking spaces may be used by any vehicle, except motorcycles, motor-assisted breycles,

and bicycles, at any time, except where their use is restricted by posted sign. These regulations apply to motor propelled vehicles and to bicycles,-all must honor the regulations Mated in this booklet at all times.

THE SPEED LIMIT ON ALL PARTS OF THE MAIN CAMPUS IS 15 MILES PER HOUR AT ALL TIMES UNLESS OTHER-WISE POSTED. PEDESTRIANS ALWAYS HAVE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY AT CROSSWALKS AND IN INTERSECTIONS.

ALL VEHICLES ARE REQUIRED TO STOP COMPLETELY AT STOP SIGNS AND TO PROCEED WITH CAUTION. A flashing yellow light requires slowing the vehicle and proceeding with caution. A flashing red light requires stopping the vehicle completely and proceeding with caution. U-TURNING is permitted on the Main Campus when the turn can be made safely without backing or interfering with other traffic, or when not prohibited by an official traffic control device.

No vehicle or bicucle may be placed, used, parked or left within any University Building at any time except with proper authorization.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

Bicycles shall be operated in conformity with the applicable ordinances of the City of Austin and the following:

- (a) Bicycles may not be ridden on pedestrian walkways and sidewalks.
- (b) Operators of bicycles on University streets shall comply with all stop signs, yield signs, and other official traffic regulations, except that bicycles may proceed in either direction on Inner Campus Drive.

1 V PARKING REQULATIONS

The various classes of parking permits and their eligibility requirements, privileges and limitations are described in detail in the following section. Specific areas available for parking for each class of permit are indicated on the color-coded map. Metered spaces are open to all motor vehicles, except motorcycles and motor-assisted bicycles,

at all times, except where their use is restricted by posteri signs.

Parking is PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES where indicated
by signs, yellow-painted curbs or yellow-painted

pavement markings.

Parking adjacent to orange-painted curbs is restricted to AUTHOR-IZED VEHICLES ONLY from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays. Parking at unpainted curbs is controlled by area parking signs. Posted parking signs must be honored at all times and take precedence over curb markings.

Other regulations concerning parking and driving on the Main Campus are shown in Section VII. DRIVING AND PARKING OFFENSES.

On University holidays and on days when no classes, final examinations, nor registration periods are scheduled, only those parking restrictions which regulate parking at all times will remain in effect.

VI. PARKING PERMITS

A. For Faculty and Staff, an application for a parking permit will be issued, upon request, by Parking and Traffic Administration, located in the Service Building, Room 1. Pennits will be issued only to the vehicle for which the faculty or staff member, spouse, or parent is the registered owner or for which the faculty or staff member has assumed financial responsibility for any parking violations by filing a notarized Financial Responsibility Agreement with the Parking and Traffic Section.

. An alternate vehicle may be registered at no additional cost with the understanding that if both cars are parked on campus at the same time, one must be parked at a meter or the permit will be revoked for a period of one year. Permits will be issued only to those members of the faculty or staff who are employed on the Main Campus.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

For STUDENTS, a parking permit will be issued only for a vehicle owned by the student, his spouse, parents, or guardians or for which the student has assumed financial responsibility for any parking violations by filing a notarized Financial Responsibility Agreement with the Parking and Traffic Section. Only one vehicle will be registered for

each eligible student. In order to obtain a permit, a student must supply all information called for **0**n a Motor Vehicle Registration Card and, in addition, must present (a) a copy of the current License Receipt and (b) a paul fee receipt for the semester involved.

A PERMIT TO PARK on campus will not be honored:

- unless current permits are properly displayed as follows:
 - a. if only ONE vehicle is registered for parking, one permit shall be affixed to the inside of the windshield directly in front of the rear view mirror so as not to obstruct the driver's forward view, and the second permit shall be affixed to the inside of the rear window in the lower corner on the driver's side of the car; or
 - b. if TWO vehicles are registered for parking under the Alternate Permit policy (faculty and staff only), permits shall be affixed on the inside of each vehicle in the respective positions described in A.l.a. above, and the portable card shall be displayed on the dashboard or at some other place where it can be seen easily through the windshield from the outside of the vehicle;
 - c. if a vehicle is registered for car pool parking, a permit shall be affixed to the windshield and to the rear window in the respective positions described in A.l.a. above, beside any other permit in these areas, and the portable car pool card shall be displayed on the dashboard or at some other place where it can be seen easily through the windshield from the outside of the vehicle.
- if taped or affixed by unauthorized materials; and
- unless displayed on the vehicle to which the permit was issued.

