## **Policy Concepts**

- Powers, privileges and immunities (TX ED Code 51.203)(section IV.B.):
  - Primary Jurisdiction:
    - Vested with all powers, privileges and immunities of peace officers
    - May arrest without warrant (CCP Article 14)
    - May enforce all traffic laws on streets and highways.
  - Outside Primary Jurisdction:
    - Vested with all powers, privileges and immunities of peace officers and may arrest if:
      - Summoned to assist by outside Law Enforcement
      - Assisting another Law Enforcement agency
      - Is otherwise performing duties as a peace officer for the institution
- System Police are charged with the responsibility of protecting the life and property of students, staff and faculty in the UT System community.