For permits less than a semester, student class "D" and Class "A" health permits shall be \$1.00 a month.

All disabled veterans whose vehicles display the specially designed license plates issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the words "DISABLED VET" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e and all permanently disabled persons whose vehicles display the specially designed symbols, tabs, or other devices issued by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation with the word "DISABLED" printed thereon in accordance with the provisions of V.C.S. 6675a-5e.l are exempt from parking permit fees and from parking meter fees and time limits. These exemptions do not permit parking a vehicle at a place or time that parking is prohibited.

C Payment of fees

When an application is made for a permit, the fee charged will be for a complete year or for the entire unexpired portion of the University's academic year. Payment of the fee must be made before the permit will be issued. A one dollar fee will be charged for each set of replacement permits and for each card key replaced. Remnants of old permits are to be returned at that time.

D. Refunds

A request for refund will not be honored unless it is filed with the Parking and Traffic Office during the University's fiscal year for which payment of the permit was made. A request for refund must be accompanied by the remnants of the appropriate permit.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

Refunds will be made to members of the faculty and staff upon request in the event their service is terminated by a resignation or leave of absence without pay. The refund will be based on the number of full months remaining in the University's academic year.

Refunds will be made upon request to students holding Class "C" or "M" permits who withdraw from the University at the end of the fall semester, but refunds will not be made to students holding "C" or "M" permits who withdraw at the end of the spring semester.

A request for a refinid will not be honored when a person's privilege to park and drive on campus has been suspended.

E. Class O Permits

Class O parking permits will be issued to certain administrative officers as designated by the President. O permit holders may park in any O space.

F. Class D Permuts

Class D parking pennits will be issued to members of the faculty, staff, and student body whose physical infirmities make mandatory their parking near their work or classroom. Automobiles bearing Class D parking permits may be parked only in spaces specifically designated for the disabled. Class D permits may be issued for limited periods of time or for one year,

Class "D" permits may be issued to students upon certification by the Director of the Student Health Center

Class "D" permits may be issued to members of the faculty and staff upon certification by the attending physician.

G. Class F (Faculty and Staff) Permits

Members of the faculty holding the rank of instructor or above, and staff members who are paid at a rate of \$1,318.00 per month or more, are eligible to apply for Class F permits. Reserved lot assignments will be drawn in a computer lottery system according to rank for faculty and monthly salary for others. Reserved Parking Areas will be reserved for automobiles bearing permits issued for each specific area Mondays through Thursday from 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and Fridays from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm. If no spaces are available in the designated lot or if there is argent need, special permits will be provided at traffic control stations for F permit holders to park on particular occasions for a limited period of time in other restricted areas. Certain spaces in each reserved area will be reserved at all times for those holding permits for that area.

On Mondays through Thursdays from 5.00 pm to 7:15 pm, the parking spaces on the Inner Campus Drive are reserved for F (and A) permit holders.

H. Class A (Faculty and Stuff) Permits

Class A parking permits will be issued to the following:

- (1) Any full-time employee of The University of Texas at Austin.
- (2) Any part-time employee who is not registered in the University as a student.
- (3) Individuals registered at the University for courses of instruction, who work at least half-time for the University and who are employed at a full-time rate of \$556.00 or more per month.
- (4) Temporary Class "A" permits may be issued to students upon certification by the Director of the Student Health Center.
- (5) Teaching assistants with less than a half-time appointment whose jobs involve supervisory roles in the public schools.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

Class A permit holders may park in any Class A or C parking area except carpool areas on Mondays through Thursdays from 7:30 am to 8:45 pm and on Fridays from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm and in F. A, or C parking area at other times, except when prohibited by posted signs or markings. Inner Campus Drive parking spaces

are reserved for A (and F) permits on Mondays through Thursdays from $5:00~\rm{pm}$ to $7:15~\rm{pm}$.

L. Class C (Student) Permits

Class "C" permit holders may park in any "C" parking area except carpool areas at any time. They are not permitted to park in "F" or "A" areas or to pass through traffic control stations between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on weekdays. At all other times they may park on campus in any area not specifically reserved for other classes of permits.

J. Class M Permits

Class M parking permits will be issued to faculty, staff and students for motorcycles, motor <u>assisted</u> bicycles and motor scooters. These vehicles may be parked ONLY in parking areas set aside for motorcycles, motor-assisted bicycles and motor scooters, regardless of the time of the day or day of the week.

K. Class H (Health) Permits

Class H permits will be issued without fee by the Director, Speech and Hearing Clinic, or by the Director, Perceptual Motor Clinic to parents who must bring and stay with their children while they are being treated in one of the respective clinics. Limited space adjacent to each clinic is reserved for Class H permits, which are invalid elsewhere.

L. Class T (Texan) Permits

Class T parking permits will be issued without fee by the Manager of Student. Publications to reporters, photographers and advertising salesinen who, for a limited period of time, most come to The Daily Texan to complete their work, or file a report, and leave on other assignments. Space adjacent to the Communication Center is reserved for these permits, which are invalid elsewhere.

M. Class K Permits

Class K permits will be issued without fee by the Director of News and Public Affairs, Communications Center, to the news broadcast staff who for a limited time must come to the studio to complete their work and leave on other assignments.

N. Class CP (Car Pool) Permits

Car Pool means an arrangement for the use of two or more vehicles by persons not having the same domicile.

Car pool pennits will be issued to park in selected Class "F", Class "A", or Class "C" parking lots from 7.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The car pool leader must qualify for the type pennit for which he she applied in accordance with current regulations. A

portable car pool card and permits for each vehicle will be issued to the car pool indicating the lot where the vehicle will park.

The fee charged for a car pool permit will be the same as that

charged for a similar regular type permit. Vehicles with car pool permits for Class "F" or Class "A" parking lots but not displaying the portable car pool card will be allowed drive-through privileges any time and parking privileges after 5:00 pm for that portion of the main campus within the control stations.

Vehicles bearing car pool permits for Class "C" will be authorized drive-through and parking privileges between 5:00 pm and 8:45 pm Monday through Thursday but will not be permitted to pass through the traffic control stations between 7:30 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday.

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SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

Applications for car pools may be filed with the Parking and Traffic Section, Service Building, Boom 1.

O. Class R (Retired Faculty, Staff) Permits

Faculty and staff members retired under the teacher retirement system continue to be eligible for the class of permit for which they were eligible at the time of retirement. Upon request, retired faculty and staff members will be issued a complimentary Retired Staff permit with Class "A" parking privileges only after 3.00 p.m. The widow or widower of the retired faculty or staff member is also eligible for the complimentary permit

P. Temporary Permits

Loading Zone Permuts. Passenger cars may not use the LOADING ZONE AREAS at restricted times without a loading zone permut and may be parked there only long enough to conduct the actual loading or unloading operations, whether on University husiness or otherwise. LOADING ZONE permits are valid only for date and time issued and must reflect an expiration time. The loading zone permits may be obtained from the control station officer or from the University Police Office, Bellmont Hall, Room 823. When control stations are closed and after 5:00 pm, or on weekends, permission to use Loading Zone may be obtained by a telephone call to the University Police, 471-4441 or P.A.X. 1031. Passenger cars shall not be stopped in loading zones or services drives for the purpose of awaiting the arrival of passengers. Commercial vehicles may be parked in loading zones and service drives only for whatever length of time artual loading and unloading operations are in progress.

Official Visitors Permits

Arrangements for the use of official visitor spaces are to be made in advance with the Chief. University Police, the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Deans, and the Directors. Where groups are involved, the arrangements must be made by the appropriate Chairperson, Dean, Director, or equivalent administrator with the Chief, University Police, who will issue temporary permits.

The establishment of space for official visitor sparking must meet with the approval of the Parking and Traffic Policies

Committee and is subject to the review of the President.

In all cases in which an automobile is parked in an official visitor's space, it must bear the appropriate temporary permit which shows the current date, specifies the parking time required, including the date and time of expiration, and bears the signature of the official authorized to issue the permit.

Commercial Visitor Permits

Arrangements for parking for other persons coming to the University campus on business matters may be made by administrative officials, chairmen of departments, administrative staff members, or faculty members with the office of the Chief, University Police by identifying the person and the gate through which he will enter the campus. A temporary parking permit will be issued to such a visitor.

Parking permits will be issued to a limited number of persons who render a continuing service to University offices (e.g., computer engineers, typewriter servicemen, etc.). Requests for such permits should be directed to the Director of Physical Plant.

Temporary permits will be issued to a limited number of persons coming to the campus to render a special service which is a specific part of the University's work. Requests for individual parking may be made to the Chief, University Police.

VIII. ENFORCEMENT

A. Parking and Traffic Tickets

University Police are authorized to issue two types of tickets for violation of campus parking and traffic regulations.

- (1) University Tickets Those handled by the University of Texas Parking and Traffic Section, subject to University service charges and a right of appeal to the Parking & Traffic Appeals Panel
- (2) Court Appearance (CA) Tu kets Those issued by the University Police but constituting a summons to appear in either the municipal court or a justice court. Criminal penalties, as provided by law, may be imposed by either the municipal court or a justice court for violations of University parking and traffic regulations.
- B. Policy with Respect to CA Tackets. The University reserves the right to issue a CA ticket for any violation. It is the general policy of the University, however, to issue CA tickets only (1) for serious violations, (2) for violations by visitors and persons holding no university permit or driving automobiles which have not been registered with the University, and (3) for excessive University tickets, as set forth in Paragraph C below.

C. Policy with Respect to University Tickets. University tickets are issued for offenses described on pages. 14 & 15 The administrative service charges are as shown. If not paid within ten calendar days after issuance of the ticket, the charges thereafter shall be doubled.

Every person receiving a university ticket shall remit the amount of the service charge to the Parking and Traffic Section, Boom I, Service Building within ten calendar days after receipt of the ticket, to avoid doubling of the charge.

If a person decres to appeal, he shall file his written appeal as provided in Paragraph D below within ten calendar days after receipt of the ticket

Unpaid service charges for parking offenses are recorded either in the name of the person in whose name the vehicle is registered with some official state motor vehicle registration department or agency or in the

name of the person who has signed a financial responsibility agreement for parking violations which is on file with the Parking and Traffic Section. Unpaid service charges for other offenses are recorded in the name of the person driving said vehicle and in the name of the person who has registered it with the University Parking and Traffic Section or who maintains the vehicle.

If unpaid service charges recorded in the name of any person equal or exceed the sum of \$50.00, the Parking and Traffic Section will notify such person by letter sent to the address of such person as shown in the records of the Parking and Traffic Section. If, however, the records indicate that the vehicle has not been registered with Parking and Traffic, the letter of notification of unpaid service charges will be sent to the registered owner. Such letter shall state that unless payment of all accumulated service charges is made within 10 calendar days after the date of such letter (1) CA tickets may be issued in lieu of

the University tickets, (2) the vehicle may be subject to impoundment, and (3) students may be barred from readmission or have their grades and official transcripts withheld in accordance with provisions of the Regents Rules and Regulations, Part One, Chapter VI, Section 9. The letter will offer students an opportunity for an impoundment hearing or a hearing concerning barring of readmission or withholding grades and official transcripts. A copy of the letter shall also be sent to the person in whose name the vehicle is registered with the Texas State Department of Highways and Transportation, if different from the person registering the vehicle with the University.

Public -

If such payment is not received and neither the registered owner nor the person who has signed a financial responsibility agreement for parking violations has elected to appear in court or at a University impoundment hearing, the vehicle may be impounded pending payment of all outstanding service charges. If such payment is not received from a student and the student has elected not to appear in court or at a hearing, the student may be barred from readmission and his/her grades and official transcripts may be withheld. When Court Appearance tickets are issued, the University tickets will be cancelled. Failure to discharge CA tickets will result in the issuance of a warrant for the arrest of such person. Persons with unpaid service charges recorded in their names must appear at a hearing before again becoming eligible to receive a parking permit.

D. Appeals from University Tickets. Any person who has received a University ticket may appeal by filing a written statement within ten calendar days after date of issuance with the Parking and Traffic Section setting forth the grounds on which the person believes the issuance of such ticket was improper or inequitable. The following information shall be included in the appeal:

- (1) ticket number (s),
- (2) license number of vehicle,
- (3) Austin address and telephone number,
- (4) date of appeal,
- (5) signature, and
- (6) printed name of person appealing.

Each appeal will be considered by an appeals panel consisting of faculty, staff, and student members.

The filing of an appeal constitutes certification by the individual who signs the same that the facts stated therein are true to the best of his belief. A person may file such supporting statementsOr materials as he deems appropriate.

If the person filing an appeal desires to appear in person before a panel he shall request such personal appearance in the written statement. Failure to request a personal appearance will result in the

Parking and Traffic Appeal Panel determining the appeal on the basis of the written statement of the person, the supporting materials submitted by the person and information supplied by the traffic officer issuing the ticket. If a personal appearance is requested, the person appealing shall be permitted to participate in the hearing and present such testimony and information as he decins appropriate. Such person shall also have the right to examine witnesses.

The panel may order the payment of the service charge in whole or in part, or the cancellation of the ticket(s), as deemed appropriate. A person filing an appeal will be notified in writing of the decision of the panel. If the appeal is denied and the appellant desires to further contest the validity of the ticket in minicipal court, a court appearance ticket will be issued, and the University ticket will be cancelled. Such request shall be in writing and sent to the Parking and Traffic Section within ten calendar days of the date of the letter notifying the appellant of the panel's decision.

If an appeal is demed and the person tails to pay the charges within ten calendar days after being notified, a court appearance ticket will be issued, and the University ticket will be cancelled. In this event, the service charges shall thereafter be doubled.

E. Superation of Privilege to Drive and Park on Campus. Any person who within a period of twelve months commencing on September 1 of any year receives two CA tickets or University tickets with service charges equal to or in excess of \$75.00 may lose his privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on the Main Campus for one year and may subject his vehicle to possible impoundment for parking offenses during the period of suspension; upon payment of all service charges the suspended permit will be valid.

The loss of the privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus shall commence three days after the Parking and Traffic Section mails a letter to the person, at the address of such person as shown in the records of the Section, stating that such person's privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus has been suspended by reason of excessive violations. Such letter shall state the date on which the suspension commences and the date on which it ends and will

give notification of possible impoundment for parking offenses committed during the period of suspension.

Any person who (a) forges or alters a permit, (b) uses a forged or altered permit, (c) transfers a permit, affixes a permit to a vehicle other than that for which it was issued, or fails to destroy a permit when required to do so by these regulations, with the intention of providing any person with parking privileges he is not entitled to under these regulations, or (d) provides false information to obtain a parking permit, with knowledge thereof, or (e) parks or drives a vehicle to which there has been affixed a permit which the registered owner, or regular driver, dal not purchase, shall lose the privilege of driving or parking on the University campus for a period of one year. Such suspension shall commence three days after the Parking and Traffic Section mails a letter to the person, at the address of such person as shown in the records of the Section, stating that such person's privilege of driving or parking a motor vehicle on campus has been suspended and describing the offense. Such letter shall state the date on which the suspension commences and the date on which it ends. While a person's privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus is suspended, it is unlawful (1) for that person to drive or park any motor vehicle on the campus and (2) for any person to drive or park a vehicle registered in the name of such person on the campus.

SPECIAL PARAGRAPHS

PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR 1978-79 (CONT'D)

If a person whose privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus has been suspended is charged with any violation while on campus, a CA ticket will be issued for such violation. If a university ticket is issued to such person, a CA ticket for such offenses will be served upon such person by a peace officer. Failure to discharge such CA tickets will result in the issuance of a warrant for the arrest of such person. Upon the issuance of the CA ticket, the university ticket will be accordingly.

If a person whose privilege of driving or parking on the campus has been suspended receives a university or CA ticket by reason of having a vehicle on the campus during the period of his suspension, the period of suspension shall be extended so that it expires 12 months from the date the person receives such additional CA or university ticket. In addition, the vehicle may be impounded and the violation of the suspension may be reported to the Dean of Students for

possible disciplinary action if the person is a student, or to the appropriate Dean, Director or Administrative official, if the person is a faculty or staff member.

A person receiving notice that his privilege of driving or parking a vehicle on campus has been suspended may appeal the suspension within tencalendar days on the grounds that the imposition of such suspension is improper or will create serious and substantial hardship. Such appeal shall be governed by the provision of Part D above. No appeal shall be considered if there are any unpaid tickets outstanding at the time such appeal is filed.

F. Destruction of Permit when Suspended. Every person receiving notice that his privilege of driving or parking on the campus has been suspended shall remove the parking permit from every vehicle registered in his name and return remnants thereof to the Parking and Traffic Section within five calendar days after receipt of such notice. Failure to do so may be reported to the Dean of Students if the person is a student, or to the appropriate Dean, Director, or Administrative official, if the person is a faculty or staff member.

G. Eligibility to Obtain New Permit during Perust of Suspension. A person whose privilege of driving or parking on the campus is suspended and not reinstated shall be ineligible to receive a parking permit of any type during the period of suspension.


H. Impoundment. The term "impounding" includes removal or immobilization of the vehicle in question.

In addition to any service charge that may be levied by the University for an offense, the owner of an impounded vehicle must also pay a commercial wrecker service fee in the amount of \$20.00, and storage charges in the amount of \$2.00 per day after the first 24 hours. When an impounding violation occurs and the owner or driver of the vehicle appears on the scene before the arrival of the wrecker, the vehicle will not be impounded If the owner or driver appears on the scene after the arrival of the wrecker, and the wrecker driver has either made a hook-up or has signed the police report for custody of the vehicle, the following will apply:

(a) the vehicle will not be impounded.

(b) and the owner or driver will be expected to pay the wrecker a fee in lieu of towing in the amount of \$10.00.
